SUBJECT: Holidays During February, 1937.

Dear Sir:

The Board of Governors is advised that on Tuesday, February 9, the Birmingham and New Orleans Branches of the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta will be closed in observance of Mardi Gras Day in Alabama and Louisiana. Please include transit clearing credits of February 9 for the New Orleans Branch with your credits for the following day.

On Friday, February 12, Lincoln's Birthday, the books of the Board's Interdistrict Settlement Fund will be closed and there will be neither transit nor Federal Reserve note clearing through the fund. For your information, the Board is advised that the following Federal Reserve banks and branches will be open for business on February 12:
