Public Notice of Offering of \$50,000,000, or thereabouts, of Treasury Bills
Dated July 24, 1935 Maturing April 22, 1936

To all Incorporated Banks and Trust Companies in the Second Federal Reserve District and Others Concerned:

Following is the text of a notice today made public by the Treasury Department with respect to a new offering of Treasury bills payable at maturity without interest to be sold on a discount basis to the highest bidders.

STATEMENT BY SECRETARY MORGENTHAU

The Secretary of the Treasury gives notice that tenders are invited for Treasury bills to the amount of \$50,000,000, or thereabouts. They will be 273-day bills; and will be sold on a discount basis to the highest bidders. Tenders will be received at the Federal Reserve Banks, or the branches thereof, up to two o'clock p.m., Eastern Standard time, on Monday, July 22, 1935. Tenders will not be received at the Treasury Department, Washington.

The Treasury bills will be dated July 24, 1935, and will mature on April 22, 1936, and on the maturity date the face amount will be payable without interest. They will be issued in bearer form only, and in amounts or denominations of \$1,000, \$10,000, \$10,000, \$500,000, and \$1,000,000 (maturity value).

It is urged that tenders be made on the printed forms and forwarded in the special envelopes which will be supplied by the Federal Reserve Banks or branches upon application therefor.

No tender for an amount less than \$1,000 will be considered. Each tender must be in multiples of \$1,000. The price offered must be expressed on the basis of 100, with not more than three decimal places, e. g., 99.125. Fractions must not be used.

Tenders will be accepted without cash deposit from incorporated banks and trust companies and from responsible and recognized dealers in investment securities. Tenders from others must be accompanied by a deposit of 10 per cent of the face amount of Treasury bills applied for, unless the tenders are accompanied by an express guaranty of payment by an incorporated bank or trust company.

Immediately after the closing hour for receipt of tenders on July 22, 1935, all tenders received at the Federal Reserve Banks or branches thereof up to the closing hour will be opened and public announcement of the acceptable prices will follow as soon as possible thereafter, probably on the following morning. The Secretary of the Treasury expressly reserves the right to reject any or all tenders or parts of tenders, and to allot less than the amount applied for, and his action in any such respect shall be final. Those submitting tenders will be advised of the acceptance or rejection thereof. Payment at the price offered for Treasury bills allotted must be made at the Federal Reserve Banks in cash or other immediately available funds on July 24, 1935.

The Treasury bills will be exempt, as to principal and interest, and any gain from the sale or other disposition thereof will also be exempt, from all taxation, except estate and inheritance taxes. (Attention is invited to Treasury Decision 4550, ruling that Treasury bills are not exempt from the gift tax.) No loss from the sale or other disposition of the Treasury bills shall be allowed as a deduction, or otherwise recognized, for the purposes of any tax now or hereafter imposed by the United States or any of its possessions.

Treasury Department Circular No. 418, as amended, and this notice prescribe the terms of the Treasury bills and govern the conditions of their issue. Copies of the circular may be obtained from any Federal Reserve Bank or branch thereof.

In accordance with the above announcement tenders will be received at the Securities Department of this bank (7th floor, 33 Liberty Street, New York City) or at the Buffalo Branch of this bank (272 Main Street, Buffalo, New York) until two o'clock p.m., Eastern Standard time (three o'clock p.m., Daylight Saving time), on Monday, July 22, 1935.

It is requested that tenders be submitted on special form and in special envelope enclosed herewith.

Attention is invited to the fact that payment for the Treasury bills cannot be made by credit through the War Loan Deposit Account. Payment must be made in cash or other immediately available funds.

NEW COUNTERFEIT

To Member Banks in the Second Federal Reserve District and others concerned:

At the request of the Secret Service Division of the Treasury Department, New York District, we are hereby notifying all member banks in the Second Federal Reserve District and others concerned of the appearance of a new counterfeit \$20 Federal Reserve note described by the Secret Service Division as follows:

NEW COUNTERFEIT \$20 FEDERAL RESERVE NOTE:

On the FEDERAL RESERVE BANK OF NEW YORK; Series of 1928 B; Check Letter 'I'; Face Plate No. 39; Back Plate No. 127; Serial No. B21628707A; bearing facsimile signatures of W. O. WOODS, Treasurer of the United States, and A. W. MELLON, Secretary of the Treasury; portrait of JACKSON.

This note is a fairly well executed photo-mechanical production printed on good bond paper through which red and blue silk threads have been sparsely scattered to simulate the fiber in the genuine. These threads are not curly like the genuine fiber, but are longer and fewer. The portrait of JACKSON is not clear and distinct as in the genuine, and the Treasury seal and serial numbers are imperfectly printed in a dull olive-green. Care should be exercised in handling notes of this denomination, as this counterfeit is calculated to deceive the average handler of currency.

If these or other counterfeits come to your attention, they should be forwarded with all available information to the office of the U. S. Secret Service having jurisdiction in your territory. Offices of the Services are located in New York City, Syracuse, Buffalo, N. Y., and Newark, N. J.
