Civilian Exclusion Order No. 22

1. Pursuant to the provisions of Public Proclamations Nos. 1 and 2, this Headquarters, dated March 2, 1942, and March 16, 1942, respectively, it is hereby ordered that from and after 12 o'clock noon, P.W.T., of Friday, May 1, 1942, all persons of Japanese ancestry, both alien and non-alien, be excluded from that portion of Military Area No. 1 described as follows:

All that portion of the City of Los Angeles, State of California, within the boundary beginning at the intersection of Pico Boulevard and Arlington Avenue; thence easterly on Pico Boulevard to Vermont Avenue; thence southerly on Vermont Avenue to Washington Boulevard; thence easterly on Washington Boulevard to Main Street; thence southerly on Main Street to Adams Boulevard; thence easterly on Adams Boulevard to Central Avenue; thence southerly on Central Avenue to Slauson Avenue; thence westerly on Vermont Avenue to Vermont Avenue; thence northerly on Vermont Avenue to Jefferson Boulevard; thence westerly on Jefferson Boulevard to Arlington Avenue; thence northerly on Arlington Avenue to the point of beginning.


2. A responsible member of each family, and each individual living alone, in the above described area will report between the hours of 8:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M., Saturday, April 25, 1942, or during the same hours on Sunday, April 26, 1942, to the Civil Control Station located at:

2314 South Vermont Avenue, Los Angeles, California.

3. Any person subject to this order who fails to comply with any of its provisions or with the provisions of published instructions pertaining hereto or who is found in the above area after 12 o'clock noon, P.W.T., of Friday, May 1, 1942, will be liable to the criminal penalties provided by Public Law No. 503, 77th Congress, approved March 21, 1942, entitled "An Act to Provide a Penalty for Violation of Restrictions or Orders with Respect to Persons Entering, Remaining in, Leaving, or Committing any Act in Military Areas or Zones," and alien Japanese will be subject to immediate apprehension and internment.

TO ALL PERSONS OF JAPANESE ANCESTRY

LIVING IN THE FOLLOWING AREA:

All that portion of the City of Los Angeles, State of California, within the boundary beginning at the intersection of Pico Boulevard and Arlington Avenue; thence easterly on Pico Boulevard to Vermont Avenue; thence southerly on Vermont Avenue to Washington Boulevard; thence easterly on Washington Boulevard to Main Street; thence southerly on Main Street to Adams Boulevard; thence easterly en Adams Boulevard to Central Avenue; thence southerly on Central Avenue to Slauson Avenue; thence westerly on Slauson Avenue to Vermont Avenue; thence northerly on Vermont Avenue to Jefferson Boulevard; thence westerly on Jefferson Boulevard to Arlington Avenue; thence northerly on Arlington Avenue to the point of beginning.

Pursuant to the provisions of Civilian Exclusion Order No. 22, this Headquarters, dated April 24, 1942, all persons of Japanese ancestry, both alien and non-alien, will be evacuated from the above area by 12 o'clock noon, P.W.T., Friday, May 1, 1942.

No Japanese person living in the above area will be permitted to change residence after 12 o'clock noon, P.W.T., Friday, April 24, 1942, without obtaining special permission from the representative of the Commanding General, Southern California Sector, at the Civil Control Station located at:

2314 South Vermont Avenue, Los Angeles, California.

Such permits will only be granted for the purpose of uniting members of a family, or in cases of grave emergency.

The Civil Control Station is equipped to assist the Japanese population affected by this evacuation in the following ways:

- 1. Give advice and instructions on the evacuation.
- 2. Provide services with respect to the management, leasing, sale, storage or other disposition of most kinds of property, such as real estate, business and professional equipment, household goods, boats, automobiles and livestock.

- 3. Provide temporary residence elsewhere for all Japanese in, family groups.
- 4. Transport persons and a limited amount of clothing and equipment to their new residence.

THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS MUST BE OBSERVED:

- 1. A responsible member of each family, preferably the head of the family, or the person in whose name most of the property is held, and each individual living alone, will report to the Civil Control Station to receive further instructions. This must be done between 8:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M. on Saturday, April 25, 1942, or between 8:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M. on Sunday, April 26, 1942.
- 2. Evacuees must carry with them on departure for the Assembly Center, the following property:
 - (a) Bedding and linens (no mattress) for each member of the family;
 - (b) Toilet articles for each member of the family;
 - (c) Extra clothing for each member of the family;
 - (d) Sufficient knives, forks, spoons, plates, bowls and cups for each member of the family;
 - (e) Essential personal effects for each member of the family.

All items carried will be securely packaged, tied and plainly marked with the name of the owner and numbered in accordance with instructions obtained at the Civil Control Station. The size and number of packages is limited to that which can be carried by the individual or family group.

- 3. No pets of any kind will be permitted.
- 4. The United States Government through its agencies will provide for the storage at the sole risk of the owner of the more substantial household items, such as iceboxes, washing machines, pianos and other heavy furniture. Cooking utensils and other small items will be accepted for storage if crated, packed and plainly marked with the name and address of the owner. Only one name and address will be used by a given family.
- 5. Each family, and individual living alone, will be furnished transportation to the Assembly Center or will be authorized to travel by private automobile in a supervised group. All instructions pertaining to the movement will be obtained at the Civil Control Station.
- Go to the Civil Control Station between the hours of 8:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M., Saturday, April 25, 1942, or between the hours of 8:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M., Sunday, April 26, 1942, to receive further instructions.

MEMORANDUM: Proposed Evacuation Operation

1. It is planned to evacuate to the Santa Anita Assembly Center, during the period April 24 -- May 1, 1942, all persons of Japanese ancestry, both alien and non-alien, who reside within that portion of Military Area No. 1 described as follows:

All that portion of the City of Los Angeles,
State of California, within the boundary
beginning at the intersection of Pico
Boulevard and Arlington Avenue; thence
easterly on Pico Boulevard to Vermont Avenue;
thence southerly on Vermont Avenue to Washington Boulevard; thence easterly on Washington
Boulevard to Main Street; thence southerly on
Main Street to Adams Boulevard; thence easterly
on Adams Boulevard to Central Avenue; thence
southerly on Central Avenue to Slauson Avenue;
thence westerly on Slauson Avenue to Vermont
Avenue; thence northerly on Vermont Avenue

to Jefferson Boulevard; thence westerly on Jefferson Boulevard to Arlington Avenue; thence northerly on Arlington Avenue to the point of beginning. 2. Approximately 900 persons involved in this evacation, will be transported in accordance with the following tentative schedule: Thursday, April 30, 1942 -- 450 Friday, May 1, 1942 -- 450 3. For the purpose of processing evacuees, the Federal Security Agency will establish, organize, and operate a Civil Control Station in the above area located at: 2314 South Vermont Avenue, Los Angeles, California 4. The Federal Security Agency is authorized to deal directly with the Office of Emergency Management and other Federal agencies as may be needed in the establishment and operation of this station, and the civil agencies serving same will, in addition to their prescribed functions, be prepared to assist the Commanding General, Southern California Sector in his general supervision over evacuation in that sector. 5. Civilian Exclusion Order No. 22, this Headquarters, with accompanying instructions, will provide for the evacuation. A responsible member of each family and each individual living - 2 -

alone affected by the order, will be directed to report to the Civil Control Station for processing between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. on Saturday, April 25, 1942, or between the same hours on Sunday, April 26, 1942. The order will direct that all persons of Japanese ancestry, both alien and non-alien, affected by such order, will be excluded from Military Area No. 1 from and after 12 o'clock noon, P.W.T., Friday, May 1, 1942.

