It is my understanding that there is some doubt in your mind as to just what the balance on your account of \$13.80 covers. This morning, the local branch of the Federal Reserve Bank called me regarding this amount and asked me to write you a full explanation.

As I told two members of your family at the time they called at this office, we would allow them the amount of the resale value on the merchandise returned, and if it were possible for us to obtain more than the balance due on the account, we would return that amount to you, but if we found, after the merchandise was returned to our store, that the resale value was less than the balance due on the account, that we would expect you to pay this balance so that your obligations to our Company would be clear. This was in full accord with the members of your family, and they agreed that this was more than fair, and that they would be willing to handle it in that manner. It was also explained to them that the return of this merchandise was entirely voluntary on your part, and that if you did not desire to return such merchandise but wished to continue your monthly payments until the account was liquidated, that this arrangement would be entirely satisfactory to us. 

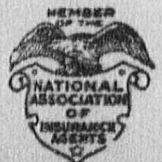

Referring to George Mukai, Hinkle Ranch, Folsom, California, this party has worked this property for past several years as Agent for one, Fred Tsujimoto, lessee.

In the Fall of 1941 the <sup>new</sup> lease was made effective between Fred Tsujimoto and H J Hinkle owner of the property, said lessee at times residing on the property and other times in San Francisco, George Mukai working as his foreman.

After war was declared between this country and Japan, Mr Hinkle declared that he did not like the set up with the Tsujimoto family as the father of Fred Tsujimoto had been picked up by the F.B.I. in San Francisco and was interned, so asked that the lease between Fred Tsujimoto and himself be cancelled, and that all operations from that point on would be taken care of by himself. At the same time he requested that George Mukai be persuaded to stay on the property and carry on.

The lease between Fred Tsujimoto and H J Hinkle was for a consideration of \$400.00 for the season, to be paid in two parts, on or before the 1st day of August, 1942 - - - \$100.00, at the time of completion and marketing of the crop - - - 300.00  
\$400.00 Total.

George Mukai and his family started in the regular season for the work to be done, pruning, spraying and cultivating. Mr Hinkle requested that the Pacific Fruit Exchange finance the operation of his property. This financing was done by check in favor of H. J. Hinkle, ie:

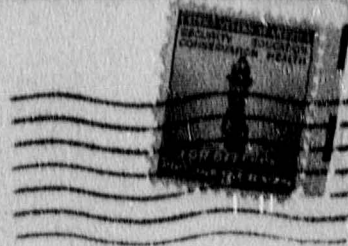

Dear Sirs:

A young Japanese man was in our office today with a rather complicated property problem. His name is Frank M. Uda, present address P. O. Box 338, Courtland, California.

He is (or was) the owner of a 1941 Chevrolet Special DeLuxe Sedan. This car and a 1938 Chevrolet 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ -ton truck were pledged as additional security for a \$1900.00 loan on an Allis Chalmers tractor. The Mitchell Finance Company at Figuerora and Olympic Streets in Los Angeles made this loan.

About March 18, 1942, Uda took the tractor to Mitchell Finance Company with instructions to sell it. On March 23, he came to Sacramento in his truck and left the 1941 Chevrolet at his home, 1021 A West 165th Street, Gardena. He returned to Gardena on March 26 to find that Mitchell Finance Company had repossessed the '41 Chevrolet Sedan.

Uda called on the Federal Reserve Bank in Los Angeles on March 30. He talked to Mr. Linquist (not sure of spelling) who telephoned Mitchell Finance Company about this matter.

About two weeks later, Mitchell Finance Company sold the tractor for \$1500.00, deducted \$20.00 for delivering the tractor and \$148.00 commission. The remainder of the selling price, or \$1332.00, was applied on their large note, leaving an unpaid balance of \$567.00.

About April 15, Uda gave \$267.00 to Ray Rios, a former employee, living at 202 Chessbrugh Lane (not sure of spelling), Los Angeles. This address is said to be near Evergreen Cemetery. After giving this money to Rios, Uda went with him to a finance company on Spring Street just north of the Federal Reserve Bank where Rios borrowed \$300.00 on the car, which, with the \$267.00 Uda had given him, paid Mitchell Finance Company in full.



