## Hon. P. M. Warburg, Vice Governor, Federal Reserve Board, Treasury Department, Washington, D. C.

Dear Mr. Warburg:

Referring to the limitations on currency which travelers are now permitted to take from this country on their persons, I suggest that in view of the report received from countries adjacent to Germany that the limits of amounts which travelers to those countries be permitted to take be reduced to \$250. per adult instead of \$1,000 per adult. I suggest that the countries as to which this reduced limit be put in force be the neutral European countries -- Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Holland, Switzerland and Spain. This can, I believe, be accomplished by notice to the Federal Reserve Banks, and without any publicity whether by circular or otherwise.
