Mrs. T. Shiraming new #69; old \$25165, residence 51 A & B and her daughter; Mrs. H. Kanda, old \$15165 living with her mother, asked me yesterday if it would be possible for them to obtain 2 large trunks stored with us in our warehouse before these evacuees are moved from the Rodeo Grounds the end of this month. They claim they need some clothes very badly.

They were informed that we had instructions not to permit anything to be moved from our warehouse and not to allow anybody in there at all under any circumstances.

These people were quite insistent that I write and ask if the trunks could be removed and turned over to them.

We have a file dating back to March 24th on Mrs. Kanda. She is intelligent and speaks good English and knew all about our warehouse regulations at the time they took advantage of our offer. Her mother does not speak English. These people have some means so that their need is not absolute.

It seems to me we might be establishing a precedent that could easily cause a lot of trouble and result in many demands, if this application were granted.

We have no list here of the names of the people or a list of the articles stored in our warehouse but I presume the facts about the trunks to be as stated by Mrs. Kanda.

While our records here are available for your examinetion should you desire, we present a brief resume thereof: On April 6, 1942, inquiry was made of our Sacramento field representative regarding the sale of certain Japanese-owned laundry equipment located at 311 L Street, Sagramento, California, known as the L Street Laundry. The equipment was normally valued by one of the seven partners at \$20,000 but was offered as of that date for \$7500. On June 11, 1942 our Sacramento representative advised us that arrangements had been completed that day to give an agency agreement to Mr. R. N. Philpot to sell the laundry equipment, in addition to which ir. Philpot was purported to have agreed to act as their agent until sold, and also to handle their stored furniture if and as the Laundry was sold. We have, however, today contacted a reputable laundry machinery manufacturing and selling concern who state that a 10% commission on the sale of second-hand laundry machinery is unusually ecderate, 15% being more in line with customary practice. They stated further that if the price quoted to Mr. Philpot had been \$7500, the last mased would not have been actively interested in selling the property for that figure if it had been the net price and a commission not deductible. He has left and I do not know where he is interned. The premises consist of a dwelling and outbuildings; and a laundry business was conducted on these premises. The building is open and in a dilapidated condition, and in its present condition is more or less of a fire hazard. Further more, I am apprehensive about the insurance. The property is generally deteriorating, and 4 doubt if I have sufficient security for the amount of the loan. The note is payable in installments of \$30.00 a month, and payment on account of principal has not been made since January, 1942; interest has been paid up to March, 1942. The loan, according to the terms of the note, is now past due; I desire to protect my interest in the property and unless payments are made, I shall file a Notice of Breach for the amount due me.

Has this man intrusted his property affairs to your bank? I have been told that he has given your institution power of attorney; if consistent with your rules, can you give me any information in respect to this matter, or inform me as to whom I should communicate with?

This letter is being written to each of the parties holding conditional sales contract for equipment in the Mercury Laundry, and copies are being sent to the banks and finance companies holding paper involved.

What is desired is that we have the balance of this month within which to see if we can sell the place as a going business, and we believe this request should have the approval of all of you and of the Federal Reserve Bank.

I am acting as attorney for the owners, who are Japanese evacuees. They do not expect or ask for any recovery for themselves at all, but they would like to see the business sold as a going concern in order that all of the creditors of the business will be paid. This will require approximately \$17,000.00, and the business as a going business is worth considerably more than that.

Accordingly, if we can find anyone at all who wants a laundry, the price certainly will not be an obstacle to making a sale.

On the other hand, if the assets are merely sold as separate pieces of machinery and not as a going business, there will be very little for the creditors other than for those of you who hold conditional sales contracts.

These matters have been handled by me with the advice of the Federal Reserve Bank, and representatives of the Federal Reserve Bank have had meetings here with me and with the owners of the leased premises. Both owners have agreed for the past two months or more that there is no rental while we are attempting to sell the business as a going concern.

During the past few days I have had a number of inquiries and I feel there are fairly good prospects of being able to dispose of the business this month.

In the meantime there is ample security for the amounts due you, and with the priorities, and the impossibility of obtaining any new laundry machinery, your equities should increase rather than decrease with the passing of time.

I feel that it is within the spirit of the present war emergency, and particularly in view of the attitude of the owners, who merely want their creditors paid, that this concession be granted.

Removal of any of the machinery would destroy the value of the business as a whole and would destroy completely the value of all the installations and pipes, which represent a considerable sum.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS AND SETTLEMENT OF CONTROVERSY

### Introduction

This case was reviewed by William H. Dimond March 12 and 24, 1942, and P. E. Williams April 17, 1942; and, upon Mr. Dimond's leaving, was referred to me for further investigation.

