New Counterfeit

*To all Banks, Trust Companies and Others Concerned  
in the Second Federal Reserve District:*

The Treasury Department in its circular letter No. 592 describes a new counterfeit as follows:

**\$10 FEDERAL RESERVE NOTE;** on the Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland, Ohio, series of 1914; check letter "B"; face plate No. 193; back plate No. 1314; Frank White, Treasurer of the United States; A. W. Mellon, Secretary of the Treasury; portrait of Jackson.

This counterfeit is a photo-mechanical production printed on two pieces of paper between which imitation silk threads have been distributed. The numbering and seal are executed in pale blue ink. The letters forming the circular text within the seal are irregularly developed. Serial number of specimen at hand, D32239502A.

Care should be exercised in handling notes of this variety, as this counterfeit will deceive the unwary.
