

Field Representatives of this bank and the Farm Security Administration, as well as of the Federal Security Agency, are now located at the office of the U. S. Employment Service at Santa Maria, which appears to be the Field Office nearest your place of residence. The office is located at 310 W. Main Street, Santa Maria, California.

We suggest that you get in touch with the Field Representatives there, to whom copies of your letter and our reply are going forward for information purposes. They will lend all assistance possible.

Dear Mr. Armstrong:

At long last, I am getting off this much-belated letter of thanks to you for all the help you gave me during the trouble I had in my house in San Francisco late in September. Ever since then I often thought of writing to you to show you my appreciation, but, somehow, I did not get around to it till this evening. I had written Major Carl Sanitilli about two weeks after the incident, and it was my intention to thank you formally about the same time, but here I am now. Not only would I like to thank you for your beyond-routine aid, but I am truly thankful that we niseis can look up to men of your calibre for understanding and intelligent sympathy.

Just to add a personal touch, this is what I am doing now here at the new boom city of Topaz: am acting as head of the Cooperative Dry Goods Division since the beginning of October. Had our grand opening last Wednesday, and we had over 3,000 people come into the new store building which is the regulation WRA recreation hall (100 x 20 ft.), and our sales for the first day ran up to \$2,700. We have a staff now of 12 young people, and you can well imagine that our staff is kept mighty busy. We have the following 9 departments: men's wear, ladies' wear, boy's wear, girl's wear, baby shop, shoe-slipper shop, household goods, notions, piece goods, with an additional toy department for the holidays.

Associating with such fine men as our superintendent, Mr. Walter Honderick, former Washington University man, a YMCA man, and Mr. Emil Sekerak, a Ohio State grad and Co-op expert, makes the work very interesting. Last week our Co-op group went to Salt Lake City for 4 days, and I spent all Friday and Saturday buying dry goods for the store. They are now talking about sending me to St. Louis within a month to do our spring and summer buying for the dry goods store. This is a wonderful experience for me, and I am truly enjoying it all.

I have come to realize more and more that this is indeed a very small world, for here at Topaz I have already met a caucasian young lady who used to sit three rows behind me for three years in my junior high school registry class in San Francisco. She is now the wife of the director of the Community Welfare department here. Also Mr. Caleb Foote, the executive secretary of the Fellowship of Reconciliation, a Friend service group, who is now residing at our troubled home, was here to visit us on his round of all the WRA centers, and I was really surprised to find that he had known Mr. Sekerak of our Co-op from before.

We are all fairly well settled now and are getting quite acclimated to the extreme weather condition here. Though we had several snow storms about a month ago, we are having sunny weather here almost every day these days. Of course, as a San Franciscan, accustomed to the mild Bay Area weather, it is quite a hardship to have to stand the cold weather here. It was 12 degrees yesterday morning, and we hear that the thermometer can go as low as 30 below zero. I never knew what they used ear-muffs for before, but now I realize they are very handy items to have around.

I hope that this letter will find you and yours in good health. And again, as I close, thank you very much for everything. Fellow Americans like you make us realize the worth of democracy and spurs us on to do our share, though so little, behind wire fences in American's hinterland.



Dear Mr. Tatsuno:

I am writing you with reference to a conversation which I had yesterday at my desk with Miss Grace Sheppard who is the former adopted daughter of Mrs. Alvarez, although I understand she was never legally adopted. Apparently there has been some family friction which has caused the young lady, who is 18 years old, to leave the Alvarez home and place herself in the hands of the proper civil authorities.

In the course of the investigation by the authorities and in conversation with Miss Sheppard they received information relative to Mrs. Alvarez which caused the visit of yesterday at my desk. I am passing it on to you with the thought that you should be apprised of the circumstances.

