


Dear Mr. Billingsly:

We are enclosing check No. 64155 of the Automobile Club of Southern California, in the amount of \$170., payable to Ben Mitsuda and his attorney, John Y. Maeno, as well as a letter from Mr. Mitsuda addressed to Mr. Hackett; a statement from Mr. Maeno for attorney's fees and also a letter from the attorney to Mr. Mitsuda enclosing the check which we have described. We also enclose a One Dollar bill which has been forwarded by Mr. Mitsuda as reimbursement for certain telephone tolls incurred by Mr. Hackett, our field representative, in an endeavor to effect settlement.

All of the enclosures should be released to Mr. Mitsuda who is presently in Santa Anita Park. We should like to have you explain to the Japanese that this particular transaction appears to be a dispute between the attorney and his client and it should be settled between the parties. We are not in a position to arbitrate in a matter of this kind, as you can readily appreciate after reading Mr. Mitsuda's letter there is no property problem involved, and we definitely will not intercede in a matter of collection of accounts between the Japanese.


About April first or second a deal to sell this car for the net pay-off and \$275.00 for the equity was consummated by Alfred and all proper forms were signed awaiting the power-of-attorney from Joe U. Obayashi. Upon receipt of this power-of-attorney from Joe U. the party who was to buy the car refused to go thru with the deal so the account has been standing as is since that time, with the car in storage and payments being kept up by Alfred Obayashi. Out of the twenty-two Branches in this area all Japanese accounts were properly taken care of and either paid in full or proper sale made changing the accounts over on transfer and of equity and so forth. 

\$225 Rate Won For Tuna Jobs

SAN DIEGO — February 8th marked the date the San Diego Branch of ACA Local 3 completed negotiations which established a rate of \$225 per month for radio operators on all jobs of straight radio work in the tuna fleet, and a \$1 per ton bonus for work in conjunction with fishing, over and above the base rate. The announcement was made by John A. Yargionas, ACA delegate here.

Tuna Ops File Claims

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Claims of radio operators and cooks for wages, transportation, and subsistence from the Panama Canal Zone to San Diego were made to the Department of Labor in Washington, D. C. by ACA.

When Japan declared war on the United States, the tuna fishing fleet was called into Panama by the United States Navy and the men were forced to get back to San Diego however they could.

The boat owners immediately ceased the wages of their employees although the radio operators and cooks had signed articles which called for their return to the port of embarkation.

Brother John Yargionas, ACA agent in San Diego, referred the matter to the Washington office where it was placed before the Maritime War Emergency Board. The Board, however, indicated that it did not have jurisdiction over fishing boats and forwarded the matter to Dr. John R. Steelman, head of the Department of Conciliation. Dr. Steelman assigned labor conciliator Malcom to the case.

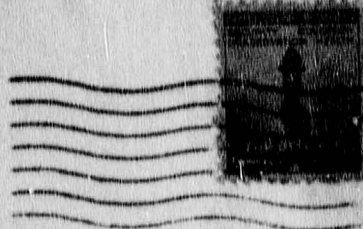





This will acknowledge your letter of July 20, 1942 with respect to the two new retreaded tires which were impounded by officers of the University Police Station some time ago when you were attempting to sell them prior to the time of your removal to the above address. We understand that these tires are 600x16 six ply tires.

We have discussed this matter with a representative of the Evacuee Property Department of the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco. It will be satisfactory to this office if the tires in question are released to you upon the following conditions:

- (1) A copy of this letter is to be furnished to the University Police Station;
- (2) The tires are to be delivered to you at your present address by a representative of the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco;
- (3) The tires are not to be transferred by you except to a tire dealer or to a person who has a certificate issued by a War Price and Rationing Board. - (4) Upon any transfer being made, you should notify the undersigned of the name and address of the transferee and the circumstances under which the transfer was made.



We called upon Detective P. M. Van de Bogart, University Station Los Angeles Police Department, to investigate this matter and a copy of the Police Department's report is attached. The two tires are still at the University Station.

We also called upon Mr. John F. Ford, Attorney in the Office of the Price Administrator, and were advised that Mr. Okada is privileged to dispose of his tires to a dealer at any price the dealer would be willing to pay. However, Mr. Okada cannot ask or obtain more than the ceiling price of \$10.67 each and provided the buyer has a rationing certificate. The only other alternative remaining to Mr. Okada is that the Office of the Price Administrator will direct the Police Department to release the tires to Mr. Okada at Santa Anita, provided they are stored with the Camp authorities and sold in accordance with the regulations above outlined; viz., only to those having a rationing certificate and at no more than the ceiling price of \$10.67 each.



Referring to report made July 24, regarding property of S. Okada, 17 acres located Rt. 1 Box 415, Redondo Beach, California. Received letter today from Mr. Norman Tibben who is now operating the property explaining the reason that he had not sent Mr. Okada a statement and condition of his crops. Mr. Tibben reports that due to the present condition the market is offering only 75¢ for 50# sack of onions and that hardly pays for labor. Mr. Tibben also states that the garlic crop is now ready for marketing providing he wishes to accept 7 to 8¢ per pound which in his estimation is not what they anticipated getting. The statement from Mr. Tibben to Mr. Okada showing the amount of cabbage both red and green along with the amount of onions he had marketed totaled \$17.02, of this amount Mr. Okada was to receive half less all expense. This office would like to enlist your cooperation and we are wondering if it would be at all possible for you to question Mrs. Powderly and forward any information to this office.



Dear Sir:

We are endeavoring to make arrangements to have furniture moved for one of our evacuees at Santa Anita from their home at 3105 Colton Avenue, San Diego, to the First Japanese Congregational Church at 415 15th Street, San Diego. This is a home formerly occupied, before the evacuation, by Yoshiko Tajiri, and she had made arrangements to lease the house for the duration of the war furnished. However, on June 10 she was notified by the Navy Department that her property would be taken over for the use of the Navy, and that she must vacate her property by August 1st.

This of course completely changed her plans, and since she is unable to leave the camp to make arrangements for the removal of her furniture, we are endeavoring to help her. We do not have the facilities at this late date for taking care of a situation like this since our warehouse in San Diego is not accepting any more furniture for storage, and we are only maintaining guards at the warehouse.

We have been successful in making arrangements with the Board of Trustees of this church for the storage of the furniture, and our only problem now is to assist her in making arrangements to have it delivered from the house to the church. These people are without funds to pay for removal of the furniture, and we hope you will be able to find a way to assist her. We shall appreciate an early reply, as they have only until August 1st to turn the property over to the Navy.

About two years ago, my family purchased a home at 1105 Colton Avenue, San Diego, California. The property is in the name of my brother, Vincent. Before being evacuated from San Diego, we made arrangements to rent our house furnished to a U. S. Army officer. Apparently, our problem for the care of our house and furniture had been solved. On June 10th, or shortly thereafter, we received condemnation proceedings from the Navy Department that our property would be taken over by them, giving us until August 1st, 1942, by which time we may remove the house if we so desired. Part of our household furniture is stored in a garage consisting of two large trunks and many miscellaneous articles. In the house there are a living room set, dining room set, kitchenware, stove, linoleum rug, sewing machine stored in the closet, radio, small printing press and type, mirrors, pictures, and clothing.

Action taken:*

We have contacted the Board of Directors of the First Japanese Congregational Church which is located in San Diego but whose board members are here at Santa Anita. They have consented to store the furniture for Miss Tajiri for the duration of the war provided that she will have the furniture moved to the church without expense to the church. I have contacted Mr. Donald McCready, executive assistant to the Camp Manager here at Santa Anita, and he has consented to send a truck to pick up the furniture and take it to the church for storage. He is going to notify me of the date they are going to pick up the furniture so that someone may be there at the church to receive it. I think this will close the case.


Referring to our telephone conversation concerning the possibility of your being able to move the furniture contained in a house at 3105 Colton Avenue in San Diego to the First Japanese Congregational Church at 431 - 12th Street, San Diego, I am enclosing herewith a list of furniture to be moved.

I would appreciate it very much if you would give me about ten or fifteen days' notice before moving the furniture so that the tenants occupying the house may be given notice to move. The reason for this unusual request is that Miss Tajiri had leased her property for the duration of the war furnished, and that about June 10 she was notified by the Navy Department that her property would be taken over for the use of the Navy, and that she must vacate her property by August 1st. This of course completely changed her plans.

Since she is unable to make other arrangements for the removal of the furniture, I thought it might be arranged through the W.C.C.A. to move it for her. Arrangements have been made with the church for storage of the furniture for the duration of the war without cost to her.

There is a Mr. Rummell living at the church who is looking after the property in the church. He is there almost all the time I understand; however, I would like also to be able to notify him about the time to expect the furniture.

Dear Don:

Referring to our telephone conversation concerning the possibility of your being able to move the furniture contained in a house at 2105 Colton Avenue in San Diego to the First Japanese Congregational Church at 431 - 13th Street, San Diego, I am enclosing herewith a list of furniture to be moved.

I would appreciate it very much if you would give me about ten or fifteen days' notice before moving the furniture so that the tenants occupying the house may be given notice to move. The reason for this unusual request is that Miss Tajiri had leased her property for the duration of the war furnished, and that about June 10 she was notified by the Navy Department that her property would be taken over for the use of the Navy, and that she must vacate her property by August 1st. This of course completely changed her plans.