6. Medical examinations will be conducted at the Santa

- 6. Medical examinations will be conducted at the Santa Anita Assembly Center after arrival of evacuees. Medical aid for and during the processing, and for and during travel, will be provided by the Federal Security Agency. A physician will be available at the Civil Control Station during the period of registration and processing to attend invalid and other exceptional cases.
- 7. Under this project, evacuees will be permitted to use their private automobiles in supervised groups, as transportation to the Santa Anita Assembly Center. All such private automobiles will first have been registered with the representatives of the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco at the Civil Control Station. Provisions will be made by the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco for the disposition of these automobiles upon arrival at the Santa Anita Assembly Center, where such automobiles will be immobilized. For those evacuees without

their own means of transportation, movement by rail or bus will be provided by Headquarters, Western Defense Command and Fourth Army. 8. Distribution of this memorandum is made to the Department of Justice (Mr. Tom C. Clark). It is requested that he notify as promptly as practicable all Federal Bureau of Investigation Special Agents in Charge, with the request that he in turn ask that they notify the appropriate state and local police. 

No Japanese person living in the above area will be permitted to change residence after 12 o'clock noon, P.W.T., Tuesday, April 28, 1942, without obtaining special permission from the representative of the Commanding General, Northwestern Sector, at the Civil Control Station located at:

Such permits will only be granted for the purpose of uniting members of a family, or in cases of grave emergency.

The Civil Control Station is equipped to assist the Japanese population affected by this evacuation in the following ways:

- 1. Give advice and instructions on the evacuation.
- 2. Provide services with respect to the management, leasing, sale, storage or other disposition of most kinds of property, such as real estate, business and professional equipment, household goods, boats, automobiles and livestock.
- 3. Provide temporary residence elsewhere for all Japanese in family groups.
- 4. Transport persons and a limited amount of clothing and equipment to their new residence.

THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS MUST BE OBSERVED:

- 1. A responsible member of each family, preferably the head of the family, or the person in whose name most of the property is held, and each individual living alone, will report to the Civil Control Station to receive further instructions. This must be done between 8:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M. on Wednesday, April 29, 1942, or between 8:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M. on Thursday, April 30, 1942.
- 2. Evacuees must carry with them on departure for the Assembly Center, the following property:
 - (a) Bedding and linens (no mattress) for each member of the family:
 - (b) Toilet articles for each member of the family;
 - (c) Extra clothing for each member of the family:
 - (d) Sufficient knives, forks, spoons, plates, bowls and cups for each member of the family;
 - (e) Essential personal effects for each member of the family.

1. It is planned to evacuate to the Portland Assembly Center, during the period April 28 -- May 5, 1942, all persons of Japanese ancestry, both alien and non-alien, who reside within that portion of Military Area No. 1 described as follows:

All of that portion of the County of Multnomah, State of Oregon, bounded on the north by the Oregon-Washington State line, bounded on the east by 122nd Avenue, and 122nd Avenue extended southerly to the Multnomah-Clackamas County line, bounded on the south by the Multnomah-Clackamas County line, and bounded on the west by the Willamette River.

2. Approximately 950 persons involved in this evacuation, will be transported in accordance with the following tentative schedule:

Saturday, May 2, 1942 -- 250 Monday, May 4, 1942 -- 350 Tuesday, May 5, 1942 -- 350

3. For the purpose of processing evacuees, the Federal Security
Agency will establish, organize, and operate a Civil Control Station in the
above area located at:

The Navy Post American Legion Hall 128 Northeast Russell Street Portland, Oregon

4. The Federal Security Agency is authorized to deal directly with the Office of Emergency Management and other Federal agencies as may be

needed in the establishment and operation of this station, and the civil agencies serving same will, in addition to their prescribed functions, be prepared to assist the Commanding General, Morthwestern Sector, in his general supervision over evacuation in that sector.

