New Counterfeit \$10 Federal Reserve Notes

To All Banks, Trust Companies and Savings Banks in the Second Federal Reserve District:

Two new counterfeit Federal Reserve notes each in the denomination of \$10 are brought to your attention. The details of this counterfeit paper currency are given in circular letter No. 467 of the Treasury Department as follows:

"(1) On the Federal Reserve Bank of New York; check letter 'C'; plate No. 426; Carter Glass, Secretary of the Treasury; John Burke, Treasurer of the United States; portrait of Jackson.

"This counterfeit is printed from crudely etched plates, on two pieces of paper, between which some heavy silk threads have been distributed. The number of the specimen at hand is A1924376B.

"(2) On the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago, Illinois; check letter 'A'; plate number indistinct; Carter Glass, Secretary of the Treasury; John Burke, Treasurer of the United States; portrait of Jackson.

"This counterfeit is printed from photo-etched plates, on two pieces of paper, between which ink lines have been used to imitate the silk fibre of the genuine. The number of this specimen is G29236369A.

"These two counterfeits are so poorly executed that they should be readily detected, and a more detailed description of them is deemed unnecessary."
