Sir:

The Second Edition of the Index-Digest of the Federal Reserve in Act and Amendments, which has been in preparation for some time, is now ready for distribution.

It had been the intention to send these books to the Federal reserve banks to be mailed to those sending in orders, the Board expecting to attach to each book one of its franked mailing slips, so there would be no charge on the Bank for postage. However, word has just been received from the Postmaster General that the franking privilege could not be extended to the Federal reserve banks or the Federal reserve agent for this purpose, and that the books could only be mailed under frank by the Federal Reserve Board. It has been determined, therefore, to fill all orders direct from Washington.

To carry out this plan you are requested to send to the Board such orders as you receive as fast as they come in and the books will be forwarded immediately from here. Remittance covering the cost should accompany all orders. As previously announced in the Bulletin, the sale price is \$1.25 each, bound in buckram, and \$1.00 each, bound in paper. The Board will immediately send out all orders which have been received up to date, including those ordered by the Federal reserve banks for their own use
