
Dear Sirs:

We regret that we are unable to make any suggestions for you regarding the desired repossession of the radio which was the subject of your letter. This property appears to have been surrendered under the provisions of Proclamation No. 3 as contraband, over which this bank has no jurisdiction.

Possibly a solution could be worked out through the receipt which the police doubtless handed Mrs. Toriye. If she is willing to surrender such receipt to you, perhaps you could pay her something for her equity and protect yourself through a resale.

Gentlemen:

We would like to inquire regarding a radio purchased by a Japanese on conditional sales contract and turned in to the police as requested.

This is for a Philco radio sold on December 17, 1941, to Marilyn Toriye, 112 North Fremont Street, San Mateo, on a conditional sales contract. The selling price, including carrying charge and tax, was \$82.58. Payments of \$5.78 a month have been made and the present balance is \$40.41.

Mrs. Toriye read the notice in the paper and turned the radio over to the police. She was born in the United States of America but her husband was born in Japan and is in internment now.

Yesterday we phoned the Federal Reserve Bank who referred us to the F.B.I. who in turn referred us to the United States Attorney who referred us back to the Foreign Fund Control of the Federal Reserve Bank. We hope you may be able to give us some light on the subject.

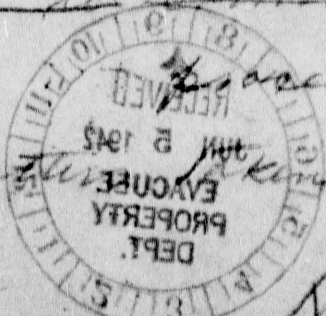

The attorneys in Oakland told me in answer to my last letter that they did not have an agreement whereby they sold the sign to Mr. Esquierda, but gave him a bill of sale and delivered the sign to him. I called up Mr. Esquierda today and his wife said that they had paid \$59.19 for the sign and that was the total amount they intended to pay.

It seems to me that we should not let this matter go by default and allow them to take judgment against Michio for the amount asked in their complaint. We believe that the fact that the sign was re-possessed by the Electrical Products Corporation and then resold by them would be a waiver of their rights to collect under the terms of the contract, and while they may be entitled to some damages on use of the sign for the period for which it was used, nevertheless there was a deposit of \$47.25 made to cover the last three months of rental and this should be applied to the accrued rentals.

Further, we believe the fact that you were evacuated and that continued use of the sign was impossible by reason of such evacuation, would be sufficient cause to cancel the contract on your part as continued use of the sign would be in contravention of the orders of the War Department.

There is a further principle involved and that is that should you choose to reinstate the contract the Electrical Products Corporation must be in a position to carry their part of the contract and this is impossible for the reason that they have disposed of the sign, and the office of Price Administrator has made an order forbidding the manufacture of any signs after the first day of August, 1942.

Should none of the above ~~approve~~^{good} defenses, we still feel that the case would not be tried for the reason that the defendant has a right to appear in court at the time of the trial and, as you know, it is impossible for Michio to be away from the Assembly Center for the purpose of attending court for more than eight hours and that attendance must be in the custody of the deputy sheriff and a man from the Civil Guard at the Assembly Center.

In view of all the foregoing you will understand that you have a good defense. Nevertheless, the case is pending in the City of Berkeley and if you want us to defend the matter you would have to have \$130.00, \$30.00 as expense to Berkeley and \$100.00 as a retainer. I do not know whether the matter is worth that much to you or not, but bear in mind that if you do not defend, judgment will be taken against you for something in the neighborhood of \$450.00.

Please carefully consider this matter and write me what you think about it. I will be glad to come out to the Assembly Center and see you any day next week, that is in the evening. I was talking to the office out there this morning over the telephone and they said that if you asked for a pass for me, they would be glad to give it to you.

If you decide to go ahead with the defense of this matter or not will make no difference in my coming to see you. I will be very glad to come out just on general principles.

It appears as though Mr. Otoy is interned in Montana. The subject, as holder in due course, deposited these checks in the Security First National Bank, Santa Maria, but they were returned to him over the counter without reason, unpaid. They appear to be indorsed properly and bear the clearing house stamp of the Security First National Bank of Los Angeles, under date of Dec. 18, 1941. It appears from notations on these checks that they are drawn in payment of labor.

