# Auction of \$2 Billion of 2-Year 6 Percent Treasury Notes

To All Banking Institutions, and Others Concerned, in the Second Federal Reserve District:

As announced in our Circular No. 7013, dated October 5, 1972, the Treasury will sell at auction, on Wednesday, October 11, under competitive and noncompetitive bidding, \$2 billion of 6 percent Treasury Notes of Series E-1974, dated October 19, 1972, due September 30, 1974. The terms of the offering are set forth in Treasury Department Circular No. 10-72, Public Debt Series, dated October 6, 1972, a copy of which is printed below.

This Bank will receive tenders up to 1:30 p.m., Eastern Daylight Saving time, Wednesday, October 11, 1972, at the Securities Department of its Head Office and at its Buffalo Branch, except that noncompetitive tenders mailed to this Bank or its Branch postmarked no later than Tuesday, October 10, will be considered timely. Please use the enclosed tender forms to submit tenders, and return them in the enclosed envelope marked "Tender for Treasury Notes." Tenders not requiring a deposit may be submitted by telegraph, subject to written confirmation; no tenders may be submitted by telephone. Settlement for accepted tenders may be made in cash or other immediately available funds, except that any qualified depositary may make settlement by credit in its Treasury Tax and Loan Account for notes allotted to it for itself and its customers.

### I. OFFERING OF NOTES

1. The Secretary of the Treasury, pursuant to the authority of the Second Liberty Bond Act, as amended, invites tenders at a price not less than 99.76 percent of their face value for \$2,000,000,000, or thereabouts, of notes of the United States, designated 6 percent Treasury Notes of Series E-1974. Tenders will be received up to 1:30 p.m., Eastern Daylight Saving time, Wednesday, October 11, 1972. The notes will be issued under competitive and noncompetitive bidding, as set forth in Section III hereof.

### II. DESCRIPTION OF NOTES

1. The notes will be dated October 19, 1972, and will bear interest from that date at the rate of 6 percent per annum, payable on a semiannual basis on March 31 and September 30, 1973, and March 31 and

September 30, 1974. They will mature September 30, 1974, and will not be subject to call for redemption prior to maturity.

- 2. The income derived from the notes is subject to all taxes imposed under the Internal Revenue Code of 1954. The notes are subject to estate, inheritance, gift or other excise taxes, whether Federal or State, but are exempt from all taxation now or hereafter imposed on the principal or interest thereof by any State, or any of the possessions of the United States, or by any local taxing authority.
- 3. The notes will be acceptable to secure deposits of public moneys. They will not be acceptable in payment of taxes.
- 4. Bearer notes with interest coupons attached, and notes registered as to principal and interest, will be issued in denominations of \$1,000, \$5,000, \$10,000,

\$100,000 and \$1,000,000. Provision will be made for the interchange of notes of different denominations and of coupon and registered notes, and for the transfer of registered notes, under rules and regulations prescribed by the Secretary of the Treasury.

5. The notes will be subject to the general regulations of the Department of the Treasury, now or hereafter prescribed, governing United States notes.

# III. TENDERS AND ALLOTMENTS

- Tenders will be received at Federal Reserve Banks and Branches and at the Office of the Treasurer of the United States, Washington, D. C. 20220, up to the closing hour, 1:30 p.m., Eastern Daylight Saving time, Wednesday, October 11, 1972. Each tender must state the face amount of notes bid for, which must be \$1,000 or a multiple thereof, and the price offered, except that in the case of noncompetitive tenders the term "noncompetitive" should be used in lieu of a price. In the case of competitive tenders, the price must be expressed on the basis of 100, with two decimals, e.g., 100.00. Tenders at a price less than 99.76 will not be accepted. Fractions may not be used. Noncompetitive tenders from any one bidder may not exceed \$200,000. It is urged that tenders be made on the printed forms and forwarded in the special envelopes marked "Tender for Treasury Notes", which will be supplied by Federal Reserve Banks on application therefor.
- 2. Commercial banks, which for this purpose are defined as banks accepting demand deposits, may submit tenders for account of customers provided the names of the customers are set forth in such tenders. Others than commercial banks will not be permitted to submit tenders except for their own account. Tenders will be received without deposit from banking institutions for their own account, Federally-insured savings and loan associations, States, political subdivisions or instrumentalities thereof, public pension and retirement and other public funds, international organizations in which the United States holds membership, foreign central banks and foreign States, dealers who make primary markets in Government securities and report daily to the Federal Reserve Bank of New York their positions with respect to Government securities and borrowings thereon, and Government accounts. Tenders from others must be accompanied by payment of 5 percent of the face amount of notes applied for.
- 3. Immediately after the closing hour tenders will be opened, following which public announcement will be made by the Department of the Treasury of the amount and price range of accepted bids. Those submitting tenders will be advised of the acceptance or rejection thereof. In considering the acceptance of tenders, those at the highest prices will be accepted to the extent required to attain the amount offered. Tenders at the lowest accepted price will be prorated if necessary. The Secretary of the Treasury expressly reserves the right to accept or reject any or all tenders, in whole or in part, and his action in any such respect