## Statement of Facts

It appears that the owners of Mercury Laundry are: S. Baba and his brother, K. Baba, who succeeded to the interest of their father, deceased, and subsequently purchased the interest of other relatives by giving notes for said interest. The Mercury Laundry was originally established in 1903 at the present location: 527-31 Turk Street. The plant has, within the past two or three years, been modernized with complete new equipment of approximate purchase value of \$45,000.00, mostly purchased on Conditional Sales Contract, the balance remaining of \$7,421.96, including interest. The building consisted of the original construction, and an additional construction on adjoining property is owned by two different landlords, namely: The Estate of Mrs. Eva Schwartz, represented by Madison & Burke, Realtors, 80 Post Street, San Francisco, and Mrs. H. Hetty, represented by A. T. Billington, both of 1073 Bush Street, San Francisco, 'phone: Tuxedo 6285.

The present Schwartz lease was renewed on June 1, 1937, and running to June 1, 1944, at \$175.00 per month on the building and premises occupied. The Hetty lease was renewed January 1, 1940, and running to January 1, 1944, at \$200.00 per month, making the total of the rental paid by Mercury Laundry \$375.00 per month.

It appears that out of the original leasehold to Mrs. H. Hetty, there has been a balance carried forward of \$1,500.00 as owing out of the former occupancy of the father of Baba brothers. This is evidenced by an unsecured note given by Baba brothers to Mrs. H. Hetty, due on March 18, 1942, with interest paid to date, but no payment on the principal. It appears that all installments on equipment have been paid to March 31, 1942, and also that all rents have been paid to the landlord to this date.

## Controversy with Landlords

On April 21, S. Baba complained that in his attempt to dispose of the properties, due to his evacuation, the landlord, Mrs. H. Hetty, represented by Agent Billington, was demanding that the unsecured note of \$1,500.00, in lieu of former rentals, be retognized as a preferred claim against any disposal of the property or liquidation of the equipment; furthermore, that certain repairs by the restoration of the partition formerly taken out and which joined the Schwartz Building with the Hetty Building, be restored and that the installation of a slanting floor in the building be restored to its former level. Threats were made that if these preferences and requirements were not met, legal proceedings would be taken to hold all of the equipment of the Mercury Laundry as liquidating damages under the lease.

It appeared that a meeting was held the previous evening in the offices of D. W. Hone, Attorney, Russ Building, San Francisco, for the Mercury Laundry, and the Baba brothers, at which time heated discussion was entered into, and considerable ill feeling engendered.

Mr. Baba had his attorney communicate with me, and he requested that a further conference be called to try to arrive at an amicable settlement so that the property could be sold as a "going" concern that would obviously be prevented by the seeming anticipated action of the lendlords. Following this interview with Mr. Baba, Mr. Hone, attorney, requested that a meeting be called in his of fice on the afternoon of the 24th and urged that a representative of the Bank appear to render assistance in straightening out these difficulties.

At this conference there were present: Mrs. Fox, daughter of Mrs. Schwartz, deceased, Mr. T. L. Dempsey for Madison & Burke, Realtors, representing the Eva Schwartz Estate, Mrs. H. Hetty and her agent, A. T. Billington, Mr. S. Baba, represented by his attorney, D. W. Hone, and myself as representing the Bank.

In the deliberations that took place, it was generally agreed that the only way to dispose of this property was by sale as a "going" concern, whorein it seemed possible the creditors would be paid out in full under operations. The other alternative was to sell the equipment, to be taken out of the building, at possibly the appraised value of about \$7,000.00, which would be inadequate to meet any of the obligations to creditors other than the chattel mortgages or Conditional Salas Contract on said equipment.

Statement of Facts and Settlement of Controversy between Mercury Laundry and Landlords (Continued)

Mr. Baba presented an up-to-date statement of emounts owing to the various accounts, copy of which is submitted herewith. It will be noted a substantial reduction has been made in the Accounts Payable over that previously presented as of February 28, 1942, by approximately \$10,000.00. The se accounts have been paid off out of the receipts from various creditors to the Mercury Laundry received during this period. I stated the Bank's position was that we were primarily interested in assisting in all of the problems of evacuation and the preservation of the property of evacues; that, if it was decided to remove the equipment from the building and sell the same, it was apparent that there would be no equity for the Baba brothers, and that all of the creditors, including the landlords, would experience the loss of their entire amounts owing; while, on the other hand, if the property could remain intact and be sold as a "going" concern to new operators, it seemed possible that all creditors, including the landlords, might be paid over a period of operation.

Discussion was then entered into of the contentions of Mrs. Hetty for a preference on the \$1,500.00 owing by note from Baba brothers, to which Mrs. Hetty and her agent, Mr. Billington, agreed to waive this preference. Further consideration was given to the repairs to the building. It was conceded that, if the laundry could be sold as a "going" concern, the repairs demanded by the landlords would be unnecessary; while, on the other hand, if the equipment was removed and sold by piece, there would be no money with which to pay for these repairs except as expended by the landlords, since the equipment would be taken by the holders of the Conditional Sales Contracts without any balance for creditors.

### Conclusion

This conference proceeded in a very orderly fashion without heated discussion experienced on the previous evening, and a general disposition was shown to be helpful in an attempt to salvage any equity which the Baba brothers might have in the Mercury Laundry by an orderly working out of a sale or a re-leasing of the property. The following program was agreed to by all parties concerned:

First: To obtain consent of all open account creditors to the granting of time of 60 days in which to negotiate a sale or a re-leasing of the property that they might be paid out of operations over a given period of time sufficient to accomplish this purpose.

Second: That in the re-leasing of the property, such initial funds be obtained as a down-payment to make possible the payment of preferred claims of taxes, wages and monthly payments on operations.

Statement of Facts and Settlement of Controversy between Mercury Laundry and Landlords (Continued)

Third: That under sale or re-leasing of the property, all payments on Conditional Sales Contracts are to be re-established for the benefit of creditors by nortgage on equipment until the unsecured claims of "payables" are liquidated. Agreement with new owners to set aside each month a certain percentage of gross earnings for the amortization of amounts owing.

Fourth: To re-establish the interest of several parties desiring to lease or purchase but obstructed by previous demands of landlords.

Fifth: To keep in operation the present permit of operations previously obtained by the Mercury Laundry so as to arrange for the transfer of said permits to new owners.

Sixth: To pay out of income and keep in force all insurance and fire risk policies.

With this program established, the landlords were then requested to give consideration to some reduction in the rent to any possible new lessees or those possibly desiring to purchase the laundry interest. There was response to this by the Schwartz interests to a reduction in rent to \$125.00 per month; by the Hetty interests, to a reduction in rent to \$175.00 per month, including the sublesse for a small portion of one corner of the building to a winery store at \$75.00 per month.

At the end of this conference, Mr. D. W. Hone took power of attorney from the Baba brothers to represent them in all future negotiations, lease and sale of the property, during their evacuation; and with this action the conference ended.

SUBJECT:

dhe Star Leundry She Star Leundry Bad Hain Street Red Bluff, California

Se have been confronted with a nonweast involved situation regarding the Laundry business formerly operated by the shows named evacuoe at Red Bluff, California.

It appears that in 1938 Mr. Mamiya purchased the laundry operation from a Japanese maned F. Okawa who subsequently returned to Japan. The purchase price was \$4,000.00 and was secured by a chattel mortgage on the machinery and equipment of the laundry, which mortgage also purported to cover a ford delivery sedan registered in the mane of the purchaser, Mr. Mamiya.

In April of 1941 Mr. Namiya entered into a five-year lease with the Cameasian owner of the precises, Mr. Parry B. Hoffman of Red Bluff, California, the agreement calling for restal at the rate of \$60.00 per month. In addition to the property covered by the Ckawa mortgage, additional equipment was purchased by Mr. Kamiya on conditional sale contracts from the California Laundry Equipment Company, financed through the Bank of America.

The Okasa mortgage indebtedness has been reduced to about \$2,000.00 and we understand that the California Laundry Equipment Company indebtedness has been reduced to approximately \$4,00.00. There may be some other equipment owned by Mr. Kamiya which is unconsubered, a fact which we have not been able to clearly establish.

Prior to the evacuation of the Red Bluff area, Mr. Kamiya concented our field representative at Chico in attempting to dispose of the laundry. The market for such a business in the locality involved at that time was not satisfactory from a liquidation standpoint and the involved condition of the title to the equipment ande it impossible to effect the sale.

The result was that Mr. Manipe was evaduated without beving disposed of the laundry business or equipment and all of the equipment new remains on the leased precises. While the California leandry Equipment Georgesy has heretafore expressed its intention to repossess the equipment which was sold by it, apparently with Mr. Manipa's permission, we believe that the property has not yet been repossessed.

The lessor, Mr. Moffman, has been entious to recover possession of the premises in order to otherwise rest the property.

In order to clear up the matter, and in view of the apparent interest of a national of dapan resident in that country, in the matter, we established the factual background to the office of the alien Property Custodian locally, who is turn transmitted it to their Mashington headquarters, where it received the attention of Mr. Homer Jones, Chief of the Investigation and Mesearch Division. We were requested by that office to embalt: copy of the chattel mortgage, and of the cemerahip certificate overing the Ford vehicle, and a copy of the lesse agreement. He were also requested to mutualt a list of the equipment which the lesser, W. Maffman, desired to have removed from the property. At the same time we were asked to inform the Alien Property Castedian's office of the amount of the delinquency on the Chana indebtedness.

forwarded that instrument as well as a copy of the chattel mortgage and of the emercial and registration certificates to Washington, P.C., and requested Mr. Hoffman to supply us with a detailed description of all of the property now on the previous which he desired to have removed. We also requested Mr. Easilys who now resides at the Tule lake Mar Helocation Project, to give us detailed information on the status of the Indebtodness.