May 7, 1942

Uda appears uncertain how it was possible for Rios to borrow on Uda's car but we have assumed that Uda cooperated to give the transaction the appearance of a sale to Rios. When this had been done, Rios took possession of the car and Uda returned to Sacramento in Rios's 1935 Chevrolet Sedan with the understanding Rios would return Uda's car and pick up his own when the car had been cleared.

Some time after returning to this neighborhood, Uda received the ownership certificate to his truck from the Motor Vehicle Department. On April 23, Uda sent money orders totaling \$372.00 to Rios to clear his loan on the 1941 Chevrolet Sedan. On April 25, Uda telephoned Rios at the City Market in Los Angeles and Rios admitted receiving the money. Rios stated "Everything will be O.K." Uda has written Rios four letters since that time and has had no response from him.

Will you endeavor to contact Mr. Rios with a view to concluding this matter.

Your letter of May 7 explaining the Frank M. Uda vs. Ray Rios case has been received.

Mr. Rios came to our office and verified the facts set forth in your letter. He explained the transaction for negotiation of the new loan of \$372.00 from First Industrial Loan on the 1941 Chevrolet. Finance companies were unwilling to grant a loan to a Japanese, especially a default case. Inasmuch as Uda wanted to avoid evacuation orders and depart quickly to Sacramento, Rios agreed to use his name and gave Uda his 1935 Chevrolet.

The tentative agreement then was exchange of the 1935 Chevrolet for the equity in the 1941 Chevrolet over and above the \$372.00 lien, which netted the \$300.00 in cash plus the \$267.00 Uda gave Rios, permitted the liquidation of \$567.00 lien held by Mitchell Finance Company.

Rios has written Uda to advise if he is now willing to complete the exchange, or cause full discharge of the lien and return of 1941 Chevrolet and adjustment for use of 1935 Chevrolet. There is on deposit at California Bank, Townsend and First Street Branch, Los Angeles, under account No. 31622, Dolores Rios, Trustee for Olivia Rios, \$362.00. The \$10.00 difference in the amount Uda sent Rios covered cost of clutch repairs. This should permit the two parties to voluntarily settle.

THIS AGREEMENT, made this 8 day of May, 1942, by and between ARD AVEN KIYOSHI KOZONO, First Party, and BERGUT-RICHARDS PACKING CO., a corporation, Second Party,

W I T N E S S E T H:

THAT WHEREAS First Party is the owner of a farm situated in Yolo County, California, on the West bank of the Sacramento River, approximately six miles South of the M Street Bridge; and

WHEREAS, said First Party is an American citizen of Japanese descent and because of the existing emergency expects to be required to evacuate said farm; and

WHEREAS, said First Party desires that Second Party carry on farming operations on said farm for and on First Party's behalf, as hereinafter provided, during First Party's absence;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED:

1. First Party has contemporaneously herewith made, executed and delivered to Second Party a General Power of Attorney authorizing Second Party to transact all business for and on First Party's behalf. In further explanation and amplification thereof but without limitation of any of the powers therein contained, First Party hereby constitutes and appoints Second Party his agent to take possession of, manage and carry on the farming operations on said farm and to do all things in connection therewith in its discretion which First Party himself might or could do if personally present.

2. First Party has delivered to Second Party the equipment and other personal property situated upon said farm, a list of which is attached hereto, marked "Exhibit A" and made a part hereof, all of which said equipment and property may be held and used by Second Party in connection with said farming operations.

3. Any and all crops produced on said farm may be marketed or otherwise disposed of by Second Party at such times, to such parties and in such manner as it in its absolute discretion may determine. In this connection, Second Party shall have the right itself to purchase such of said crops as it in its sole discretion may determine, in which event it shall pay therefor, or credit to First Party's account as hereinafter provided, the going market price for such crops at the time of purchase.

4. As compensation for its services hereunder, Second Party shall be entitled to receive a sum equal to ten per cent (10%) of the gross income from all said farming operations.