Since she is unable to make other arrangements for the removal of the furniture, I thought it might be arranged through the F.C.C.A. to move it for her. Arrangements have been made with the church for storage of the furniture for the duration of the war without cost to her.

There is a Mr. Russell living at the church who is looking after the property in the church. He is there almost all the time I understand; however, I would like also to be able to notify him about the time to expect the furniture.



About two years ago, my family purchased a home at 3105 Colton Avenue, San Diego, California. The property is in the name of my brother, Vincent. Before being evacuated from San Diego, we made arrangements to rent our house furnished to a U. S. Army officer. Apparently, our problem for the care of our house and furniture had been solved. On June 10th, or shortly thereafter, we received condemnation proceedings from the Navy Department that our property would be taken over by them, giving us until August 1st, 1942, by which time we may remove the house if we so desired. Part of our household furniture is stored in a garage, consisting of two large trunks and many miscellaneous articles. In the house there are a living room set, dining room set, kitchenware, stove, linoleum rug, sewing machine stored in the closet, radio, small printing press and type, mirrors, pictures, and clothing.

Action taken:*

We have contacted the Board of Directors of the First Japanese Congregational Church which is located in San Diego but whose board members are here at Santa Anita. They have consented to store the furniture for Miss Tajiri for the duration of the war provided that she will have the furniture moved to the church without expense to the church. I have contacted Mr. Donald McCready, executive assistant to the Camp Manager here at Santa Anita, and he has consented to send a truck to pick up the furniture and take it to the church for storage. He is going to notify me of the date they are going to pick up the furniture so that someone may be there at the church to receive it. I think this will close the case.





Before being evacuated from Compton, Takeuchi Bros. made a deal through the Farm Security Administration to sell the majority of their farm equipment to Paul Williams and/or the Farm Products Corporation. Total agreed price for the equipment was in the neighborhood of \$3800.00. The bill of sale prepared and executed by Takeuchi Bros. described one Hardy-Niagara motorized duster at a valuation of \$100.00. This was left on the premises. Another duster which was properly called a power take-off duster (one which attaches to a tractor), was sold by Takeuchi Bros. to Eddie Chinn for \$200.00 cash. Takeuchi Bros.' understanding was that the motorized duster was the piece of equipment to be delivered to Paul Williams. Paul Williams' understanding of the deal was that the power take-off duster (tractor drawn) was the duster which was to be left on the premises and included in the sale deal.

Various telephone calls have been made to Paul Williams and to the offices of the Farm Security Administration in South Pasadena. Nothing much could be accomplished; the men who had represented the Farm Security at the time ~~action taken~~

the deal was made having been transferred, and it is almost impossible to get in touch with Mr. Williams.

An appointment was finally arranged for Tuesday, July 7th, at our office in Santa Anita. Mr. Williams again stated that both he and the Farm Security representatives understood that the power take-off duster (erroneously described as a motorized duster) was to be included in the sale.

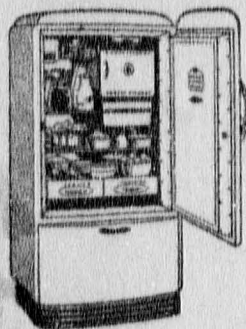

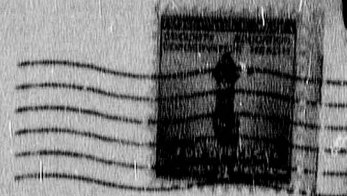

Gentlemen:

Confirming statements made to Mr. Billingsley by the writer, the State of California had recently rented two dwellings to an organization known as the Japanese Aid Society of America.

The State owned dwelling at 944 Summit Avenue was first rented to this Society as a home for some aged Japanese men who were unable to work. Subsequently they moved from this dwelling to another State owned building i.e., the west side of the double house known as 1524 Kearney Street in the same vicinity.

At the time they left 944 Summit Avenue they owed the State \$35.00 rent, and this amount Mr. S. Tsukamoto of 1620 Pleasant Avenue, Los Angeles, agreed to pay. The organization was moved from 1524 Kearney Street because the State planned to wreck this dwelling in connection with further highway construction. They had incurred a further obligation of \$60.00 at this address. Mr. Tsukamoto appeared at this office and said that since all of the Japanese were to be evacuated from this area arrangements had been made with the County of Los Angeles to make payments for these past due obligations.

