## **Results of Offering of \$2.1 Billion Strip of Treasury Bills**

## To All Incorporated Banks and Trust Companies, and Others Concerned, in the Second Federal Reserve District:

The following statement was issued by the Treasury Department and released at 6:30 p.m., November 25, 1970:

The Treasury Department announced that tenders for additional amounts of seven series of Treasury bills to an aggregate amount of \$2,100,000,000, or thereabouts, to be issued December 2, 1970, which were offered on November 17, 1970, were opened at the Federal Reserve Banks today. The amount of accepted tenders will be equally divided among the seven issues of outstanding Treasury bills maturing January 7, January 14, January 21, January 28, February 4, February 11, and February 18, 1971.
