SUBJECT: Reports of Condition of State Banks and Trust Companies.

Dear Sir:

Your courtesy will be greatly appreciated if you will furnish the Federal Reserve Board, as soon as available, with two copies of the abstract of reports of condition of State banks and Trust companies in your State on June 30, 1924, or other recent date in case you did not issue a call for reports of condition as of June 30.

If convenient to your office, we would like to have separate figures for mutual savings banks and for private banks, providing there are any such banks operating in your state. In case the number of each class of banks reporting is not shown in the abstract, will you also be good enough to incorporate this information in your letter of transmittal. Following your usual custom it will be appreciated if you will kindly segregate the data according to Federal reserve districts, as the value of these data to the Board and for purposes of publication will be greatly enhanced if they can be tabulated by Federal reserve districts.

The July number of the Federal Reserve Bulletin (copy of which will be forwarded to you as soon as received from the printer) contains a summary statement of the abstracts of reports of condition on or about March 31, 1924, of all banks and trust companies (other than mutual savings banks) under state supervision in the 48 states and the District of Columbia, to which your attention is invited.
