REVOCATION OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO SAFE DEPOSIT BOXES, UNDER EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 8389, AS AMENDED, EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 9193, SECTIONS 3(a) AND 5(b) OF THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY ACT, AS AMENDED BY THE FIRST WAR POWERS ACT, 1941, RELATING TO FOREIGN FUNDS CONTROL.

The Regulations Relating to Safe Deposit Boxes, issued on August 13, 1942,* are hereby revoked.

Such regulations are hereby continued in full force and effect as to all acts done or omitted to be done and any penalties or liabilities incurred prior to this revocation.