5. Second Party shall have the right to employ such labor and appoint such agents as it may deem necessary or proper and shall not be answerable for their default or misconduct if such agents and employees shall have been selected with reasonable care. Second Party shall also have the right to incur such debts and expend such sums as it in its absolute discretion may determine to be necessary or proper in managing and operating said property, and it shall not be personally liable for any debts or obligations contracted by it, nor for damages to persons or property of any kind whatsoever, nor for salaries or nonfulfillment of contracts, during the existence of this agreement; nor shall it be liable for anything in connection with this agreement excepting its own willful misconduct.

6. Second Party may but shall not be obligated to keep insured against fire or other casualty the said real property, equipment and other personal property, and may but shall not be obligated to pay any and all taxes and assessments levied or assessed against said real or personal property, and may but



shall not be obligated to pay all interest or principal which may become due on any indebtedness owed by First Party, whether secured by deed of trust, mortgage or otherwise.

7. Second Party shall not be liable for the safekeeping of any of the improvements on said real property or the crops grown thereon or of said equipment and other personal property, the risk of loss whereof shall at all times be on First Party.

8. Second Party may but shall not be obligated to advance its own funds to pay taxes, assessments and indebtedness owed by First Party, whether secured or unsecured, or indebtedness and expense incurred in the operation of said farm; nor shall it be obligated otherwise to pay or discharge the same, save and excepting from income from said farm or from other moneys which may be made available by First Party for such payments. In the event, however, that <sup>Second A.A.B.</sup> ~~First~~ Party in its discretion shall advance <sup>A.K.A.</sup> any moneys for any of said purposes, First Party shall be absolutely and primarily liable to reimburse Second Party therefor upon demand.

9. From any and all crop proceeds or other income, Second Party shall deduct all charges and expenses incurred by it in connection with the execution of this agreement and all moneys advanced; also its compensation as hereinabove provided. Any balance remaining after any and all charges shall have been paid in full shall be credited to the account of First Party or paid to him or to his order, as he may direct.

10. Second Party shall at all times keep full and accurate books of account, showing all receipts and disbursements incurred by it in carrying out said farming operations, and shall render quarterly statements thereof to First Party.

11. Either party shall have the right to terminate this

agreement and the agency hereby created, upon thirty (30) days' notice in writing to the other party of the election so to do. In the event of such termination, Second Party will surrender the possession of said real and personal property to First Party or to such person or persons as First Party shall nominate in writing, and in the absence of such nomination, to any public officer or agency who or which may at the time have jurisdiction over the custody and safekeeping of the property of enemy aliens or Japanese-Americans. Such termination of this agreement and agency shall be subject to any and all contracts and other commitments which shall or may have been made by Second Party under the powers hereby and in said Power of Attorney contained. It is also understood and agreed that notwithstanding any termination or notice thereof, Second Party shall not be obligated to surrender any of said real or personal property or to discontinue the management and operation thereof unless and until it shall have been reimbursed for any and all outlays and compensation then due and owing to it.

12. Second Party shall not be under any obligation to defend any suit or proceeding brought against it or against First Party by reason of any matter or thing connected with the execution of this agreement unless reasonably indemnified by First Party to the satisfaction of Second Party against all loss, costs, damages and expenses which might result therefrom or be occasioned thereby.


13. Wherever in this Agreement, or in said Power of Attorney, Second Party is given any power or discretion to authorize or not to authorize, to approve or disapprove, or to do or not to do, or to consent or not to consent to the doing of any act or thing whatsoever, the exercise of such power or discretion



shall be optional with Second Party and Second Party shall not incur any liability by reason of its refusal to exercise such power or discretion, nor shall Second Party incur any liability by reason of any loss or damage occasioned to First Party by reason of its exercise or non-exercise of such power or discretion, provided that Second Party shall have acted in good faith.

14. Second Party shall be entitled but not required to act upon any notice, request, consent, letter, telegram or other instrument or paper believed by it to be genuine and to have been properly executed or dispatched by First Party, and shall be entitled to receive same as conclusive proof of any fact or matter stated therein; provided, however, that nothing in this paragraph contained shall be construed as requiring Second Party to require the consent or ratification by First Party of the performance of any act or power authorized or conferred hereunder or under said Power of Attorney.

We live in the Mayfair Apartments, 807 North El Dorado, Stockton; and effective April 10th, there was a blanket raise of \$2.50 for single apartments, \$5.00 for doubles.

As we are located in what is known as a Defense Area, and in view of the recent freezing order, will you advise whether we are compelled to pay this additional rent, and also advise whether the increase already paid must be refunded by the landlord, or is it permissible to deduct the amount from our check on the next rent day, which falls on Monday, May 11th.

According to the manager here the Apartment House Association contends that the increases in this area were not exorbitant and, therefore, must be paid. She has also stated that a California law provides that once rent is paid it cannot be refunded. As my business for five years was Real Estate and Insurance I know of no such law.







We have examined this material carefully and discussed the case at length with Mr. Wixon, District Director for the Bureau of Immigration and Naturalization. He is writing their Philadelphia office again, presenting this case in detail and asking for a prompt ruling in all such matters. An informal opinion was expressed by him that Mr. Hall was entitled to a return of his performance bond which concurs with opinion expressed by your office and ourselves.

However, in view of the fact that this is not a property problem and is a matter which in no wise falls within the jurisdiction of the Federal Reserve Bank, we are returning the receipt in question, together with the pertinent correspondence which we suggest you deliver promptly to Mr. Hall. 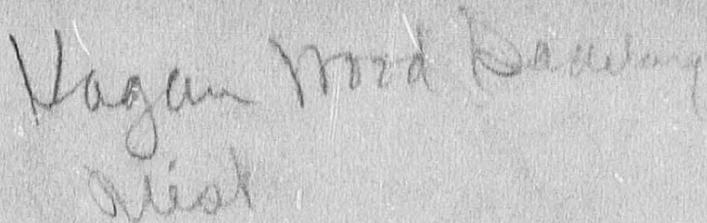





This letter will acknowledge the receipt of yours of July 6th and thank you very much for your very immediate answer.

In order to go into my storage space I'll have to pass through Mr. Uyeki's store room therefore, I've got permission from Mr. Uyeki to enter his store room provided you go with the Perry Veneer's representative to remove baskets. Mr. Uyeki have sent the key to Mr. Hodge of Hodge Hardware Company of Florin just across the street from my warehouse, therefore, when you find Mr. Ziegler of Sacramento Brokerage ready to remove baskets for Perry Veneer Company why I like you to go with him and let Mr. Hodge open the front door of the Uyeki Store and remove the baskets out through the front door.

The baskets are eight ounce raspberry type made of wood with thin strips of paper rim on top. There are 94,000 baskets. The baskets are in wooden crates--each containing one thousand count. They are stacked up very high so suggest freightmen to take at least four men.

I have not received order from Perry Veneer Company of wanting to remove their seven stitching machines from my warehouse for the payment of two hundred dollars due on the same machines, therefore, do not let Mr. Ziegler take out anything but raspberry baskets. I will hear from Perry Veneer Company soon so I'll give you the instructions later.

I have told Mr. Ziegler month before our evacuation to keep these baskets and stitching machines on his hand so they will be available to him at anytime. If he had done this why, all of this trouble could have been avoided.

Thanking you in advance for all of this trouble you have to go through and hoping to hear from you soon.

Upon registering for evacuation, it was found that this woman and her husband, Masajiro Kajiura, have worked on the farm of Mr. J. H. Kerby for many years and that Mr. Kerby owed them on two promissory notes, both of which were dated May 1, 1941, and each due six months from date. One was in the amount of \$454.00 and the other in the amount of \$430.00. Both notes were signed by J. H. Kerby. In addition, there was an open book account claim for labor in the amount of \$864.50. Mrs. Kajiura stated that they had called at the WCCA office some time ago but that a young lady had advised them that they should consult an attorney and they had not actually talked to any representative of the Federal Reserve Bank up to this time. Mrs. Kajiura consulted Mr. Wallace Shepard, attorney of this city, concerning her claim and he had presented a claim to Mr. Kerby's attorney, Mr. Harris. Mr. Kerby claimed an off-set against the amounts owing on the notes and the open account and had offered to settle for \$750.00.

Action taken: I phoned Mr. Shepard who confirmed the above facts and stated that he felt that it would be necessary to sue Mr. Kerby in order to get any settlement as he did not want to settle the claim for \$750.00 as requested by Mr. Kerby's attorney. After discussing the matter with Mr. Shepard, we contacted ~~the~~ the Retail Credit Association and found that Mr. Kerby had been involved for many years and was quite seriously involved at the present time. In view of the imminent evacuation, after consulting Mr. Shepard, we phoned Mr. Kerby and requested that he come into the office, which he did. 





When registration started on Sunday, May 24, we found that due to the fact that the Japanese in this area were cut off from Sacramento, a large percentage of them had large sums of money on their persons which they wished to deposit to their bank accounts in Sacramento. They also wished to cash checks and purchase travelers checks.

Action taken: \*Phoned the Capital National Bank of Sacramento and the Bank of America and arranged to have a man from each bank at the Control Station on Tuesday morning. The amount of business transacted on Tuesday was very encouraging so had them return again on Wednesday. During the two days, the Bank of America took in total deposits of \$2600.00 and sold \$300.00 in travelers checks. The Capital National Bank took in deposits amounting to \$2985.00 and sold \$2072.00 in travelers checks. Several new accounts were opened at each bank and checks cashed for the Japanese amounted to approximately \$600.00.



About April 20, A. J. Reid talked to O. E. Alley, Chief of Police of Vacaville, Solano County, after being informed by numerous Japanese that Alley had received radios of all types and had refused to release any. This, despite clarification of contraband rulings which apparently permitted Japanese to retain radios incapable of short-wave reception. Mr. Alley agreed to adjust any differences amicably.

We believe he still has possession of a number of items not contraband.

A specific case is that of K. Nakamura. Enclosed is a copy of Nakamura's letter dated April 23, 1942. We are informed no action was taken by Alley in response to Nakamura's letter.

Sacramento representative came to see evacuee at request of San Jose as to plans for future payments or disposition of car. Owner stated she wished to sell but had no buyer at that time. C.I.T. offered to sell it and took signed agreement to sell and deduct amount owing from sales price. Agreement in writing did not state he would pay them anything over amount due, but they claim he stated that verbally. Evacuee drove car to Sacramento where agent left his car on street and drove evacuee back to her home where she signed agreement. Claim made that Sacramento C.I.T. man stated they would leave almost any day.

Several days after relinquishing car to C.I.T., owner's brother-in-law in San Jose came to evacuee's home as he had buyer in San Jose for \$950.00. Evacuee gave brother-in-law order on Sacramento office for car, who refused, claiming car was stored in Garden City Garage in San Jose. On returning to San Jose, they discovered that car was supposed to be sold by C.I.T. to a man named Wolf for \$1095.00.

Sacramento denies that car is sold. Evacuee gave power of attorney for car and truck to Toni Tomesello of San Jose who has engaged lawyer to try to recover car. (Law office of Gratten). Tomesello works for Osen Garage, San Jose. Owners would like to determine whether car is sold and if so, at what price, or if not sold, they would like to sell it to their prospect.



Dear Mr. Reid;

I received your note of May 22, 1942, relative to my hotel problem and wish to state that the circumstances concerning the same are as follows:

More than thirty days prior to the evacuation of the Japanese from the city of Sacramento, Mr. F. Gostalli, my landlord of 524 Fifth Street, Broderick, Yolo County, California, stated that he would buy my hotel furniture and equipment upon terms which would be mutually satisfactory. Since that time I have asked him on numerous occasions to set the value of my property, but in each instance he postponed the actual setting of the value. Finally on May 12, two days before I was evacuated to this Center, Mr. Gostalli informed me that he would not purchase my equipment and that I would have to find other buyers. As a result of this last-minute refusal to purchase, I was obliged to sell most of hotel equipment at ridiculously low prices. I was unable to sell 24 beds, mattresses, and pillows as well as 48 sheets; and I left this equipment at the hotel. This equipment was purchased by me in 1936 for five hundred dollars, and I believe that the reasonable value of this equipment now in said premises is one hundred and fifty dollars.

Due to the suddenness of the evacuation I was unable to pay part of my rental, and I was there for arrears in my rental amounting to thirty-two dollars and fifty cents.

I would appreciate it very much if you can make some arrangement for the disposal of my remaining equipment inasmuch as I believe he has been using the same since my evacuation.

At that time Kamei purchased an International "pick up" truck from Cave and borrowed \$150.00 from the Capital National Bank of Sacramento, Cave joining in the note, on the pick up and the 1½ ton Chevrolet. The pink slip was still in the name of Cave. On April 1, 1942, Kamei completed his last payment on the loan (all payments having been made by him) and received the cancelled note and the pink slip on the International pick up which was in his name but did not receive the pink slip on the Chevrolet truck registered as legal owner to Cave. Both cars were free and clear. Kamei claims that Cave borrowed on the Chevrolet 1½ ton truck and one of his (Cave's) own from the Capital National Bank without his knowledge and consent. The bank verified this and stated the balance owing was \$600.00 on which the payments were delinquent and which had been placed in the hands of their attorneys for collection, their attorneys being Downey, Brand & Seymour, Mr. Otto Rohwer of their handling the case.

For a couple of months, Mr. Kamei has been trying to recover the Principal property involved and scope of problem: pink slip from Cave but has been put off for one reason or another. Kamei has turned his agency business over to the Sierra Fuel Oil Co. of Sacramento on a lease agreement which included the trucks. He now wishes the trucks to be in his name as legal owner with the Sierra Fuel Oil Co. as registered owner. The Chevrolet cannot be transferred on account of the Bank holding it as collateral.

I called Mr. Tait of the General Petroleum Corporation who verified the fact that effort had been made to secure the pink slip without success. I phoned Mr. Cave at Clarksburg requesting the release of the pink slip which he agreed to do provided Kamei would return some oil drums which Cave claimed belonged to him. This however is not our problem as the car was pledged illegally apparently, by ~~Tait~~ CAVE I enlisted the aid of Tait who advised Cave that we were insisting on the release. Also went to Florin about drums and found they were not involved. Contacted Mr. Holmes of the Capitol National Bank asking his cooperation by withholding any repossession until we could try and straighten out the case. He agreed to this willingly.

May 27th: Tait advised he had talked with Cave urging him to get in touch with us. I also phoned the District Attorney asking his opinion and advice on the case. He seemed to think it on the border but wanted us to exhaust other means first. Also talked with Holmes at the Bank. There attorney had already gone out to repossess the car thinking it was in Clarksburg. I advised him it was in Florin and that we would keep him informed. He promised again to hold off repossession.

May 28th: Kamei's time of departure suddenly changed from Friday, May 29th to Thursday, May 28th. This is unfortunate as we wanted him here but could not secure any change from Social Security, as he had been switched from Fresno destination to Manzanar. Tait was present when Kamei left and said Cave had promised to come in by noon which he did not do and had not done up to the time of our leaving Elk Grove at 3:20

Mr. Papan, of the Farm Security Administration phoned me at the Elks'

Club in Sacramento that Mr. J. J. Cave had left the pink slip to the Chevrolet Truck with him for me. It was signed off by the Bank. Mr. Cave phoned later the same evening that he had left it in Elk Grove still claiming \$185.40 for drums. I advised we had no interest in them but would pass the information on to Tait of General Petroleum.

On arrival at Elk Grove Friday morning, May 29th, the pink slip was turned over to me endorsed by the Bank as legal owner but not endorsed by Cave. Also there was a note about the claim of \$185.40 which we can ignore.