Miss Sheppard in her statements, confirmed your allegations relative to the withdrawal of your furnishings and personal effects from the storerooms on your premises at 1625 Buchanan Street at various times during Mrs. Alvarez's residence there, and the appropriation of these articles to her own use and some cases, it was stated, that she actually sold them and retained the cash. Miss Sheppard's accusations go into some detail with reference to approximate time and methods and also refers to particular pieces about which you argued with Mrs. Alvarez. Particular reference is made to such items as the sale of a vacuum cleaner and various yardage material, and the use of your automobile on one occasion for an extended trip. Your car apparently was taken off of the blocks and operated with a temporary battery.


Obviously there is no proof or legal substantiation of these instances which is available to us and they merely confirm your thoughts and opinions as expressed during your last visit to the premises. It is evident that there is no method of protecting yourself against a tenant who may be inclined toward acts such as these and there is no agent or management service which could take over to prevent such happenings. The various U. S. Government agencies and the many private firms and banks such as our own, do everything possible to protect the properties and prevent damage or confiscation. When an instance of this kind happens it is almost impossible to project or take action because of the lack of proof and the inability to identify the personal property.

You may recall that at the time of the transfer of the residents of the Tanforan Assembly Center to the Central Utah War Relocation Project we were requested by a representative of your agency to render assistance to the above-named evacuee in settling a dispute with a tenant of his residence property at 1625 Buchanan Street, San Francisco, California.

Briefly, prior to evacuation from his home area this evacuee had leased the property to a family named Alvarez under a private arrangement, and had stored considerable quantities of goods in two storerooms in the property. The goods stored included certain household furnishings which the tenants were not permitted to use, and also included a rather large quantity of merchandise from the Tatsuno's dry goods store.

On the eve of departure from Tanforan Assembly Center, Mr. Tatsuno was given permission to visit his old home and select needed personal property for his trip, at which time he discovered that the tenant had obtained access to the storerooms and had placed in use certain of the property which they contained. Our problem was to re-segregate the property then in use by the tenants and return Tatsuno's goods to the storerooms. Tatsuno proposed to make arrangements for a new tenant, and with the help of The Anglo California National Bank of San Francisco, his agent, succeeded in doing so.

So far as we were informed the transaction was satisfactorily concluded, Tatsuno being transferred to the Central Utah War Relocation Project and a new tenant having taken possession of the property.



I received the letter from Mr. Everson of ~~September~~ 28 enclosing the inventory of the heavy pieces at the home of Dave Tatsuno 1625 Buchanan Street.

We also have received a letter from Dave Tatsuno, dated September 29, going into three pages, which, for the most part, repeat the many accusations which came up out at the house. He gives us several names of prospective tenants whom he feels he can trust (?) to look after the house and take care of the personal property.

However, there is one paragraph of his letter that I believe is worthy to repeat, as follows:

"If you can also arrange for periodic check-up of other properties under your jurisdiction in cooperation with the WCCA and the Federal Reserve Bank, it would be a good thing as so many evacuees have been telling me and Mr. Tamotsu Sakai that they are not completely satisfied with the handling of their affairs. Surely, as innocent victims of mass hysteria kindled by war, we should have a little more consideration by the Federal authorities. As agent of many evacuee accounts, will you confer with Mr. Armstrong and Major Sanitelli to see if some way can be found for better check up of the evacuee's property. Of course, when I say this, I do remember the shortage of man-power and the fact that this is war and others are losing much, but if it is at all possible to have something done, all of us will more than appreciate. I do realize the practical difficulties that you are up against."

This paragraph did not make a very favorable impression on us, although we believe that his remark that "they are not completely satisfied with the handling of their affairs" was not intended strictly for us, but apparently included all kinds and types of property handled by your organization and ourselves and other banks and agencies. My own objection is that a great deal of time, effort and money is being expended to make things as easy as possible, and certainly everyone is trying.

At 1:30 Saturday afternoon, September 26, 1942, Major Santelli telephoned from the above address to request assistance in settling a dispute between Tatsuno, owner of real property, and Mrs. J. Alvarez who, together with her husband and two foster children, occupied the premises.

At Major Santelli's request the writer went to the address and there met the Major, Dave Tatsuno, Mr. Ross, a civilian guard for the Wartime Civil Control Administration in whose custody Tatsuno was released from Tanforan, and Mr. O'Connell, a plain clothes detective of the San Francisco Police Department.

