To all Banks, Trust Companies and Others Concerned in the Second Federal Reserve District:

The Treasury Department in its circular letter No. 594 describes a new counterfeit as follows:

\$10 FEDERAL RESERVE NOTE; on the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, New York; 1914 series; check letter "B"; face plate No. 884; back plate No. 1382; Frank White, Treasurer of the United States; A. W. Mellon, Secretary of the Treasury; portrait of Andrew Jackson.

This is a well-executed production printed from photo-mechanical plates on two pieces of paper between which silk threads have been distributed. The seal and numbering are skillfully produced, and the general appearance of the note as a whole so simulates the genuine as to make it a dangerous counterfeit. Specimen at hand bears serial No. B47057954B.