After considerable correspondence with Sr. Hoffman we have still not been given a full description of the property situated on the leased presides.

Sith respect to Sr. Kasiya, while is response to earlier communications be informed us that he owed about \$2,000.00 on the Chase indebtedness, he has not given us precise date as to the delinquency on that obligation.

As Er. Ladys is now in a relocation area and therefore within the jurisdiction of your agency so far as his property problems are concerned, we feel that this situation about to brought to your attention and we are emplosing those documents which we have been holding, which relate to the matter. They are described as follows:

1. Copy of lease dated April 1, 1941 between Mesors. Hoffman and Kamiya.

 Copy of chattel mortgage dated April 19, 1938 from Mr. Kamiya to Mr. Okema.

 California ownership certificate in the name of Miroshi Kamiya covering Ford "6" sedan delivery, engine number 18-925465.

4. California registration certificate in the name of Miroshi Maniya covering the same vehicle.

We are informing the interested parties that this subject has been called to your attention in order that you may take such steps as appear dustrable in the solution of the problem.

Copies of letters bearing today's date to Messrs. Hoffman and Kamiya, and the office of the Alien Property Cuctodian, are also enclosed for your information.

While we believe this statement of facts will provide as complete a story as our files disclose we will be nost happy to discuss the matter with you further should you desire additional data.

In the process of evacuating Japanese from the Red Bluff area, we have become interested in the property affairs of the Star Laundry. The proprietor, Mr. Hiroshi Kamiya, has been purchasing the property under contract from a Mr. Okawa, presently residing in Japan. Owing to the involved status of the title and equipment pertaining thereto, some difficulty has been encountered in evolving a proper channel for mettlement of the case and custody of the equipment.

We were informed in a recent letter from Mr. H. E. Hoffman of 810 Main Street, Red Bluff, owner of the building, wherein the laundry was situated, that the Bank of America National Trust and Savings Association was a contract helder on certain equipment located in that building. This information was unknown to us, it having been our impression that the only equipment purchased under contract through American interests had already been repossessed. If the statement by Mr. Hoffman is true or if the Bank of America does have any interest in the affairs of the Star Laundry, we would appreciate a statement from you indicating what equipment is represented and the status of the contract at the present time.

For your information, every effort is being made to arrive at a suitable procedure in disposition of the problem. At the request of the Alien Property Custodian, Washington, D. C., we have accumulated considerable data on the case. It is anticipated that a satisfactory program will be arranged in the near future, and if it proves that you are an interested party, we shall be pleased to keep you advised.

Reference is made to your letter of September 16, 1942 containing certain information requested by us.

We note that there is still due on the mortgage contract held by Mr. Ckawa an amount approximating \$2,000 out of the original \$4,000 value. In requesting the delinquency, we desired to know in what manner the contract was payable and how much should have been paid between June, 1941 and the present time. In other words, we do not know over what period of time you had agreed to pay off the contract and how many payments should have been made, which you have been unable to meet because of the owner's residence in Japan.

We note also that you desire further enlightenment concerning our reference to Mr. Hoffman, the landlord. Mr. Hoffman has requested our assistance in removal of all the equipment from the premises in order that he may secure a new tenant. We have requested that he supply us with a copy of the lease agreement and an up-to-date list of the equipment presently lodged in the building. As we have not yet received any advice from him in reply to our first letter dated September 9, a similar inquiry is being directed to him as of this date.

MEMORANDUM TO: MR. HERBERT D. ARMSTRONG

SUBJECT: Star Laundry
Red Bluff, California

Mr. Hiroshi Kamiya, operator of the above named laundry, which is located in Military Area No. 2, first approached our Chico office in early April.

It appears that subject was lessee of the property, with about four years remaining on the lease. At that time he was anxious to sell the business although no information was available that such area was subject to evacuation.

The bulk of the equipment for the operation of this business had been purchased by him on contract from F. Okema, formerly of Reno, Nevada, who had returned to Japan in 1940.

The total purchase price of said equipment, a list of which is in our files, amounted to \$4,000.00, which, Kamiya stated, had been reduced to approximately \$2,000.00. Payments had not been made to Okawa since June, 1941 as United States authorities had returned, without advice, any checks subsequently mailed.

The Star Laundry's business had been sharply reduced since December 8, 1941 and on May 22, 1942 Kamiya advised us that efforts to find a buyer were unavailing. From a practical standpoint this office suggested that if a satisfactory buyer could be obtained a sale could be effected in view of Kamiya's status as a United States citizen. It was suggested that a blocked account in the name of Okawa be established and his rightful portion of the proceeds of the sale be deposited to his credit in that account. However, in view of the fact that a reasonable price could not be obtained, these suggestions were of no particular merit.

In addition to the equipment mentioned above, certain items about which there was no complexity of title had been purchased under contract from American business firms.

Two contracts with the California Laundry Equipment Company of Cakland were in effect; one which was negotiated in January, 1941 at a cost of approximately \$582.00 represented a chattel mortgage on shirt machine, collar press and air compressor, which had been reduced to approximately \$355.00; the second contract made in March, 1941, at an original cost of \$225.00, was for an extractor and the present balance is approximately \$78.00.

On July 10, 1942 our Chico representative was again approached by Kamiya, who sought advice in view of his changed status and the isminence of evacuation in Military Area No. 2. His landlord, Mr. Hoffman, was willing to cancel the lease without penalty but having secured a new tenant, was ammious to arrange removal of the equipment in order that he might lease the premises.

Kamiya supplied us with a copy of the mortgage agreement dated April 19, 1938 between himself and Okawa. Among the items included in the contract was a 1934 Ford Delivery on which the daly endorsed certificates of ownership were available. These certificates were forwarded to us, together with the documents, and are presently in our files.

On July 13, 1942 we addressed a letter to the Alien Property Custodian recapitulating this entire problem and seeking any advice or assistance he might be able to render. Up to the present time nothing has been forthcoming from that agency other than that they had forwarded the letter to Hashington for exploration.

On July 24, 1942 we received a letter from the California Laundry Equipment Company advising that they desired our permission to repossess that portion of the equipment which they had originally delivered to Kamiya. There was enclosed with their letter a copy of a note addressed to them by Kamiya inviting them to repossess the equipment and advising them that the Government had taken over the balance.

This office contacted the California Laundry Equipment Company and advised them that we would in no wise prevent or interfere with repossession. The financial history of the contracts was ascertained as outlined earlier in this memorandum and we advised the California Laundry Equipment Company that further conversations would be held with them during the week beginning July 27, 1942, although it was made clear that nothing would be done to preclude foreclosure.

It is of course obvious that there is a plothora of laundry equipment for sale at the present time. This fact, coupled with the loss of goodwill because of Japanese ownership, has diminished the prices obtainable.

In the writer's opinion, Kamiya should allow repossession of that equipment owned by Caucasians because of the equity which is marginal and any sum he might receive would be nominal at heat if sold through other channels.

Two avenues present themselves so far as that equipment under chattel to Okawa is concerned, viz., place it in storage for the duration, looking toward an ultimate renewal of the contract with Okawa after hostilities have ceased; Kamiya could give a power of attorney to some disinterested party for sale of this equipment with half the proceeds to go into a blocked account in the name of Okawa and the balance revert to himself.

If this alternative is used the minimum acceptable price would of course have to be stipulated.

There would undoubtedly be some question about the title in view of Okawa's absence but this is a matter which could be straightened out based on certain understandings.

It is suggested that this latter method presents the most desirable form of disposition, assuming that proper arrangements could be had.

It appears to us that this procedure would apply to the sale of any properties or equipment which were being purchased from Okama.

Specifically, that equipment being purchased by Kamiya, which is not held through a chattel mortgage by Okawa, presents no problems of a similar nature. In our opinion, such equipment could be readily sold by Kamiya and the proceeds distributed as necessary between the contract holders and himself. This, of course, based on the assumption that a satisfactory price could be obtained, and that either a transfer of the contract agreement could be effected or a completion of the payments in order to satisfy the dealer, could be arranged.

Okawa, who was then residing in Japan, a check for \$100.00. This check was returned to him by U. S. authorities for reasons unknown to Mr. Kamiya. He has not attempted to make further payments.

Mr. Kamiya has also purchased some new laundry equipment on contract. On this equipment he still owes about \$500.00. His business has dropped off considerably due to prejudice since Dec. 8th, 1941. He would like to sell out but it seems that no one will pay anything for a laundry business at this time. He had several prospective buyers but \$500.00 was the most offered for business and equipment, which is a ridiculus offer. Mr. Kamiya states that he still has business enough to make a living and to meet his current obligations providing he does not have to make any payments on equipment purchased from F. Olawa.

He also was concerned about rumors that line 99-E would be moved and he would be evacuated.



Toron Hidaka, former proprietor of the Sunrise Laundry in Modesto, California. We believe that you mis-apprehend the status of the Federal Reserve Sank of San Francisco in the evacuation program. to are charged with the responsibility of protecting evacuos property and to see that unfair advantage is not taken of these people because of evacuation. Please be advised, however, that evacuous as such have lost none of their civil rights nor by the same token are they excused from their contractual obligations. In conformance with this program we have enleavered to be of essistance to Mrs. Hidaka in her problems connected with the Bunrise Laundry. In the course of such effort we have been instrumental in the sale of an automobile but as yet have been mable to solve the problem concerning the laundry. The Pederal Reserve Dank of San Francisco is not custodian of the property nor do we have any official status other than that of an advisory character, with Mrs. Aldaha. It is noted that on July 15, 1962 our representative, Mr. L. S. Wooks, proposed to Mr. Bailey, Division Sales Manager of the PANYEL PRESSING MACHINE, ING. that a meeting be arranged with all the creditors, at the office of Mr. Myron Moyle who is acting as agent and official advisor for Mrs. Hidaka. To the best of our knowledge such a meeting has never been arranged looking toward a nestually estisfactory settlement of the problem. In the opinion of our Stockton representative, Mr. Weeke, Mrs. Midaka has some equity in the property. On that premise we would be pleased to see that every effort is made to protect such equity before representation proceedings are begun.

With reference to your specific questions, you will note from the foregoing that we have taken me assignment of the property, therefore, we would have no official position in case you proceed to take legal action.

It is observed, however, that Mr. Moyle, by virtue of his power of attorney, is the legal representative of Mrs. Hidaka and no proposed action should be taken before being called to his attention.

We are enclosing for your direct reply a letter dated August 31, 1942, from Attorney Walter H. Young, 311 South Spring Street, Los Angeles, who writes in the interest of Pantex Pressing Machine, Inc., regarding an equipment account with above subject.

This is one of the few Japanese problems which we were unable to bring to a definite conclusion. Their Dodge automobile was sold to good advantage, but we have been stalled in our efforts to either find an operator for the laundry or to market the very excellent equipment at a fair return for the owner. This last objective might have been accomplished if the Pantex and Prosperity firms could have spared us enough time for a group meeting in Modesto whereby their cooperation would have been sought toward placing this equipment in a manner fair to all concerned. Many requests were made by us for such a meeting.

Your files carry our many S-5055 reports on subject, also copies of our letters to Pantex and Prosperity Companies. We also refer you to your letter of June 17 to Bank of America, Modesto.

he have conferred many times with Mr. Hyron Hoyle, Modesto, who is attorney for both subject and owners of the property, and who has made many attempts get the business under way again. He feels that subjects equity in the equipment is of such value that he would probably put the business through bankruptcy before permitting unjust action on the part of any creditor. However, we have not yet had any experience in the case which would lead us to believe that any one wishes to act unfairly in the matter.

In the course of these negotiations we were instrumental in obtaining a sale for their 1941 Dodge seden.

These people have frequently sought our help in connection with what is apparently a large ascent of laundry equipment, the bulk of which is being purchased on time contract from various agencies. We have been unable to secure a buyer who would meet her. Midaka's terms, affording her a resconable payment for her equity. At our recommendation, Hrs. Midaka did obtain a power of attorney from her husband to carry on whatever negotiations were decade necessary in the disposal of their affairs.

We have two representatives, Mr. Marold A. Johnson, 622 - 17th Street, Merced, California, and Mr. Meland S. Neeks, 314 First National Dank Building, Stockton, California, both of whom have interviewed Mrs. Midaka many times and are familiar with these problems. be able to do anything without them, and they do not want to send them to him as he has not been in the least cooperative since he had been interned.

The rest of his family is in Merced along with Yoshida who helped in winding up the affairs of the laundry. I will keep in touch with him and try and clear it up.

I have your letter of May 20, 1942, in regard to Mr. and Mrs. Hidaka formerly of Modesto.

I am quite familiar with their affairs and have powers of Attorney from them to deal with their affairs. I have so far, at least, been unable to work out any solution to their problems, other than to see that their property is properly cared for and not stolen or lost. I had intended to get in touch with you as soon as I could get a deal which looked even half way to their advantage but so far have not even been able to get that.

You are correct in your statement of the case and I have full information in my files concerning the description, approximate values, etc., of their property.

The best solution, in my opinion, would be to rent the whole property as a going business at a cash monthly rental and then from the amounts so received pay out the contracts on the equipment. I have talked with Mr. Ralph Brown, who is attorney here for some of the contract holders and it is possible that we can return some of the equipment which is not necessary to the operation of a laundry and get credit for it. I have talked with several people here, including some real estate firms, in view of getting such a renter but to date have not had any success.

In event that it will be impossible to rent this property after a reasonable time, or to possibly sell the business as a whole, the only thing left to do would be to sell out the equipment and pay off the contracts. This equipment is in new condition and should bring a good price if the proper buyer can be found.

Army Air Corps stationed at Merced Air Base called at the garage and made inquiry as to the Hidaka car, which he had heard of through a Mr. Bronson of the same base. We demonstrated the car to him and did not quote a price but sent him direct to Mrs. Hidaka. He negotiated the figure of \$850.00 with her. She and her representative, Mr. Koe Yoshida, requested us to consummate the deal with Captain Baisch at that price. There was no trade-in involved and the sale was a direct one being financed in-dependently through the American Trust Company, Modesto. The license was transferred by Mrs. Hidaka by virtue of a power of attorney from her husband who is in the U.S.I. Concentration Camp #23 at Sante Fe. New Mexico. The original contract on the car was delinquent back to October of 1941 with a balance of \$502.30 owing. We have received from the American Trust Co. and Captain Baisch the agreed amount of \$850.00 out of which we have credited \$502.30 to our contract and the balance of \$347.70 was mailed to Mrs. Hidaka at the Merced Assembly Center under date of May 16th. We made no charge to this customer or to the purchaser for storage, commissions, handling charges, or delinquent fees, in fact no charges whatever. we are sorry that we were not able to do better for her as to the price but due to the paralyzed condition of the used car market, we felt that this deal was as good as could be expected under those circumstances. Mr. Price of your bank has a copy of the instructions from Mrs. Hidaka to us authorizing the sale and with the information contained in this letter, we hope that your office will have sufficient details of the transaction so that you may close your files. It was evident from the conversation that Mr. Jennings preferred to sell the car through his company with a payment of about \$300 being made to the wife of the original buyer after clearing contract; however, he stated he had discussed the matter with Mr. Weeks, Field Representative at Stockton, and he said he would not sell the car until he received a letter from us authorizing him to do so; also, he desired a letter from us authorizing payment of the equity to Mrs. Hidaka. It was learned that the car had a wholesale Blue Book value of \$845.00 and a normal resale value of \$1070.00.

On May 9, 1942, Mr. Jennings'authority to act for the dealer. Mr. R. B. McBride, was verified for us by Mr. R. A. Schmalle, Assistant Manager of the Modesto Branch of the Anglo California National Bank.

Pursuant to your interviews with Mrs. T. Hidaka, we submit the name of Mr. Harry E. Egan, 1770 Broadway, San Francisco, as a potential operator of the laundry in question. We have been unable to reach him by telephone, and suggest that you have the proprietor contact him by mail or otherwise. Our files do not present any other inquiries of those interested in operating such an establishment.

This case appears to be one of those unfortunate situations in which there is admittedly a fair equity, but it contains so many appurtenant problems that it appears extremely difficult of solution. We cannot determine from your interviews as to the delinquency status, if any, on the laundry equipment. If it is not overdue, it seems to us that regardless of the husband's wishes in the matter, the most equitable solution would be an outright sale.

As far as the automobile is concerned, that, of course, can go through the usual procedure. Several qualified people in this office have stated that in their opinion, \$1,000 is overestimating the value of this machine. Apparently, a figure approximating \$700 is somewhat more accurate.

Mrs. Higeaka would like to continue operation of the business, and would like to sell a 1941 Dodge automobile, on which
\$503.00 is still due. She would also like to sell 3 of the presses
in order to clear the payments still due on the rest of the equipment
in the laundry. Equipment consists of 10 presses and 4 washing
machines, all purchased on a monthly payment basis.

Mr. Noda was asked if all parties interested, such as the Finance Company for the automobile and the people the laundry equipment had been purchased from, were being reasonable about the payments, and he said that everyone concerned was quite agreeable.

Mr. Noda stated that both Mr. and Mrs. Higeaka had been in this country for perhaps 15 or 20 years, and to his knowledge had not been out of the country since the date of their entry. He was quite positive that they had resided continuously in the United States at all times on and since June 17, 1940. They are the parents of five minor children.

Mr. Everson told Mr. Noda that since Mrs. Higeaka was a generally licensed national, the thing for her to do was to obtain Power of attorney from her husband immediately, by writing him and obtaining this power, after which, she was free to run the business as she saw fit. He also suggested that Mr. Noda get in touch with Mr. Weeks, our Field Representative in Stockton, who would no doubt be able to help him.

Reference is made to your telephone conversation of March 23, 1942, and to your file, forwarded by messenger on the same date, concerning the actions of one, Melvin L. Helmicos, in his alleged attempts to purchase Japanese owned enterprises through methods which are frowned upon by the United States Government. Mr. Melmicos was located at his residential address, 924 Stanyan Street, San Francisco, and in accordance with your request, was invited to this office for questioning relative to his actions and intents in purchasing Japanese owned enterprises.

On March 24, 1942, Mr. Melnicos appeared at this office and was questioned by representatives of this service. The following pertinent facts of Mr. Melnicos's personal history are set forth for your information:

He is an American citisen by right of birth; is 38 years of age; a graduate of the University of Chicago. From 1923 to 1931 he was president and sales manager of the Harvard Press, 36 South State Street, Chicago, Illinois. From 1931 to 1935, manager of the Pacific Coast Labor Burean, 401 South Spring Street, Los Angeles, California. From 1935 to 1938, ementive secretary of the Anti Monopoly League, Brant Building, Los Angeles. From 1936 to 1939, manager of the Group Hospitalisation Department of Franklin Hospital, San Francisco. In 1940 and 1941, he was supervisor of the Sering Department of the W. P. A., San Francisco. In 1941 and 1942, he was sales manager of the Beauty Tone Products, 171 Second Street, San Francisco. While employed in the above positions, Mr. Melnicoe stated he received an attractive salary.

