



I shall appreciate it if you will turn the following information over to the Custodian of Alien Property or whoever may be the proper authority to handle this case:


The above named individual has been engaged in business in Lakeview, Oregon, for a number of years. On August 24, 1920, K. Kawaji and H. Uyento purchased the Lake County Steam Laundry. On March 27, 1923, K. Kawaji purchased from H. Uyento his interest in the above steam laundry. K. Kawaji is an enemy alien, being a citizen of Japan. It is reported that he is a former officer in the Japanese Navy. About the last part of 1940 or the first part of 1941 he left Lakeview advising people there that he was returning to Japan for a visit. It is believed by people in Lakeview that he may be serving in the Japanese Navy at the present time. He still retains title to the Laundry in Lakeview but has entered into a contract to sell a 1/2 interest in it.

In investigating his income tax liability for the year 1941, it was discovered that K. Kawaji has had a trading account with the KASAI SECURITIES CO., 2100 Pine Street, San Francisco, California. This investigation disclosed that previously he had owned stock in Transamerica Corporation, and it may be that he still owns some of this stock or other securities.

It is my opinion that all property and rights to property belonging to Japanese Enemy Aliens should be seized. The residents of Lakeview are anxious to get the Japs out of that place and it looks to me as if the property could be seized and thus accomplish that end.

Dear Sir: In reply to your letter of April 11, 1942, regarding the following information, I am pleased to advise you that the following information is being furnished to you for your information:

The above named individual has been engaged in business in the United States for a number of years. On August 2, 1930, E. K. Kawai and H. Owsley entered into a partnership agreement. On March 22, 1932, E. K. Kawai purchased from H. Owsley his interest in the above named partnership. E. K. Kawai is an alien, being a citizen of Japan. He is a former officer in the Japanese Navy. About the summer of 1940 or the 1941 part of 1941 he left Japan for a visit. It is believed by some that he may be serving in the Japanese Navy at the present time. He still retains title to the property in Japan but has entered into a contract to sell a 1/2 interest in it.

In investigating his income tax liability for the year 1941, it was discovered that E. K. Kawai had a trading account with the KASAI SECURITIES CO., 2102 Pine Street, San Francisco, California. This investigation disclosed that previously he had owned stock in Fremontville Corporation, and it may be that he still owns some of this stock or other securities.

It is my opinion that all property and rights to property belonging to Kawai should be seized. The interests of Kawai are known to be the Japanese and it looks to me as if the property could be seized and thus accomplished. That end.

Dear Mr. Kawakami:

So far as it is possible for us to do so we shall answer the questions listed in your letter of March 19, 1942 in the order in which they appear.

(a) We have no information as to when evacuation will be ordered from military area No. 1 nor are we sure that such evacuation will be ordered. The only suggestion we can make now is that you have a definite plan in mind looking towards the disposal or the taking care of your property in case such an order is issued.

(b) The usual legal rights of the mortgage holder are not abridged by the evacuation order, therefore the right to foreclose is not affected. However, if such a contingency should arise and it is impossible for you to arrive at a settlement with the debt holder which will enable you to continue your equity in the property, we will do all in our power to assist you in working out a reasonable and equitable settlement either by trying to obtain an extension of time from the mortgage holder or assisting in obtaining for you the reasonable value for your equity in the property.

(c) In case the mortgage on your real property is foreclosed and the property is then sold for an amount insufficient to pay the balance owing, under certain conditions the holder of the debt could levy against farm implements, furniture, and other personal property for the amount of the deficiency. Should this eventuality occur perhaps we can assist you in arriving at an equitable settlement.


(d) There is nothing in the army order requiring evacuation to indicate that special treatment will be given in case a draftee has an interest in the property. We understand, however, that there is a measure of protection offered for such property by Federal legislation recently enacted and refer you to the United States Attorney's office, Portland, Oregon for details.

(e) If an evacuee or anyone else gives a power of attorney to another person, the terms of the instrument will be the controlling factor as to the extent of the power so granted. If the instrument gives the attorney the necessary power then losses occasioned through the operation of the property would fall on the evacuee or other signer of the instrument.


