SUBJECT: Outline of Federal Reserve Branch Banke.

Dear Sir:

With a view to the revision of the outline of Federal reserve branch banks covering powers and functions, also character and volume of business handled, copies of which were forwarded to you on October 28, 1920 with the Board's letter St. 1528, there are enclosed herewith copies of a skeleton form describing briefly the principal functions and powers of the several branches.

The statement has been arranged in tabular form with the powers and functions listed in the left-hand margin and the names of the branches shown at the top, so that when complete it will afford a ready comparison of the powers and functions of the several branches. The division of the branches into two groups is wholly tentative and when the statement is finally prepared it may be found advisable either to arrange for more than two groups or to omit the grouping altogether. In the first group are now listed those branches that discount paper for and carry reserve accounts of member banks, while all other branches are shown in group 2.

May we ask that one copy of the enclosed form be returned to the goard with the letter "Y" for "Yes" or "N" for "No" shown opposite each function for each of the branches of your bank, together with any comments or suggestions for the revision or improvement of the proposes form that you may care to make? If a branch performs any functions not provided for

in the proposed form, or performs certain of its functions in a manner different from that described therein, an appropriate addition or insertion should be made. It is also requested that as soon after January 1, 1922 as possible you forward to the Board statements showing for each Branch -

- (1) The name, home address, and business of each director.
- (2) Territory assigned to branch as of January 1, 1922.
- (3) Number, capital, surplus and total resources of National banks (combined figures for all banks) in branch zone on December 31, 1921, or on the date nearest thereto for which condition report figures are available, the date of the condition reports to be indicated.
- (4) Statement similar to that immediately preceding covering State bank and Trust company members of the System.
- (5) Number of non-member banks in branch zone on par list January 1, 1922.

Your prompt attention to this matter will be appreciated.

Examines notes presented for rediscount and if technically acceptable, may arrange by telegraph for immediate credit on the books of the parent bank. The notes are then forwarded to the head office for final approval.

OPEN MARKET OPERATIONS --

CASH ITEMS --

Clears and collects checks, drafts and other cash items collectible at par through a Federal reserve bank or branch-

COLLECTION ITEMS ---

Receives for collection maturing bills, notes, coupons, acceptances, bill of lading drafts, etc. - - - - - - -

GOLD SETTLEMENT FUND --

Participates directly in daily clearing through Gold Settlement Fund.

Daily clearing telegram to the Board, giving credits to other F. R. banks and branches, includes also credits to own head office and other branches in own district

DLEARING HOUSE --

All functions formerly performed by the local clearing house are now performed by the branch - - - - - - - - - -

All members of the local clearing house are members or clearing non-members of the Federal Reserve System and clearing house balances are paid by debit or credit entries to members reserve or to non-member clearing accounts on books of the Branch

Membership -

- 1. Branch has same privileges and is subject to same penalties as are other members of the clearing house association but has no voice in its management.
- 2. Pays dues as a member of the association.

Makes exchanges of Liberty bonds and Victory notes, also receives such bonds and notes for registry, transfer, etc - - -

Sells war savings securities through both cash and collateral agents - - -

Receives subscriptions to certificates of indebtedness and Treasury notes - -