Phoned Mr. Tait of G. P. of the above facts. He said he believed there might be some drums belonging to Cave in possession of customers which is the usual business practice. He promised to round them up and return any he found to Cave. He is winding up the affairs for Kamei and will take care of the proper transfer of the pink slip to Kamei as soon as we turn it over to him.

Phoned Holmes of the Capitol National Bank and thanked him for the co-operation. Tait will write Kamei of the return of the pink slip.

Turning the pink slip and note over to Mr. Reed in Sacramento for proper disposition. This case satisfactorily disposed of and about \$500 value in truck saved for Kamei, due to splendid cooperation of above persons and Mr. Molter in charge here.

The following is a statement of the situation existing between Jesse H. Cave and myself over the legal ownership of a Chevrolet  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ton truck, registered in the name of Jesse H. Cave and on which he has borrowed a sum of money from the Capitol National Bank of Sacramento on which there is a balance owing of \$600.00 on which the payments are delinquent and the bank demanding payment or repossession.

The truck was purchased by me in August, 1939 from the Capitol Chevrolet Co. for the sum of \$1200. on terms of \$600. down in the form of trade in and cash and the balance on a loan of \$600. to the Elk Grove Branch of the Bank of America. Mr. Cave from whom I had a sub agency of the General Petroleum Corporation also endorsed my note at the bank which I paid up in full in November 1940. The car was registered at the time of purchase in the name of Jesse H. Cave for agency reasons and on completion of payments, he became the legal owner by the bank signing off on the pink slip which was given over.

In March, 1941, I borrowed \$450.00 from the Capitol National Bank of Sacramento in order to buy an International "Pick up" truck from Jesse Cave, putting up as security, ~~both cars~~; Mr. Cave also signed the note as dealer. All payments on the loan were made by me and completed April 1, 1942. At that time the pink slip on the International was signed over to me by the bank but not the pink slip on the Chevrolet, it still being registered in the name of Jesse Cave. All payments on these loans were made by me and the trucks in my possession. Mr. D. J. Tait, Sacramento Manager of the General Petroleum Corporation knows the above to be the facts.

On receiving notice of evacuation, I arranged to turn an agency which I had previously secured from the General Petroleum for the Florin District independent of Mr. Cave, to the Sierra Fuel Oil Co. and to lease my trucks to them. I intended to register them in the name of the Sierra Fuel Oil Co. as registered owner and myself as legal owner. For nearly two months I have been trying to secure the pink slip to the Chevrolet from Cave but have met with one evasion after another. Mr. Tait has also endeavored to help me get it but we have had no success. We found out that the pink slip was held by the Capitol National Bank together with one for a car owned by Cave as security for a loan on which there is a balance of \$600.00. They refuse to give it up unless the loan is paid. As the payments are delinquent the bank has placed the matter in the hands of its attorneys for collection. If the truck is repossessed, I will face a loss of from \$800. to \$1000. because of a loan secured by Cave on a car in which he had no interest and on which he borrowed without my consent or knowledge. I am asking your aid in securing this ownership certificate transferred to me so I may complete my arrangements with the Sierra Fuel Oil Co. who are now operating the trucks for the agency.

This greatly interferred with the closing of my business transaction in the hands of the Federal Reserve Bank and at the time of departure I had not been able to close my business affairs, for the purpose of which I had been assigned to go on Friday, May 29, 1942.



This will acknowledge receipt of your inquiry concerning your brother's account with Mr. Elsbach.

For your information permit us to advise that after writing our letter to Mr. Elsbach he called us on the telephone and stated that the account with your brother had been paid up in full and that the confusion arose because of the fact that your brother did not keep his account correctly. We requested Mr. Elsbach to send us a statement of the account as he understood it to be and he promised to do so. After waiting about two weeks to hear from him, and without receiving such statement from him, we again wrote him last week. To the last mentioned letter we have not yet had a reply.

In view of this situation, and if Mr. Elsbach persists in denying that he owes your brother any further money, the only possible recourse is a filing of a law suit. In view of the amount involved we cannot conscientiously recommend doing so and furthermore, as long as your brother is detained in an assembly center, it would be impossible for him to appear in court and prove his case. In short, we feel that if correspondence will not cause Mr. Elsbach to pay up what your brother claims is due to him, little hope can be entertained for the recovery of the money.