Mr. Melnicos stated that he is a brother of Mr. H. P. Melnikow (while spelled differently, the family name is identical) who is a legal representative of the Pacific Coast Labor Bureau, 709 Mission Street, San Francisco, California.

In your correspondence, it was alleged that Mr. Melnicoe represented himself to different Japanese as being connected with the G. W. Carnrich Company of Newark, New Jersey, and the Direct U System of Northern California, offices in San Francisco. Mr. Melnicoe stated that while he had business cards of these organizations and had given them to Japanese with whom he had discussed proposed purchases of businesses, he did not represent himself as being connected with these organizations but merely used their cards and wrote thereon his residential telephone number, Seabright 2765, in order that telephone communications might be had.

He stated that he had called on several alien owned laundries and dry cleaning establishments with an intention to purchase same and that he finally found one enterprise to his liking, the Tri-City Laundry, San Estec, California, and that he, accompanied by the Japanese owner of the enterprise, proceeded to the San Mateo Evacuee Office and, in the presence of one of your representatives in that office, proceeded with negotiations to purchase the enterprise. He stated that while in the Evacuee Office, negotiations were entered into for the purchase of the Tri-City Laundry at a price of \$5,000.00 cash plus the assumption of \$1,200.00 of outstanding bills against this enterprise; that he balieved this to be a fair price and that he was certain your representative was satisfied with the negotiations, and that the Japanese owner had proposed this figure as a price for his enterprise.

Mr. Melnicoe admits that he personally has no finances to invest but that his family iss willing to place up to \$7,000.00 at his disposal; that on Monday, March 30, 1942, he will take over ownership of the Tri-City Laundry and that his brother, H. P. Melnikow, will advance the finances.

Some doubt is had concerning the approaches Mr. Melnicos may have made to some of the alien owners of enterprises. This doubt is probably based upon his adknowledged connection with labor associations.

Investigation of the true worth of the Tri-City Leundry has not been made and we do not discuss herein whether the price to be paid for this enterprise is adequate. We suggest that your office discuss this matter with the San Matos Evacuos Office, believing by this method that a satisfactory conclusion may be had as to the negotiations.

Your entire file is enclosed and roturned herewith.



Dear Sir:

Referring to our telephone conversation of last week, I am pleased to submit a statement of cash receipts and disbursements for the month of May 1942 as well as a schedule of accounts payable for charges incurred during that month for the Union Laundry Company and the Filbert Street Realty Company. I am also sending you a copy of my bill for your perusal.

You mentioned that you were anxious to augment your files on any further developments of the above-mentioned property. As stated over the telephone, I was appointed trustee of this property in April 1942 and have been able so far, to put all dwellings into liveable condition and rented them to defense workers. The reason that some of the rent has not been collected is due to the fact that all places except one were given 1 month's free rent in exchange for painting and papering work. The laundry itself is closed up. The windows have been boarded up and the equipment is covered by fire and burglar insurance.

There have been inquiries from people offering to purchase individual pieces of equipment. However, the owners are not desirous of selling the equipment piece-meal but wish to sell the laundry as a whole or else rent it to some responsible party. The best prospect so fer is the possibility of renting it for army work. Before any deal is consumated on



any lease set up, I shall communicate with you for approval of the conditions.

In the meantime, I have been appointed trustee of property belonging to Shigeharu Hiratsuka No. 5. August Avenue, Reedley, California and property belonging to Yaroku Hiratsuka, No. 46 August Avenue, Reedley, California, for the purpose of enabling these people to obtain fire insurance. The property was purchased by these people in April and the insurance company gave notice of cancellation, whereupon the mortgage holders demanded their money unless some insurance company could be found to give proper coverage. We have been able to cover this property now with fire insurance for \$1,500.00 per house after my name was put on the policy as trustee. The power of attorney is located in my office.

If there is any further information which you may desire, please feel free to communicate with the undersigned any time.

The number of new Japanese applicants applying to this office for suggestions has dropped off the past few days although the return calls of those coming in for continued guidance keeps the "call roll" up to average.

For the past week, whenever time permitted, your representative has been going through the case records of applicants whose cases have not been concluded and reported closed, and contacting applicants direct when possible, or checking with the local banks, real estate offices and title companies where applicants had indicated they would visit for advise or assistance.

A case in point is that of Icaro Imanura reported closed as of this date in which Japanese was one-fifth owner in a laundry business, one of the partners of which was interned in North Dakota; owned a home; (encumbered) an automobile and had some furniture to store.
