MEMORANDUM

May 2, 1942

REFERENCE: Phillip Hotel, 421 West Burnside Street, Portland, Oregon

On April 30, 1942, we were advised by Ronald Shiozoki that he had a prospective purchaser for the hotel, one George Sperry, who apparently would pay \$6,000 with an initial \$2,000 cash payment.

I suggested that he immediately take Sperry to Commonwealth to discuss terms of the lease. Sperry apparently is a Greek who has changed his name. Whether or not he has ^{any} given credit standing we were not advised.

Yesterday Jeffry Holbrook of Commonwealth, Inc., phoned to say that W. M. Fromme was in their office ready to go ahead and purchase the hotel for \$4,000, \$2,000 cash, the balance in three years at 3% interest with an adjustment on unpaid balance should the property be sold and the lease cancelled.

They asked what we knew about the situation. I again phoned Shiozoki who said that he would have Sperry in the Commonwealth office at 3 P.M. This he failed to do. Holbrook advised that he thought he could hold Fromme in line until next Tuesday the latest evacuation date.

At 5 P. M. last evening he came in the office to say that he was going to show the property to the Coast Guard, their objective being to possibly use the premises for Coast Guard barracks. If this last deal goes through they will undoubtedly force the present occupants out, which means we will have to store the furniture.


On January 3, 1942, the Office of the United States Attorney, sent to all state and local Police authorities, a notice calling their attention to the fact that the President had, by his proclamations of December 7 and 8, 1941, directed in the interests of national safety that alien enemies should not possess or use various items, such as firearms, weapons, ammunition, short-wave radio sets, signal devices, etc. The notice stated further it was necessary to require alien enemies to deposit such prohibited articles with law enforcement agencies and asked for the help and cooperation of the local police authorities throughout the country.

Public Proclamation No. 3, dated March 24, 1942, issued by J. L. Dewitt, Lieutenant General, U. S. Army, carries a provision that after March 31, 1942, no persons of Japanese ancestry shall have in his possession similar items.

Please inform us as to the amount of such contraband now in your hands and also any information as to the quantity of contraband remaining in the hands of United States citizens of Japanese ancestry will be greatly appreciated.
