Reference is made to your letter of June 26, 1942 regarding mail addressed to the Sanyo Company factory, 2632 North Interstate, Portland, Oregon.

We are informed by the Treasury Department representative who was formerly stationed at the Sanyo Company factory that Mr. Osland of the Porter-Scarpelli Macaroni Company, 3510 N. E. Broadway Street is interested only in getting statements for utilities such as water, electricity and gas and that his firm will contact the utilities companies and arrange to have such statements sent direct to them.

In view of the above information we do not feel we have authority to authorize the delivery of mail addressed to the Sanyo Company factory to the Porter-Scarpelli Macaroni Company.
