In December 1914, the Federal Reserve Board held an examination of applicants for appointment to its staff. As the result of this examination there was established an eligible list for stenographers and typewriters, typewriters only, stenographers only, clerks, bookkeepers and messengers. So few appointments were made from the list that the Board extended it through 1916.
