- (a) Number and (b) Amount balances not exceeding \$2,500.
- (c) Number and (d) Amount balances over \$2,500 and not exceeding \$5,000.
- (e) Number and (f) Amount balances over \$5,000 and not exceeding \$10,000.
- (g) Number and (h) Amount balances over \$10,000 and not exceeding \$50,000.
- (i) Number and (j) Amount balances in excess of \$50,000.

Will you please compile these figures for your bank as promptly as possible and send them to me by telegraph, using the code letters set forth above to distinguish the separate figures.