shall be final. Subject to these reservations, noncompetitive tenders for \$200,000 or less without stated price from any one bidder will be accepted in full at the average price<sup>1</sup> (in two decimals) of accepted competitive tenders.

- 4. All bidders are required to agree not to purchase or to sell, or to make any agreements with respect to the purchase or sale or other disposition of any notes of this issue at a specific rate or price, until after 1:30 p.m., Eastern Daylight Saving time, Wednesday, October 11, 1972.
- 5. Commercial banks in submitting tenders will be required to certify that they have no beneficial interest in any of the tenders they enter for the account of their customers, and that their customers have no beneficial interest in the banks' tenders for their own account.

### IV. PAYMENT

1. Settlement for accepted tenders in accordance with the bids must be made or completed on or before October 19, 1972, at the Federal Reserve Bank or Branch or at the Office of the Treasurer of the United States, Washington, D. C. 20220, in cash or other funds immediately available by that date. Payment will not be deemed to have been completed where registered notes are requested if the appropriate identifying number as required on tax returns and other documents submitted to the Internal Revenue Service (an individual's social security number or an employer identification number) is not furnished. In every case where full payment is not completed, the payment with the tender up to 5 percent of the amount of notes allotted shall, upon declaration made by the Secretary of the Treasury in his discretion, be forfeited to the United States. Any qualified depositary will be permitted to make settlement by credit in its Treasury Tax and Loan Account for notes allotted to it for itself and its customers.

### V. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1. As fiscal agents of the United States, Federal Reserve Banks are authorized and requested to receive tenders, to make such allotments as may be prescribed by the Secretary of the Treasury, to issue such notices as may be necessary, to receive payment for and make delivery of notes on full-paid tenders allotted, and they may issue interim receipts pending delivery of the definitive notes.
- 2. The Secretary of the Treasury may at any time, or from time to time, prescribe supplemental or amendatory rules and regulations governing the offering, which will be communicated promptly to the Federal Reserve Banks.

1. No tender for less than \$1,000 will be considered and each tender must be for an even multiple of \$1,000 (maturity value).

(Banks submitting tenders for customer account must indicate names, and amounts desired by each, on a separate list attached hereto)

- 2. Others than commercial banks will not be permitted to submit tenders except for their own account. Banks submitting tenders for customer account may consolidate competitive tenders at the same price and may consolidate noncompetitive tenders, provided a list is attached showing the name of each bidder, the amount bid for his account, and method of payment.
- 3. If the person making the tender is a corporation, the tender should be signed by an officer of the corporation authorized to make the tender, and the signing of the tender by an officer of the corporation will be construed as a representation by him that he has been so authorized. If the tender is made by a partnership, it should be signed by a member of the firm, who should sign in the form "..., a copartnership, by ..., a member of the firm."
- 4. Tenders will be received without deposit from commercial and other banks for their own account, Federally-insured savings and loan associations, States, political subdivisions or instrumentalities thereof, public pension and retirement and other public funds, international organizations in which the United States holds membership, foreign central banks and foreign States, dealers who make primary markets in Government securities and report daily to the Federal Reserve Bank of New York their positions with respect to Government securities and borrowings thereon, and Government accounts. Tenders from others must be accompanied by payment of 5 percent of the face amount of notes applied for. All checks must be drawn to the order of the Federal Reserve Bank of New York; checks endorsed to this Bank will not be accepted.
- 5. If the language of this tender is changed in any respect, which, in the opinion of the Secretary of the Treasury, is material, the tender may be disregarded.