Mr. Toya seems to be quite sure that Otoy's account is blocked and seems to think there is no need to put these checks through again until such time as the bank has been given permission to pay them. I should thank you to instruct me what to advise Toya. Is it possible that checks drawn in payment of labor performed or similar purposes may be paid against blocked accounts?





Dear Sir:

I have written previously concerning my shipment of things placed in Government storage in your Long Beach warehouse (Floor 2, Spot H, Aisle 3) at the time of my evacuation on April 3. You assured me in your answer that I would receive these things as soon as I reached my relocation center.

I have been here at my relocation center for over a week and have seen no indication that I would receive these things in the very near future. It is getting extremely cold in this climate and my family is in desperate need of our winter clothing which is all in storage. I am especially concerned over the welfare of my 1½ months old son who has all his clothing in storage. I am quite sure there are many others in this camp and other relocation camps who are suffering from the same predicament.

I am trusting on the efficient and decent treatment of your office to give me and my other fellow evacuees your prompt attention concerning this serious problem.

Therefore, this is to notify you that you are discharged from this date, and are requested to immediately remove your personal effects from the ranch.

As soon as you present to the undersigned for Mrs. Haden a complete account of monies advanced by you for Mrs. Haden, with the proper receipts attached thereto, Mrs. Haden will pay your salary up to date, and in addition thereto, pay any money that you have expended legitimately for her.

If you are not out of the main dwelling house on or before May 1, 1942, action will be commenced forthwith to eject you therefrom. Your attention is called to the fact that litigation is costly and any expenses that Mrs. Haden incurs in reference to attorney's fees, and court costs, will be deducted from any amount that she owes you. I therefore suggest that you pay serious attention to this letter and the requests contained therein.

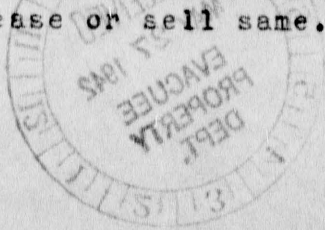

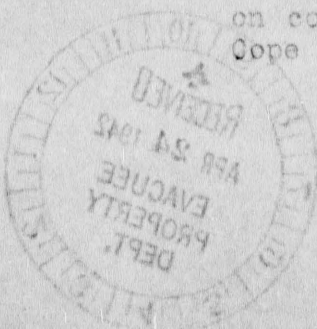

SUBJECT: Inquiry as to storage of restaurant fixtures.


Our Portland Branch has been in communication with us on several occasions regarding a problem with respect to the restaurant equipment of Tom Toyota and his son, Frank, now resident at the Wartime Civil Control Administration Assembly Center, Portland, Oregon; the restaurant being formerly known as "Charles Good Eats Restaurant", located at 25 N. W. 3rd Avenue, Portland.

We were advised that the property consists of removable counter and stools, a limited number of booths, an oil burning range, china and other cooking and eating utensils. It is located approximately six or eight blocks from the warehouse where the goods of other evacuees are stored in that city.

We understand that the evacuees gave a power of attorney to a local individual to dispose of their business and fixtures prior to evacuation, but that no sale has been accomplished. We are asked to submit to you the request of the evacuees that they now be permitted to store the equipment in the Portland warehouse.

While we are locally not informed of all of the facts, our Portland Branch indicates that it believes the request may be justified under the existing circumstances.

During and following an interview with the Japanese evacuee owner of the restaurant referred to in our previous letter, facts were brought out which make it advisable that permission be obtained from the War Relocation Authority to store the furniture and fixtures thereof. The furnishings are owned by one Tom Toyota and his son Frank, who are now held at the WCCA Assembly Center, North Portland, Oregon. The restaurant, formerly known as Charlies Good Eats Restaurant, is located at 25 N. W. 3rd Avenue, Portland, Oregon.

The contents consist of a removable counter and stools; a limited number of booths; one good-sized oil burning range; china; and other cooking and eating utensils. Loose and breakable articles would, of course, have to be prepared for storage, and the entire contents drayed to the warehouse - a distance of approximately six or eight blocks.

It is quite probable that the owner will be relocated on or about September 5th, and if possible, ~~they~~ desire to have this entire matter settled before leaving for new location.


Subsequent to the telephone conversation held with your father at the Mayflower Hotel in San Francisco last week, our representative at Tanforan Assembly Center contacted Mr. George Tsukagawa, advising him that we expected shortly to hear from you and requesting that he give us, if possible, some specific program to present to you.

Our representative now advises us that Mr. Tsukagawa will pay \$100 a year dating back to January 31, 1942, for two acres only of the area previously leased from you, leaving the remainder of the area available for you to lease to others. In consideration of the \$100 annual payment you would convey by deed to the evacuee, the improvements now on the property which, in your letter of August 10, 1942, you cite as of small value.

We are of course, not conversant with the nature or size of the property involved and are submitting this proposal from Mr. Tsukagawa in the hope that it may furnish a satisfactory basis for settlement of this problem.

We would appreciate a prompt reply, inasmuch as it is quite possible that evacuees now at Tanforan Assembly Center will be moved to more distant war relocation centers in the near future.

After reviewing the file on the above subject, including letter received from Mr. F. D. Monckton dated August 6, 1942, the undersigned contacted Mr. Monckton this morning by telephone (Mayflower Hotel, ORdway 7010). The substance of the conversation was as follows:

Mr. Monckton and his son S. Y. Monckton, have received no letter from Mr. Tsukagawa with reference to the removal of house and equipment now located on certain leased property at the corner of Alameda de la Pulgas and Woodside Road, Redwood City, California.

Whether approval would be given or not would rest largely upon the decision of his son whom he was visiting over this week end, leaving for Knights Landing this morning.

The improvements apparently are not of any great value but are attached to the ground and, as Mr. Monckton states, are, as a result, the property of the landowner. He confirms the statement that the Japanese tenant has been operating under a year to year lease covering a past period of approximately ten years. He indicated that the rental had been paid for the past full year period ending January 31, 1942, but was in doubt as to whether any rental has since been received.

Reference was made by him to the point that the payment of the rental for the present year period ending January 31, 1943 might have some bearing on whether permission would be given to remove the improvements.

Inasmuch as Mr. Monckton stated that they had received no communication relative to a request for removal from Tsukagawa, a second contact with the last named might be made by Mr. Weinstock on his next visit to Tanforan, exploring at the same time with the evacuee what action, if any, he intends to take regarding this year's lease rental payment, and also a more detailed description of the property which he desires to remove; also, to what extent, if any, the tenant will place the property in clean, operating condition, which Mr. Monckton inferred they would have a right to have done if they were to voluntarily approve the removal of any improvements or equipment now on the property.

Mr. F. D. Monckton, with whom the undersigned conferred by telephone, is an elderly gentleman and apparently not actively in charge of matters of this kind.

We will have a further communication from Mr. Monckton either by letter or telephone prior to the end of next week. In the interval Mr. Weinstock should be able to place on our files a clear picture of the evacuee's position, what property he wishes to remove and what consideration, if any, he will give in return.


He wishes to remove the house and equipment stored therein to other property owned by him in Mountain View, California. He further relates that an effort has been made to contact you by mail which remains unanswered.



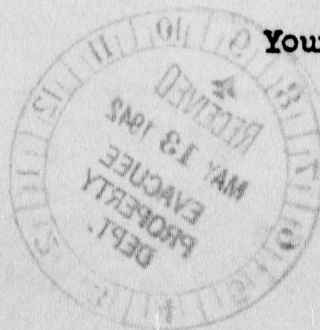

Dear General:

I have spoken to Mr. Wing and Mr. Gorman regarding an evacuation problem which I have, and they in turn have referred me to you.

As I am an optometrist I have a record on card file for all of my customers, whom are practically all Japanese. I have made arrangements with my local wholesalers to do my work, but must have my file in order to send them the prescriptions for the necessary glasses. My problem is, what is the best way to take these files? In case our luggage is limited, it would be more than what I could take, and therefore, would like a special paper allowing me to take the files.

Also, I have had all my optical equipment crated and is ready for storage, but would like to have your advice as to whether it would be better to store these in the government warehouse, which is not ready yet, or to have it stored in a private storage concern.

If I do have it stored in a government storage place, will the equipment be insured? If the government will not insure it, will it be possible for me to insure it myself?

We would appreciate your prompt reply on the above matter.

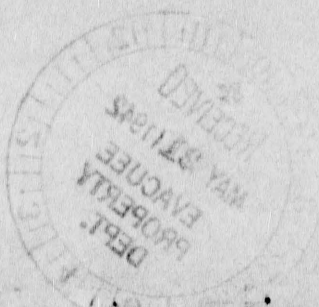

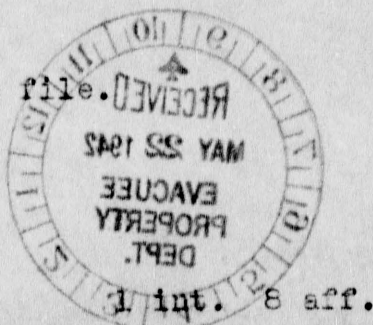



Dear Sir:

We are this date in receipt of your letter of June 8, making inquiry in the above matter for Jimmie Tsutsui, now at Tulare Assembly Center. It is regretted that he did not fully understand all details, and we shall endeavor here to explain both cases against Mr. Matsumoto.

Mr. Matsumoto is NOT held by the U. S. Immigration Department, but is a prisoner of the U. S. Marshal. The charge upon which he is serving is "VIOLATION OF THE ALIEN REGISTRATION ACT OF 1940", which as you know provided for the registration of everyone in the United States not a citizen, regardless of his legality in the United States. On Feb. 6, 1942, the Marshal arrested him; on Feb. 23, 1942 he pleaded guilty to the charge and on March 9 was sentenced by Judge Holtzer of the U. S. District Court to serve six months in a County Jail, and was taken to Ventura County jail for serving such sentence. When his term there expires, he will be taken to join his family. For further particulars refer to U.S.DISTRICT COURT CASE 15233, Los Angeles.

The above described violation has nothing whatever to do with the Immigration case in which bond in the sum of \$2000 was filed by Northwest Casualty Co. on Sept. 6, 1941, which bond is now in full force and effect. (This may be verified by writing to Mr. Bruce Barber, District Law Officer, Immigration & Naturalization Service, Los Angeles.) The following is an outline of the Immigration matter having to do with deportation to Japan of Yoneji Matsumoto.

On or about Sept. 4, 1941, Mr. Matsumoto was arrested at Santa Maria, by the U. S. Immigration Officials, upon warrant of arrest issued by the U.S. Attorney General at Washington, charging him with being illegally within the United States and subject to deportation. He was then taken to the San Pedro Immigration Station and held pending the filing with the Immigration Department of a bond (form 553) in the sum of \$2000, which bond was filed on Sept. 6, 1941 by the Northwest Casualty Company. This bond gave Mr. Matsumoto his liberty (insofar as the Immigration Department is concerned) until the matter of his deportation is decided in Washington, D. C., and thereafter until deportation to Japan is effected by our Government, if he is found to be illegally in the United States. Of course, if he is found by that Bureau to be legally here, his case will be dismissed and his bond cancelled. Such a proceeding usually takes from 10 months to one year.

When war was declared we immediately contacted the Los Angeles Immigration officials and inquired as to what action our Government would take in regard to the aliens under bond in deportation matters. We were advised that insofar as was then known, they would be permitted to remain at liberty under the bonds until their cases have been decided in Washington, and until deportation is again possible. This same condition prevails regardless of the fact that aliens and guarantors alike have been

effected financially by evacuation. Furthermore, a number of the aliens for whom we furnished Immigration bonds (form 553) prior to the war have been taken into custody by the F.B.I. and are now held in concentration camps in other States. We are advised by Immigration Officials that these bonds will not be terminated at this time; that after F.B.I. investigations and hearings are completed if the aliens are released they will be returned to their families in Assembly Centers or unrestricted areas where they may work and that the bonds filed in deportation proceedings will not be terminated until deportation is made, or until some future order is given by Washington. That if after such investigation by the FBI they are held for the duration in concentration camps as "Enemy Aliens" then we should refer the matter of cancellation of the deportation bond to the Attorney General in Washington.

