Citizens or subjects of Italy, Bulgaria, Hungary or Rumania residing in those countries may now receive limited support remittances from their blocked property in the United States under an amendment of General License No. 32A issued today by the Treasury Department. These remittances are permitted in order to alleviate the many cases of severe personal hardship which have been brought to the attention of the Treasury Department. The amount, however, will be limited to a maximum of \$200 per month for anyone household, since no general determination has yet been made with respect to the disposition of the blocked property of these four countries.

Individuals residing in these countries who are not citizens or subjects of enemy countries may receive up to \$1,000 per month under the new license from their blocked funds. Prior to this amendment, the license extended this privilege only to individuals in Italy.

Treasury officials pointed out that all restrictions against remittances to these countries from free funds were removed last December through the issuance of General License No. 94.

Attention was directed to the fact that General License No. 32A does not waive the provisions of General Ruling No. 11A.
