Robert L. Owen is blind and 89 years old. But he is a fighter, and he doesn't give up easily. He battled for the original League of Nations after the last war, and it was no fault of his that the United States refused to join it. The other day, the former Democratic Senator from Oklahoma appeared at a hearing of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee. Before a hushed and respectful audience, he put in his word for passage of the United Nations Charter. He said: "I represent an American citizen who has lived long and loved much. . . . I hope you will take prompt action. I hope you will take the steps necessary to pass this Charter, and that the Senate will not take long to enact it. The world now is prepared to make completely effective the objectives of the United Nations Charter. . . . I want to pay tribute to Woodrow Wilson, a saint and a martyr. The world was not ready for his League of Nations. It is ready for it now." To the man who didn't give up, and who will yet find his great dream realized, PM says:
