New Counterfeit \$10 Federal Reserve Note

*To all Banks, Trust Companies and Savings Banks
in the Second Federal Reserve District:*

A new counterfeit \$10 Federal Reserve Note is brought to your attention. The Secret Service Division of the Treasury Department has described the note in its circular letter No. 454, as follows:

“On the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City, Missouri; check letter ‘B’; W. G. McAdoo, Secretary of the Treasury; John Burke, Treasurer of the United States; portrait of Jackson.

“This counterfeit is printed from photographic plates, and is clearly the work of an amateur. The bill is about a half inch shorter than the genuine, and the face is brown instead of black, and the back blue instead of green. The number of the specimen at hand is J7509902A. It is a poor counterfeit.”
