Dear Sir:

The Board's supply of form St.51-A. Weekly condition Report of Member Banks in Selected Cities, is now practically exhausted, and as several Federal Reserve Banks have expressed a desire to have this form printed locally in order that the name of the Reserve Bank and the department to which it is to be additionable appear thereon, the Board has decided not to have this form reprinted at the Government Printing Office but to let each Reserve Bank print its own supply. It is requested, however, that in printing these forms you use the same description of the various items as adopted by the Board.

You will note from the revised form enclosed horewith that the only change which has been node in the form relates to the method of figuring net demand deposits, item 9. This change is necessary in order to conform to the Board's recent ruling relating to the method of arriving at amounts due to banks and bankers for the purpose of calculating required reserves.