(f) We are not informed as to whether an evacuee who moves voluntarily and then for unexpected reasons is unable to stay in the place he selects will be allowed to later move to a spot designated by the army or the government.

(g) No instructions have been issued nor is any information available which would indicate that the evacuee will not be permitted to return to his property in the present restricted zone after the present emergency is over.

wise to start to proceed to liquidate assets immediately?

b. In case the farm has a mortgage, is there any way to avoid a foreclosure except by keep paying the mortgage after we leave the place? Many of us put everything in the farming land and still have heavy mortgages, are working the whole family to keep these payments and taxes up. I am sure that after we leave the place many of us have not and will not make enough to keep these obligations paid up. On these days the value of real estate is up and I am afraid it is next to impossible to make arrangements with the mortgagee except by paying in full. In some instances, this applies to taxes too.

c. If an evacuee leaves his farm implements, furniture and other

chattels behind on the place, in case of foreclosure of mortgage, does the mortgagee have the right to sell these personal properties if the land is not sufficient to cover the amount?

d. Is there any provision for drafters' property? As in some cases, two boys were drafted, left old and young folks at home who can't do much, especially when moved from their accustomed occupation. This will almost entirely cut the income for the family. Chances are, they will be the first ones who cannot keep up mortgages and taxes.

e. If an evacuee gives a person a power of attorney and lets him operate the property, in case the latter can't make anything out of the place or even loses,



No matter what the agreement is, must the evacuee stand the business end whatever it may be?

f. If an evacuee moves voluntarily to a certain place where, for some unexpected reason (from the opposition of the community or something) must move out again, does the government allow him to join the designated place where the involuntarily moving parties go?

g. An evacuee, in good faith, tries to keep his property by borrowing money to pay up present obligations, moves to some locality, works and puts everything he earns into the property which he left behind. Do you think the government guarantees or gives some assurance that he will be allowed to come back to his property, the former residence?

Reference is made to your recent letter about refrigerator and other equipment being purchased on the partial payment plan.


None of the information which has been supplied to us so far indicates that a governmental agency will be authorized to make payments on such equipment during the evacuation period. We strongly urge therefore that you make every endeavor to arrange such problems in a way which will protect your equity. Possibly you may be able to make temporary arrangements with someone in your vicinity to make the payments for the use of the refrigerator until you can determine whether or not the refrigerator will be needed by you after you have moved. This is merely a suggestion and any arrangements which you care to make which will give you adequate protection will meet with our approval.

We fully expect storage facilities will be made available to store household furniture and other items of equipment properly boxed and crated, of course, but definite details in this regard are not yet available.

It would not seem advisable to dispose of the household furniture unless you wish to and can obtain a reasonable price for it, since we have no doubt that definite details for storage will be available prior to the evacuation date.

We hope you will feel entirely free to call upon us for assistance in any matters pertaining to the evacuation if you feel that our service can be helpful to you.

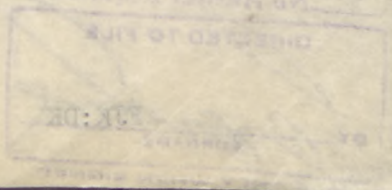


MEMORANDUM

Mr. George Kido of Route 4, Box 1281, City, called at this office regarding an account held by Gill Seed Company in the amount of \$128.

Mr. Kido states that the Gill Company are threatening suit. He also states that this balance was owing by his father who passed away in 1934. The original amount of this bill was \$200 and since the death of the father, George Kido has reduced this amount to \$128. He states that he is not sure that this debt was owing by the father. He also states that he is now 27 years old.

Referring this to Mr. Crouch, he suggested that I contact Gill Seed Company for their side of the story. I spoke to Mr. Gill who informed me that this account was put in the name of the son about three years before the father passed away. The boy has since been purchasing seed and materials from them and has kept his account in reasonably good shape, meanwhile making the reduction on the old account. He states that since the father died, the boy has purchased his own place. Mr. Gill informed that he offered George Kido \$85 for a cabbage planter but George Kido refused to sell to him saying he had promised this cabbage planter to another party.

Our final advice to George Kido was to see Mr. Gill personally and make arrangements for the settlement of the account, suggesting that if he were unable to pay this, he should give Mr. Gill a note if he felt that he owed the account or as a second way of settling this he might offer Mr. Gill a sum of cash, the amount of which to be determined between themselves. We also suggested that he keep his credit good for future use.


In order to assist you ^{and} because you intimated you had been unable to get a permit to travel, we have obtained for you and enclosed herewith a travel permit, permitting you to come to the Wartime Civil Control Administration offices in Portland. This authorization is subject to all military regulations and restrictions and it does not permit you to travel during the curfew hours which are after 8 p.m. and before 6 a.m.


Because the daytime train service between Portland and Medford is very unsatisfactory involving use of the bus, you will probably wish to make the trip by automobile. If you will notice, the permit is void after April 20, 1942 so that you will have to use it immediately if you wish to avail yourself of its privileges.

The particular function of the Federal Reserve Bank in this program is in connection with the storage of household goods and in assisting evacuees in disposing of their business or property. Someone on our staff will be pleased to discuss these angles with you and representatives of other agencies will, we are sure, be available to go into the other matters about which you inquire in your letter.

It is just possible that while you are here you may be able to make some arrangement for you to act in your professional capacity at the assembly or reception centers.



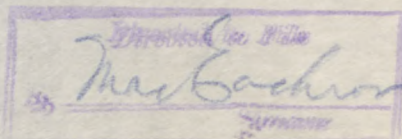



Dear Dr. Kinoshita:

Reference is made to your letter of April 1, 1942 addressed to the Wartime Civil Coordinating Agency.

This office has no information as to the length of time evacuees will be given to arrange their affairs after the evacuation order is issued, but judging from previous experience the time may be short. The Federal Reserve Bank is arranging for the pick up and storage at government expense at the sole risk of the owner of the more substantial household items such as ice boxes, washing machines, pianos and other heavy furniture. Cooking utensils and other small items will be accepted if crated, packed and plainly marked. Bric-a-brac will not be accepted.

We understand that evacuees may carry with them on departure for the assembly center bedding and linens (no mattress), toilet articles, extra clothing and other essential personal effects for each member of the family. The size and number of packages undoubtedly will be limited to that which can be carried by the individual or family group. Short-wave radio receiving sets having a frequency of 1,750 kilocycles or greater or of 540 kilocycles or less may not be taken.

Evacuees may provide their own transportation to assembly centers. However, should this method of transportation not be available the Civil Control office should be notified.

We have no information as to the type of house that is to be allocated at the permanent resettlement area nor is any information available as to the extent of the furnishings.

You may, if you so desire, dispose of your office furniture in Portland on any reasonable basis you see fit. However, if you prefer, the storage facilities offered by this bank will be available to you.

Your letter is being referred to Federal Security Agency for answers to your remaining questions.

Until very recently, I have been in the employ of the War-CCC Department and Have been reading the papers concerning the coming evacuation of aliens and citizens of Japanese Ancestry from the Pacific Coastal Areas. However, I have been unable to obtain any informations concerning the evacuation and the regulations governing such evacuation. I will greatly appreciate it, therefore, if you will clarify some of the things I wish to know, after I have submitted the following information concerning myself:


I am an American Citizen of Japanese Ancestry, age 36 years, my wife is of the Caucasian race, and I have one son 6 years of age. I have been a Reserve Officer of the United States since 1929; my present rank is Captain, Medical Reserve. I have applied for active duty but as yet have not received a reply from the Commanding General Ninth Corps Area. I have been employed by the War-CCC Department, as camp surgeon and Assistant District Surgeon since May 18, 1936. I am licensed to practice Medicine and Surgery in Oregon. I have served as Civil Service examining physician for the 11th Civil Service District and as Official C.M.T.C. Examiner. At present I am serving as Examining Physician for Douglas County Selective Service Board No. 1. I have not disposed of my household goods or furniture as yet. I have my office furniture stored in the Gerlinger Building Portland, Oregon.

The following informations will be appreciated: The procedure and regulations governing the coming evacuation (the date and the probable resettlement area) How long a time will we get to ready ourselves after notice of date of evacuation is received? What furnitures as washing machine, stoves, refrigerator, cooking utensils, beddings, radio, light fixtures, will each family be allowed to bring with them? Who will furnish the facilities for transportation? What type of house is to be allocated at the permanent settlement area for the duration? Will these houses be furnished? What facilities for earning a living will be provided for a professional man's family? Will my son have a chance to continue his schooling? Will my wife who is of the white race be permitted to withdraw from such areas? Will she be able to eat the type of food furnished or are food to be provided each family? (a list of things we are allowed to take with us, will be helpful). I have my office furniture in Portland. Will I have to take them along or should I sell them as soon as possible?

Thank you. If I can be of service to the Government and to the unfortunate evacuees, my services are at your command.

If I should contact the Army at Utah concerning clarification of my status, I will do so.

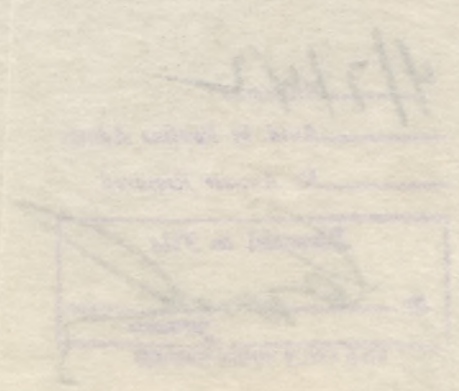





Walter Fawbush informs me that he has offered \$6400 for the Oana Bros. ranch at Willow Flat, and asks my opinion.

This is a hard question, as, first of all, our assessments on land are high (considered to be 67% rather than 50% of actual value) and seemed because of the distressing values placed by the Federal Land Bank, conciliators for the Frazier Lampke set up, etc.

The State Tax Commission had a very competent appraiser here for a couple of months last year, but he could not come to any satisfactory figure on values.

Some have one idea, some another. Truth is that Hood River Valley is more like a suburban, than a rural area, and few people care to sell except as a last resort.

I am starting my twelfth year as assessor, and during several of those years most people were ready to sell out, but were just too heavily involved to do so.

Mr. Fawbush might go ahead and net \$6400 on the place this year, and again he might go head over heels. I think his offer is reasonable. The buildings are not much, and there is not any domestic water, and 3/4 acres in brush above the irrigation ditch.

On the other hand it is in the most frost free section of the Valley, and his varieties are good.

Twenty-seven (27) acres is all that can be considered and at \$6400 that is about \$230 per acre.

I am sending a set of maps which you may keep for your use as long as you wish. I was going to send some data to the San Francisco office, but it seems that they are pretty well supplied with information.







William Koida, Route 11, Box 851, Milwaukie, Oregon, called at this office today and stated that the business "Joe Koida, Florist" at the above address formerly belonged to Joe Koida, that Joe Koida left in 1935 for Japan and has been there since that time, that he no longer has any interest in the business but requested that it be continued to be carried on in his name.

William Koida, who is a nephew of Joe Koida, attempted to deposit five checks totaling \$129.47 in the First State Bank of Milwaukie (Oregon) in the account "Joe Koida, Florist". This is the name of the account used by William Koida. The Milwaukie bank refused to accept the deposit on the grounds that the interest of a national of Japan is involved and also because the checks are payable personally to Joe Koida. In discussing the account by telephone with the First State Bank of Milwaukie, we were informed that William Koida has been sending Joe Koida in Japan \$25 per month, which is the limit allowed under the previous general license.

The writer gave William Koida a set of application blanks (form TFE-1) and suggested that he apply for a general license. The checks were returned to William Koida.

It is the writer's opinion, after discussing this account with William Koida and with the First State Bank of Milwaukie, that there is considerable likelihood that Joe Koida, a national of Japan, still has a substantial interest in the firm and possibly owns all of it. It is believed that this business should be investigated.