We have communicated with Mr. Lawrence C. Schreiber, Executive Director of the Department of Public Assistance of the County of Los Angeles, who advises us that the County had made no arrangements whatsoever to take care of the obligations of these Japanese, but he believed that your Bureau would have some knowledge of this matter. We are therefore writing to you in order that we may ascertain



whether or not you do have any control of the funds of these Japanese evacuees, which would enable you to secure a payment from them to cover the amount of rentals due the State of California. If you do not have any control over their funds, but can advise the writer how he may contact either Mr. Tsukamoto or someone else who would be in a position to pay these amounts, we would appreciate this courtesy very much. Since the Japanese are all scattered at the present time to various evacuation centers, we know of no other manner by which we can obtain this information. Please supply this information as soon as possible.



Reference is made to your communication of June 17, 1942, wherein you expressed possible recovery of certain articles left in the 1937 Buick which was owned by John Wada.

We contacted Sergeant Crowley at the Army headquarters and found that their method of handling the cars that are brought there for disposal makes it almost impossible to locate anything that has been removed from the cars. He informs me that the tires are thrown altogether with no specific data or inventory attached to them.

Also such personal articles as you mention are for the most part thrown in one large heap and considered as junk. With the voluminous amount of this type of property they consider it of little value and have no reason to give it any consideration when same is removed from the cars. The Sergeant expressed himself as being beyond their responsibility to go through all that they have to pick out specific requested articles.

We regret that we are not able to be of more assistance. If you have any suggestion, we will be glad to investigate further.




R. L. Davenport, of the Surplus Lines Adjusting Co. who are adjusters for Barker Bros., met at the office today with Miss Fumiko Watanabe, who was represented by her attorney, K. Doi. Miss Watanabe purchased a refrigerator from Barker Bros. on September 24, 1940, for \$176.17. She kept up monthly payments until the time of her evacuation when the balance was then \$95.00. The electric refrigerator was sent to Japan by Miss Watanabe, who states that she has no money at this time with which to pay the \$95.00 balance. Mr. Davenport explained to her that it was a criminal offense to take mortgaged property outside of the state, and that she should try to make some arrangements to pay the balance. Davenport had made an investigation and found that she had a Japanese friend, who is now at Pomona, who might help her pay it. I communicated with the Provost Marshal's office at Pasadena and they gave me the address of her friend whose name is Mrs. Sudsuko Takeshita. Mr. Davenport is making a trip to Pomona to see if arrangements could be made there to have the account paid for Miss Watanabe by her friend.

Action taken:*

After the meeting, I talked with Mr. Davenport and he was of the opinion that nothing should be done about the matter at this time. He thought that Miss Watanabe will eventually pay it or have her friends help her to do so. Davenport stated that he will advise us of any action he might take.

I was asked by Mr. O.W. Hackworth, bookkeeper for Mr. A.W. Coggeshall, Richfield Oil Station owner in San Diego, Calif., to come to his gas station and parking lot, yesterday, and do a little checking up with him on a matter concerning Mr. Harry Yamashita's trailer. This I did and I was shown your letter to him requesting the truth of the matter concerning damage to the trailer.

I did not see Yamashita's car but I did see the two trailers he had there. The house trailer in its present damaged state was attractive enough to receive an offer of \$200.00 to Mr. Coggeshall from parties passing by. In my estimate the trailer is only slightly damaged, broken door and broken windows, \$15.00 is the maximum amount of damage. We are writing you this letter in as much as we feel that because one of the Japanese involved in it is a guest of the government at Santa Anita, that you would be the best person to handle it.

I am enclosing a copy of a letter which a Mr. O W Hackworth bookkeeper for Mr. Coggeshall, owner of a Richfield Gas Co. station in San Diego, gave me. Incidentally, I was given the letter to call my attention to this matter because I had been this Japanese man's union agent when he was a radio operator in the tuna fishing fleet sailing out of San Diego, and he knew I would handle the matter in an honest fashion. Mr. Harry Yamashita, was an auto mechanic for Mr. Coggeshall in the period between the time Japanese radio operators were prohibited from going to sea to the time they were interned at Santa Anita, Calif.

Mr. Yamashita had parked two trailers and his car in the care of Mr. Coggeshall's gas station on Market St. Sometime during the past few weeks a vandal or vandals, broke the door and the windows to the House trailer he had there. You will note that in the letter from Mr. Hanson, a Mr. John Patterson of National City offered \$75.00 for the trailer. I do not know Mr. Hanson or Mr. John Patterson, you can take the necessary steps in getting acquainted should this come under your jurisdiction. Our suspicion is that this Mr. John Patterson may have had something to do with smashing this trailer and then writing this false information to Mr. Yamashita that his trailer was now worth only \$75.00. Just a few days ago Mr. Coggeshall was offered \$200.00 for the trailer in its present condition. I personally inspected it and would say that no more than \$15.00 worth of damage was done to it.

I also write you this in case it should fit in with any other similar activities that might be going on, if the pieces don't fit it can be said we tried anyhow.