- 5. Civilian Exclusion Order No. 26, this Headquarters, with accompanying instructions, will provide for the evacuation. A responsible member of each family and each individual living alone affected by the order, will be directed to report to the Civil Control Station for processing between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. on Wednesday, April 29, 1942, or between the same hours on Thursday, April 30, 1942. The order will direct that all persons of Japanese ancestry, both alien and non-alien, affected by such order, will be excluded from Military Area No. 1 from and after 12 O'clock noon, P.W.T., Tuesday, May 5, 1942.
- 6. Medical examinations will be conducted at the Portland Assembly Center after arrival of evacuees. Medical aid for and during the processing, and for and during travel, will be provided by the Federal Security Agency. A physician will be available at the Civil Control Station during the period of registration and processing to attend invalid and other exceptional cases.
- 7. Under this project, evacuoes will be permitted to use their private automobiles in supervised groups, as transportation to the Portland Assembly Center. All such private automobiles will first have been registered with the representatives of the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco at the Civil Control Station. Provisions will be made by the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco for the disposition of these automobiles upon arrival

at the Portland Assembly Center, where such automobiles will be immobilized. For those evacuees without their own means of transportation, movement by rail or bus will be provided by Headquarters, Western Defense Command and Fourth Army.

8. Distribution of this memorandum is made to the Department of Justice (Mr. Tom C. Clark). In addition, this memorandum is distributed to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (Mr. Nat L. Pieper). It is requested that he notify as promptly as practicable all Federal Bureau of Investigation Special Agents in Charge, with the request that he in turn ask that they notify the appropriate state and local police.

In the absence of Mr. Symms who is on vacation, the following information is offered in answer to the inquiries emumerated in your letter dated July 6, 1951, concerning the claim of Etsuji Inada:

Our files do not disclose any record of an interview with Etsuji Inada.

- 1) Government storage facilities were available to evacuees from May 1 through May 7, 1942, through Civil Control Stations at 530-18th Street and 1117 Oak Street, Oakland, California. The storage facilities for both locations were located at 320 Tenth Street, Oakland, California.
- 2) The Federal Reserve Bank had five representatives at each of the above control station locations for the purpose of advising evacuees of the availability of storage facilities and to assist them in other matters. These representatives were on duty full time during the period May 1 to May 7, 1942.
- 3) Evacuees reporting at both locations were not required to consult with representatives, as this action was left to the individual discretion of the evacuee.
- 4) At each control station, evacuees were handed forms which outlined the facilities that were available. However, prior to May 1, 1942 the widest publicity possible was given to the aspects of the evacuation program relating to the treatment of properties of evacuees. This was accomplished by direct contact with banking groups, trade, credit, and other associations and business organizations. Particular emphasis was given to Japanese organizations such as church, social, and other groups, including the Japanese American Citizens League. Contact with the latter organization was particularly important as all of the important steps of the program were continuously brought to the attention of the evacuees through their publication which had wide circulation among the Japanese.

Claim of Etsuji Inada

This office is engaged in processing the evacuation claim (P.L. 886, 80th Congress) of a Japanese who was evacuated from Oakland, California, on or about May 6, 1942, apparently under Civilian Exclusion Order No. 27.

The instructions issued at the time said exclusion order was promulgated required the claimant to appear either on May 1 or May 2, for registration at a "Civil Control Station" located at 530 Eighteenth Street, Oakland.

Detailed answers to the following questions will be appreciated:

- 1) Was a Government storage facility actually available to claimant in Oakland during the period from April 30, 1942, to May 6, 1942? If so, where was it located?
- 2) If Government storage was so available, did the Federal Reserve Bank have agents at said civil control station in Oakland for the purpose of advising evacuees of this fact and how to obtain such storage? If so, how many such agents were on duty during each of said registration days? Were they present on a part-time or full-time basis? If for only part of the time, how many agents were present, on an average, at any given time?
- 3) If such agents were available, were evacuees reporting at said control station required to consult said agents for the purpose of discussing their property problems as a matter of routine or was such action left to individual discretion?

- 4) If such action was left to individual discretion, in what manner were storage facilities offered and what, if anything, was done to counteract the natural reluctance of alien Japanese to seek Government aid under the circumstances which then confronted them?
- 5) How many evacuees were registered and processed at said control station during each of said registration days? What percentage of the total number processed at said station requested Government storage? What percentage of those requesting Government storage actually received it?
- 6) How many family units were evacuated from the Oakland area? How many family units stored their property in Government warehouses within said area at the time of their evacuation?

Permit me to thank you in advance for the inconvenience that this request is certain to cause you. However, the issue involved is important and your cooperation will assist us in proposing an adjudication that will be equitable to both the Government and the claimant.

If Mr. Symms is on vacation, I shall be grateful if this request is transferred to anyone else who is in a position to provide the desired information, in order to avoid undue delay.

No Japanese person living in the above area will be permitted to change residence after 12 o'clock noon, P.W.T., Thursday, April 30, 1942, without obtaining special permission from the representative of the Commanding General, Southern California Sector, at the Civil Control Station located at:

7412 South Broadway, Los Angeles, California.

Such permits will only be granted for the purpose of uniting members of a family, or in cases of grave emergency.

The Civil Control Station is equipped to assist the Japanese population affected by this evacuation in the following ways:

- 1. Give advice and instructions on the evacuation.
- 2. Provide services with respect to the management, leasing, sale, storage or other disposition of most kinds of property, such as real estate, business and professional equipment, household goods, boats, automobiles and livestock.

- 3. Provide temporary residence elsewhere for all Japanese in family groups.
- 4. Transport persons and a limited amount of clothing and equipment to their new residence.

THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS MUST BE OBSERVED:

- 1. A responsible member of each family, preferably the head of the family, or the person in whose name most of the property is held, and each individual living alone, will report to the Civil Control Station to receive further instructions. This must be done between 8:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M. on Friday, May 1, 1942, or between 8:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M. on Saturday, May 2, 1942.
- 2. Evacuees must carry with them on departure for the Assembly Center, the following property:
 - (a) Bedding and linens (no mattress) for each member of the family;
 - (b) Toilet articles for each member of the family;

(c) Extra clothing for each member of the family;

- (d) Sufficient knives, forks, spoons, plates, bowls and cups for each member of the family;
- (e) Essential personal effects for each member of the family.

All items carried will be securely packaged, tied and plainly marked with the name of the owner and numbered in accordance with instructions obtained at the Civil Control Station. The size and number of packages is limited to that which can be carried by the individual or family group.

3. No pets of any kind will be permitted.

- 4. No personal items and no household goods will be shipped to the Assembly Center.
- 5. The United States Government through its agencies will provide for the storage at the sole risk of the owner of the more substantial household items, such as iceboxes, washing machines, pianos and other heavy furniture. Cooking utensils and other small items will be accepted for storage if crated, packed and plainly marked with the name and address of the owner. Only one name and address will be used by a given family.
- 6. Each family, and individual living alone, will be furnished transportation to the Assembly Center. Private means of transportation will not be utilized. All instructions pertaining to the movement will be obtained at the Civil Control Station.
- Go to the Civil Control Station between the hours of 8:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M., Friday, May 1, 1942, or between the hours of 8:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M., Saturday, May 2, 1942, to receive further instructions.







- 3. Any person subject to this order who fails to comply with any of its provisions or with the provisions of published instructions pertaining hereto or who is found in the above area after 12 o'clock noon, P.W.T., of Saturday, May 9, 1942, will be liable to the criminal penalties provided by Public Law No. 503, 77th Congress, approved March 21, 1942, entitled "An Act to Provide a Penalty for Violation of Restrictions or Orders with Respect to Persons Entering, Remaining in, Leaving or Committing any Act in Military Areas or Zones," and alien Japanese will be subject to immediate apprehension and internment.
- 4. All persons within the bounds of an established Assembly Center pursuant to instructions from this Headquarters are excepted from the provisions of this order while those persons are in such Assembly Center.



Pursuant to the provisions of Civilian Exclusion Order No. 35, this Headquarters, dated May 3, 1942, all persons of Japanese ancestry, both alien and non-alien, will be evacuated from the above area by 12 o'clock noon, P.W.T., Saturday, May 9, 1942.

No Japanese person living in the above area will be permitted to change residence after 12 o'clock noon, P.W.T., Sunday, May 3, 1942, without obtaining special permission from the representative of the Commanding General, Northern California Sector, at the Civil Control Station located at:

Masonie Temple Building, 100 horth Ellsworth Street, San Mateo, California.

Such permits will only be granted for the purpose of uniting members of a family, or in cases of grave emergency.

The Civil Control Station is equipped to assist the Japanese population affected by this evacuation in the following ways:

- 1. Give advice and instructions on the evacuation. Total od of
- 2. Provide services with respect to the management, leasing, sale, storage or other disposition of most kinds of property, such as real estate, business and professional equipment, household goods, boats, automobiles and livestock.
- 3. Provide temporary residence elsewhere for all Japanese in family groups.
- 4. Transport persons and a limited amount of clothing and equipment to their new residence.

THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS MUST BE OBSERVED:

- 1. A responsible member of each family, preferably the head of the family, or the person in whose name most of the property is held, and each individual living alone, will report to the Civil Control Station to receive further instructions. This must be done between 8:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M. on Monday, May 4, 1942, or between 8:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M. on Tuesday, May 5, 1942.
- Evacuees must carry with them on departure for the Assembly Center, the following property:

(a) Bedding and linens (no mattress) for each member of the family;

(b) Toilet articles for each member of the family;

(c) Extra clothing for each member of the family;

(d) Sufficient knives, forks, spoons, plates, bowls and cups for each member of the family;

(e) Essential personal effects for each member of the family.

All items carried will be securely packaged, tied and plainly marked with the name of the owner and numbered in accordance with instructions obtained at the Civil Control Station. The size and number of packages is limited to that which can be carried by the individual or family group.

3. No pets of any kind will be permitted.

- 4. No personal items and no household goods will be shipped to the Assembly Center.
- 5. The United States Government through its agencies will provide for the storage at the sole risk of the owner of the more substantial household items, such as iceboxes, washing machines, pianos and other heavy furniture. Cooking utensils and other small items will be accepted for storage if crated, packed and plainly marked with the name and address of the owner. Only one name and address will be used by a given family.
- 6. Each family, and individual living alone, will be furnished transportation to the Assembly Center or will be authorized to travel by private automobile in a supervised group. All instructions pertaining to the movement will be obtained at the Civil Control Station.







According to Census figures approximately 300 Japanese reside in Phoenix, 50 in Tucson, and approximately 50 more throughout the remainder of the Area. The various agencies should adjust their staffs accordingly.

Mr. Arneson informed me that the Control Station in Phoenix has been established. He was interested in finding out what arrangements would be made with the other agencies for the Tucson station and I informed him that we would attempt to make the arrangements here.

SUBJECT: Proposed Japanese Evacuation Operation

TO: All Civilian Agencies, Wartime Civil Control Administration

1. It is proposed to evacuate all persons of Japanese ancestry, both alien and non-alien, who reside within the following area:

All of that portion of the State of Arizona lying generally south of a line running in an easterly direction, and commencing at the southerly line of U.S. Highway No. 66 at the point at which it crosses the Colorado River; thence easterly on said Highway No. 66 to the point at or near Topock, Arizona, where the same intersects the southerly line of the improved road running from Topock in an easterly direction to Yucca, Arizona; thence along the southerly line of said road to the point at or near Yucca, Arizona, where the same intersects the westerly line of the improved road running in a southeasterly direction from Yucca to Signal, Arizona; thence along the westerly line of said road to the point at or near Signal, Arizona, where the same intersects the easterly line of the unimproved road running in a northeasterly direction to Wikieup, Arizona; thence in a northeasterly direction along the easterly line of said road to the point, approximately 16 miles northeast of Signal, Arizona, where the same intersects the southerly line of the improved road running from said intersection through Hillside to Congress Junction, Arizona; thence along the westerly line of said road to the point at or near Congress Junction, where the same intersects the westerly line of U. S. Highway No. 89; thence in a southerly direction along the westerly line of U. S. Highway No. 89 to the point where the same intersects the city limits of the city of Phoenix, Arizona; thence in an easterly and southerly direction along said city limits to the point where the same intersects the southerly line of ". S. Highway No. 80/89 east of Phoenix, Arizona: thence ensterly along the southerly line of U.S. Highway No. 80/89 to the amountantion with the southerly line of