By way of background, it appeared that the Tatsunos leased the premises to the present tenant, exclusive of a store room on the main floor and two store rooms in the basement in which the Tatsunos stored large quantities of furniture and other personal property, including some from their dry goods store. A few items of property they permitted the tenant to use. The store rooms were allegedly locked by Tatsuno before evacuation.

Upon receiving notice of his transfer to Delta, Utah, Tatsuno obtained permission to come to San Francisco to select from the stored household goods the pieces he desired forwarded to him in the relocation area.

He called at this residence on September 25th, the tenant then being away and is understood to have forced the front door and gained access to the premises. He found innumerable items which he had left in the store rooms being used by the tenant, who had made a practice of frequently calling at Tanforan to assure the Tatsunos that everything was all right at home. The original call was made by Tatsuno in the company of a Joe Gibbs. He was permitted to return to the premises from Tanforan on Saturday, September 26, 1942.

Tatsuno was much concerned over the fact that the store rooms had been entered and, according to his story, they gave evidence of having been ransacked and the contents disturbed. He was much incensed and appeared desirous of instituting some form of legal action against the tenant for violation of the terms of the lease agreement which was understood to exclude the rooms in question. The lease was not presented for examination. As a corollary, a dispute had arisen between Tatsuno and the tenant as to the ownership of certain of the items of property in use.

After long discussion, the items in dispute narrowed down to four, including a coffee table, a table lamp and two bedspreads. A considerable quantity of property was returned to the main floor store room Saturday afternoon and the room temporarily sealed by the writer.

Arrangements were made for the return of Tatsuno to San Francisco on Monday, September 28th to complete the business of selecting goods for forwarding to Delta, Utah and complete the discussion with the tenant.

This morning at nine o'clock the writer again returned to 1625 Buchanan Street. The following persons were also present:

Mr. R. R. Zellick, Assistant Trust Officer, Anglo California National Bank, agent for Tatsuno;

O'Connell of the San Francisco Police Department;

Captain McFadden of the Wartime Civil Control Administration;

Ross, civil guard of the Wartime Civil Control Administration;

Dave Tatsuno, Alice Tatsuno, his wife; Chiye Watanabe, sister of Dave Tatsuno and Roy Watanabe, her husband.

After continued altercation, the ownership of the remaining items in dispute was clearly established and all property of the Tatsunos then visible and in use on rented portion of the premises was returned to the main floor store room, which was locked and sealed with seals provided by Mr. Zellick. The basement store rooms were examined and they were likewise locked and sealed.

The tenant agreed to quit the premises at the earliest possible moment, as soon as new quarters could be found, and Tatsuno proposed to have the house occupied by a friend.

The War Relocation Authority is prepared to open the warehouse at 1595 Van Ness Avenue if it becomes necessary to move the property from the house for its protection, but the present plan is to leave all the property there due to its great bulk.

The Anglo California National Bank will continue to represent Mr. Tatsuno and make arrangements for the forwarding of certain property to Delta, Utah, or arrange for the necessary crating and hauling of the property if they desire to store in the War Relocation Authority warehouse.




Dear Mr. Johnson:



Dear Sir:

There are two reasons why I went to Visalia yesterday, and they are: First I understood that there were not enough persuasive methods being used on the Japanese in order to have them assemble their household goods in central locations, and number two, that Mr. Johnson might be accepting another position.

It seems that the Japanese have been making many inquiries as to whether or not we would pick up their household goods at their homes, and apparently the Visalia office assumed that this would be done, which of course is correct. However, it has always been my thought that if the Japanese could be persuaded to send their goods to certain points it would make our job easier and less expensive. Therefore both Mr. Johnson and Mr. Holmes agreed to start immediately asking the Japanese if they would please assemble their merchandise at given centers.

Mr. Glenn Johnson has accepted a permanent position with the United States Employment Service at Bakersfield. However, I talked to Mr. Evans of the United States Employment Service at Bakersfield yesterday and he agreed to allow Mr. Johnson to remain on the job in Visalia until the 16th. As he needed another man badly, this was the extreme limit of time he would be able to accommodate us.

