New Counterfeit \$10 Federal Reserve Note

*To all Banks, Trust Companies and Savings Banks
in the Second Federal Reserve District :*

A new counterfeit \$10 Federal Reserve note is brought to the attention of banking institutions in this district. The details of the counterfeit are set forth by the Treasury Department in its circular letter No. 461 of March 14, 1921, as follows:

“On the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago, Illinois; check letter ‘A’; plate No. 306; D. F. Houston, Secretary of the Treasury; John Burke, Treasurer of the United States; portrait of Jackson.

“This counterfeit is apparently printed from retouched etched plates, on two pieces of paper, between which silk threads have been distributed. The portrait of Jackson is so poorly executed that a glance at it ought to detect the bill. The number of the specimen at hand is G32043053A. The bill should not deceive those who exercise care in the handling of money.”