We regret that we are unable to advise you more favorably but will continue trying, in the hope that Mr. Elsbach will finally recognize the obligation.



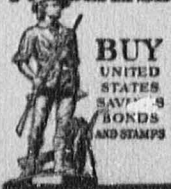

Gentlemen:

It has been suggested that we make a report covering the activities of this bank in connection with the evacuation of the Japanese from Florin and Perkins in Sacramento County and from Clarksburg in Yolo County. No attempt has been made by us to keep a record of the transactions handled by us or of the new accounts that we opened, and it is therefore impossible to furnish any figures.

In Perkins a representative spent two mornings at the control center. A number of travelers checks were sold and several new accounts secured. We were able to assist a number of evacuees by cashing their checks.

In Florin the number of evacuees was larger and more time was spent at the evacuation center. Commencing with May 19th and continuing through May 28th, the writer and his secretary spent several hours each day in Florin. During this period a number of new accounts were secured and a number of travelers checks were sold.

The evacuation from Florin and Perkins occurred at the height of the strawberry season and the Japanese in these communities were without any banking service. It is estimated that in excess of \$150,000.00 was paid to the berry growers during the month of May and the bulk of this sum was distributed shortly before evacuation. We therefore feel that we were able to render a definite service to the Japanese in cashing their checks and handling their other banking problems. Many of these people were our clients and one of the berry distributing firms which purchased approximately half of the berries grown in the area, carried its account with this bank.

Our efforts in the Clarksburg area were not entirely wasted as we opened several new accounts and sold some travelers checks. However, most of the Japanese in Clarksburg had arranged their affairs before the order was made. Our representatives were in Clarksburg on three days for several hours on each day.

The value of our efforts cannot be estimated, at this time, in terms of dollars and cents. We feel that we have made many new friends for our institution and the future will determine the value of this good will.

We wish to acknowledge the assistance rendered our representatives by your Mr. MacFarland and Mr. Reichert and wish to thank them for their many courtesies.



I, S. E. Maeda, do hereby agree and rent to Leo W. Richter, my 1939 Chevrolet " 6 " truck, engine # AT 2160727 at the rate of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per month.

It is agreed by both parties, that Leo W. Richter, is to pay for all Gases and Oils to be used in said truck, and that said renter, Leo W. Richter, agrees to carry full coverage insurance for the benefit of the rentor.

It is further understood by both parties, that this agreement is terminated upon default of a monthly payment.

The original intention of the parties was that the agreement should run to Mr. Richter personally with the understanding that the life of the agreement would cease upon either of the following conditions: (1) The declaration of armistice between the U.S. and Japan or (2) Cessation of the beverage business by Mr. Richter.

It was also the intention of the parties that Mr. Richter keep said truck in good repairs and in good running condition at all times at his own cost and expense and to return the same to Maeda upon termination of said agreement in as good as a condition as when received, normal wear and tear excepted.

Mr. Richter states that said truck is fully covered by insurance and it is suggested that duplicate policies be obtained from the insurance company in order that Mr. Maeda may retain a copy of said policy in order to be fully protected by insurance.

Mr. Richter states that he commenced business as "Capital Beverage Company" in January, 1942 as a separate and individual business and employed a man named Fred Joseph. That sometime in February 7, 1942 said Fred Joseph claimed that a co-partnership existed on or after said February 7, 1942, and a suit was instituted and Department 4, Judge Lemmon, Superior Court of Sacramento County, formed a judgment of said partnership. A man named Ing was appointed Receiver by the Court pending final judgment according to Mr. Richter. Also, Judge Lemmon ruled on or about June 11 or 12, 1942 a judgment by the Court declaring said company to be a co-partnership. Fred Joseph is represented by Senator J. M. Inman and Leo W. Richter is represented by Attorney Winton Langloies.

It is recommended that the original agreement herein and above described be amended or rewritten to protect Maeda along the lines suggested immediately thereafter.