The Visalia and Reedley offices are in good shape, and there is nothing to worry about at this time.

In reference to the trunk of F. H. Tatsuno stored at the Japanese M. E. Church, I have instructed the Pacific Freight Lines to deliver the trunk to our warehouse at 414 E. Street.


X We regret that we are unable to provide you with any information regarding Mrs. Tokoshima. Her name does not appear on any of our records, which, however, do not cover all evacuees resident in Military Area No. 1 as our contacts are only with those who elect to consult us in connection with their property problems.

The Walnut Grove area has not been evacuated as yet, but when the area is evacuated it may be possible for you to obtain the information you desire from the Wartime Civil Control Administration Headquarters at the Hotel Whitcomb, San Francisco, directing your inquiry to Dr. Calvert L. Dedrick, Chief of Statistical Branch. The fact that you may be unable to provide the name of the evacuee may make identification difficult.

It is also possible that this evacuee may previously have departed the Walnut Grove area before Military Area No. 1 was frozen, the freezing having occurred at midnight, March 29, 1942. 
Our representative at Tanforan Assembly Center has just informed us that Miss Kay Tomihiro, Family Number 32220, was evacuated to Santa Anita Assembly Center on May 29, 1942. A letter previously addressed to her at Santa Anita was, however, returned to us unopened.

Our Tanforan representative informs us that the census figures recently taken at Santa Anita and sent here for compilation do not show this family at Santa Anita. Inasmuch as official records show this family was evacuated to Santa Anita, we can only assume that subsequent to their arrival there the family may have been given a travel permit to some other center or location outside the military area.

We would appreciate it if you would have your Santa Anita representative contact the manager of the Santa Anita Assembly Center and carefully recheck the Tomihiro facts.

We are again enclosing check No. 923 dated June 4th, 1942, drawn by D. H. Rosenthal for Economy Cleaners, Inc. on the Hester Branch of Bank of America National Trust and Savings Association in San Jose, California, in the amount of \$6.50 and the accompanying memorandum indicating the purpose for which the check was issued, in the hope that the evacuee can now be located at Santa Anita.

If the payment is in satisfactory amount, please have Miss Kay Tomihiro send to us a receipt therefor.

Reference is made to your letter of August 17, 1942 outlining the difficulty in collecting certain rentals through the Tesluck Realty Company.



I feel very sorry to trouble you for personal matter, but, at present, being held in the relocation center, not permitted to to out and settle the position. I was living in Penryn, Cal. when W.C.C.A. notified us to evacuate to Marysville Assembly Center. We were not allowed to take our cars with us. and urged us to sell them to some one.

Enclosing papers, ask you to get some facts. Mr. Olivas and his family living on Mr. H. A. Snelling's ranch in Penryn. When he and I exchanged paper of promises. Some day in June he moved to Richmond, Cal. with his family. Where he was working for Southern Pacific Co., and later they moved to R. F. D. Box 309, Richmond (619 Market Ave.). I sent a registered mail to trace where he moved to when he moved away from Penryn. I send my letters to them but they don't answer, neither my mail come back to me, so they must be still at the same address as at Richmond on S. F. Bay.

Upon the promise that he will pay me \$10.00 every other week, I sold him my 1937 Willys Deluxe Sedan with 7 tires for \$200.00 and slightly used davenport to be paid in cash at once for \$15.00. The promise is to be paid through Mr. H. A. Snelling, because they lived on Snelling's ranch but as they moved away from his ranch Mr. Snelling has nothing to do with. According to his promise to pay me \$10.00 every other week from May 9, should be paid 11 times besides \$15.00 cash for davenport, but instead I only received \$55.00. If you suggest some compromise or they do, I am willing to consider for quick settlement. I received from him on

May 9, 1942	\$10.00

June 22, "	10.00
July 13, "	<u>20.00</u>

4 times total \$55.00

P.S. I want to keep those papers for record, so please do not discord.






