ADDRESS REPLY TO FEDERAL RESERVE BOARD

December 6, 1916.

Dear Sir:

There is inclosed for your information and attention copy of a resolution adopted by the Federal Reserve Board at a meeting held on December 5, levying an assessment of one-tenth of one per cent (.001) against Federal Reserve Banks to defray the estimated general expenses of the Federal Reserve Board from January 1 to June 30, 1917. This assessment does not include the cost of engraving and printing Federal reserve notes.

There is also inclosed a statement showing the basis upon which the assessment is levied.

I have the honor to request that you bring this matter to the early attention of the Board of Directors of your bank, and forward the assessment to the Federal Reserve Board, one-half to be payable January 1st, and one-half on March 1, 1917, as indicated in the resolution.

WHEREAS, under Section 10 of the Act approved December 23, 1913, and known as the Federal Reserve Act, the Federal Reserve Board is empowered to levy semiannually upon the Federal Reserve Banks in proportion to their ccpital stock and surplus, an assessment sufficient to pay its estimated expenses, including the salaries of its members, assistants, attorneys, experts, and employes for the half year succeeding the levying of such assessment, together with any deficit carried forward from the preceding half year; and

whereas, it appears from estimates submitted and considered that it is necessary that a fund equal to one-tenth of one per cent (.001) of the capital stock of the Federal Reserve Banks be created for the purposes hereinbefore described, exclusive of the cost of engraving and printing Federal reserve notes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVE, That pursuant to the authority vested in it by law, the Federal Reserve Board hereby levies an assessment upon the several Federal Reserve Banks of an amount equal to one-tenth of one per cent (.001) of the total capital stock of such banks, and the fiscal agent of the Board is hereby authorized to collect from said banks such assessment and execute, in the name of this Board, a receipt for payment made. Such assessment will be collected in two instalments of one-half each; the first instalment to be paid on January 1, 1917, and the second half on March 1, 1917.