For your further information, if an alien is arrested on any charge (City, County, State or Federal) while deportation proceedings are pending against him, he must dispose of all such cases prior to his deportation from the United States, even though his deportation has been ordered by the proper officials.

When Mr. Matsumoto has served his present sentence, he will be joined with his family, and since the Assembly Centers are temporary, will probably be assigned to other areas for work, or will be free to accept employment in unrestricted territory. The bond upon which Mr. Tsutsui is a guarantor will remain valid until, as stated above, Mr. Matsumoto is either found to be legally within the United States - or until he is deported to Japan - or until some other order is issued in his case by the Immigration Department. It is the opinion of those in authority that this bond will be in full force and effect for the duration of the war, and thereafter until commercial sailings are resumed, excepting in the event of the demise of this alien.

As to payment of bond charges, at the time of issuance of the bond Sept. 6, 1941, the charges were paid to Sept. 6, 1942. In March of 1942 an employee of the Northwest Casualty Company stated to us that Mr. Tsutsui had stated to him that he desired to make an advance deposit on this bond due to evacuation, etc. in order that there would be no question on the part of the surety as to his responsibility as a guarantor. We then wrote to Mr. Tsutsui advising him that if he cared to make such deposit to send it to us, since we were the agent handling this immigration matter, and from that letter we quote: "We expect to hold any such payments in a trust fund until they become due, and if the bond should be terminated prior to the renewal date as stated herein, then of course the full amount will be returned to you". Thereafter Mr. Tsutsui forwarded to us the bond charges covering the period from Sept. 6, 1942 to Sept. 6, 1943. The receipt which we sent to him stated that it was an advance payment and is returnable in full if the bond is terminated prior to the renewal date covered by the initial payment.

Some of the Japanese people seem to be confused and to think that if they are taken to an assembly center they are in the custody of the Immigration Officials, and also that if they are serving a sentence on any other charge that the Immigration bond is cancelled.

We trust that this is the information you desire, and that Mr. Tsutsui will have a clear understanding also. We have written him numerous letters in our effort to ascertain the whereabouts of bonded aliens, and he has been most helpful and cooperative.

Bond form 553 is herewith enclosed, and if you desire further information relative to the practice of the U.S. Immigration Service in deportation matters, you may consult any Official of that Service in your vicinity.

BOND CONDITIONED FOR THE DELIVERY OF AN ALIEN

THE FOLLOWING RULES MUST BE PARTICULARLY OBSERVED AND COMPLIED WITH:

1. This bond should be made and executed in duplicate.
2. The full name and the residence of each party to the bond should be stated in the body of the instrument, and the signatures, which should conform thereto, should be witnessed by two other persons, who should sign their names as witnesses and state their places of residence.
3. A wax or wafer seal must be affixed to the signature of each party to the bond.
4. A married woman will not be accepted on the bond.
5. All erasures and interlineations must be noted, word for word, immediately above the signatures of the witnesses, as having been made before execution of the bond. The general statement that "erasures and interlineations were made before execution" is insufficient.
6. The sureties on the bond must justify in double the amount of the bond in the form for that purpose accompanying the bond.
7. The affidavits of the sureties on the bond must be taken and subscribed before an officer authorized to administer oaths generally, who must certify that he administered the oath, and affix his official seal. In case such officer is not provided with a seal, his authority to administer oaths and his official character must be duly certified.
8. A commissioner of immigration or an immigration officer in charge must certify that the sureties on the bond are good and sufficient and fully responsible to insure the payment of the entire amount of the bond. Dear Sir:

We are this date in receipt of your letter of June 8, making inquiry in the above matter for Jimmie Tsutsui, now at Tulare Assembly Center. It is regretted that he did not fully understand all details, and we shall endeavor here to explain both cases against Mr. Matsumoto.

Mr. Matsumoto is NOT held by the U. S. Immigration Department, but is a prisoner of the U. S. Marshal. The charge upon which he is serving is "VIOLATION OF THE ALIEN REGISTRATION ACT OF 1940", which as you know provided for the registration of everyone in the United States not a citizen, regardless of his legality in the United States. On Feb. 6, 1942, the Marshal arrested him; on Feb. 28, 1942 he pleaded guilty to the charge and on March 9 was sentenced by Judge Holtzer of the U. S. District Court to serve six months in a County Jail, and was taken to Ventura County jail for serving such sentence. When his term there expires, he will be taken to join his family. For further particulars refer to U.S. DISTRICT COURT CASE 15233, Los Angeles.

The above described violation has nothing whatever to do with the Immigration case in which bond in the sum of \$2000 was filed by Northwest Casualty Co. on Sept. 6, 1941, which bond is now in full force and effect. (This may be verified by writing to Mr. Bruce Barber, District Law Officer, Immigration & Naturalization Service, Los Angeles.) The following is an outline of the Immigration matter having to do with deportation to Japan of Yoneji Matsumoto.

On or about Sept. 4, 1941, Mr. Matsumoto was arrested at Santa Maria, by the U. S. Immigration Officials, upon warrant of arrest issued by the U.S. Attorney General at Washington, charging him with being illegally within the United States and subject to deportation. He was then taken to the San Pedro Immigration Station and held pending the filing with the Immigration Department of a bond (form 553) in the sum of \$2000, which bond was filed on Sept. 6, 1941 by the Northwest Casualty Company. This bond gave Mr. Matsumoto his liberty (insofar as the Immigration Department is concerned) until the matter of his deportation is decided in Washington, D. C., and thereafter until deportation to Japan is effected by our Government, if he is found to be illegally in the United States. Of course, if he is found by that Bureau to be legally here, his case will be dismissed and his bond cancelled. Such a proceeding usually takes from 10 months to one year.

When war was declared we immediately contacted the Los Angeles Immigration officials and inquired as to what action our Government would take in regard to the aliens under bond in deportation matters. We were advised that insofar as was then known, they would be permitted to remain at liberty under the bonds until their cases have been decided in Washington, and until deportation is again possible. This same condition prevails regardless of the fact that aliens and guarantors alike have been

effected financially by evacuation. Furthermore, a number of the aliens for whom we furnished Immigration bonds (form 553) prior to the war have been taken into custody by the F.B.I. and are now held in concentration camps in other States. We are advised by Immigration Officials that these bonds will not be terminated at this time; that after F.B.I. investigations and hearings are completed if the aliens are released they will be returned to their families in Assembly Centers or unrestricted areas where they may work and that the bonds filed in deportation proceedings will not be terminated until deportation is made, or until some future order is given by Washington. That if after such investigation by the FBI they are held for the duration in concentration camps as "Enemy Aliens" then we should refer the matter of cancellation of the deportation bond to the Attorney General in Washington.

For your further information, if an alien is arrested on any charge (City, County, State or Federal) while deportation proceedings are pending against him, he must dispose of all such cases prior to his deportation from the United States, even though his deportation has been ordered by the proper officials.

When Mr. Matsumoto has served his present sentence, he will be joined with his family, and since the Assembly Centers are temporary, will probably be assigned to other areas for work, or will be free to accept employment in unrestricted territory. The bond upon which Mr. Tsutsui is a guarantor will remain valid until, as stated above, Mr. Matsumoto is either found to be legally within the United States - or until he is deported to Japan - or until some other order is issued in his case by the Immigration Department. It is the opinion of those in authority that this bond will be in full force and effect for the duration of the war, and thereafter until commercial sailings are resumed, excepting in the event of the demise of this alien.

As to payment of bond charges, at the time of issuance of the bond Sept. 6, 1941, the charges were paid to Sept. 6, 1942. In March of 1942 an employee of the Northwest Casualty Company stated to us that Mr. Tsutsui had stated to him that he desired to make an advance deposit on this bond due to evacuation, etc. in order that there would be no question on the part of the surety as to his responsibility as a guarantor. We then wrote to Mr. Tsutsui advising him that if he cared to make such deposit to send it to us, since we were the agent handling this immigration matter, and from that letter we quote: "We expect to hold any such payments in a trust fund until they become due, and if the bond should be terminated prior to the renewal date as stated herein, then of course the full amount will be returned to you". Thereafter Mr. Tsutsui forwarded to us the bond charges covering the period from Sept. 6, 1942 to Sept. 6, 1943. The receipt which we sent to him stated that it was an advance payment and is returnable in full if the bond is terminated prior to the renewal date covered by the initial payment.

Some of the Japanese people seem to be confused and to think that if they are taken to an assembly center they are in the custody of the Immigration Officials, and also that if they are serving a sentence on any other charge that the Immigration bond is cancelled.

We trust that this is the information you desire, and that Mr. Tsutsui will have a clear understanding also. We have written him numerous letters in our effort to ascertain the whereabouts of bonded aliens, and he has been most helpful and cooperative.

Bond form 553 is herewith enclosed, and if you desire further information relative to the practice of the U.S. Immigration Service in deportation matters, you may consult any Official of that Service in your vicinity.


Dear Sirs:

Reference is made to your inquiry as to the procedure to be followed in effecting sale of the Chevrolet sedan in which the above named evacuee has an interest.

The vehicle appears to be a 1942 automobile and therefore subject to the control of the Office of Price Administration, but otherwise would not be the subject of restrictions against sale. So far as this bank is concerned evacuees are in position to dispose of their property as they see fit, subject of course to the restrictions of Foreign Funds Control regulations of the Treasury Department, so that it would be in order to complete the transaction you mention if acceptable to the evacuee.

We presume that Mrs. Tsutsui is a generally licensed national and entitled to the benefits of General License 68A, a copy of which is enclosed for your information, so that Foreign Funds Control restrictions would not be involved. On the other hand, should it become necessary to obtain a license to effect the sale, we will be pleased to give consideration to any application which may be filed in that connection.

Dear Sirs:

Since the outbreak of war the writer has been occupied exclusively with the affairs of clients of this office, first in the matter of the various Treasury regulations as affecting alien Japanese and with the filing of reports on form TFR-300 Series J, and more recently with the problems of evacuation.

It has heretofore been impossible for me to consider my own problems, but with the nearness of evacuation orders which will affect this area I am impelled to write to you for advice and counsel on my own business and family affairs.

I have been a member of the State Bar and of the local Bar for the past 14 years maintaining an independent law office. During this period I have been fortunate in building up an excellent practise and I believe a conservative estimate of my active clientele numbers more than 2000 persons, 90% of whom are of the Japanese race.

I have a very valuable library and my office equipment is, I believe, among the finer libraries of this city. My present plan is to allow a colleague and friend, Mr. C.E. O'Neill, to remove my equipment and files to his office and allow him the use of the same for the duration. My only problem in this connection is the proper disposal of 3 Frigidaire air conditioners which have cost me about \$1,000.00. If the Government can use them I would be willing to sell them for one-half or rent them for a reasonable sum.

My family consists of my wife, Tomoyo, and the following 5 children, all of whom are American citizens; Richard, age 11; Howard, age 9; Doris, age 8; David, age 6; and Diane, age 4.

My wife is a graduate of the University of California, having received her B.S. degree in 1928. I obtained

my college education at the same University and received my law degree in May, 1929. I graduated from the School of Jurisprudence (Boalt Hall) on the Berkeley campus. In 1927 I was commissioned a Second Lieutenant of Infantry, USA Reserves.

I have been a Reserve Officer of the U. S. Army for the past 16 years and at present hold a Captain's commission in the Judge Advocate General's Department, and subject to extended active duty orders. On December 16, 1941 I waived all claim for deferment from active duty by reason of dependency and on February 9, 1942 was ordered to McClellan Field for final type physical examination. I am advised that my physical condition is excellent. In this connection, however, I wish to point out that by reason of the fact that I am of the Japanese race and because of impending evacuation orders, I may be deferred by the War Department until my family is permanently relocated.

In view of my civilian and other qualifications it would be deeply appreciated if you can advise me whether it will be possible for me to obtain placement as an Administrative officer or employee at either the Assembly or Reception centers. My personal preference in this regard would be an assignment which will keep me with the evacuated people of Sacramento.


