
The Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System is advised that on Thursday, February 12, 1942, a majority of the Federal Reserve Banks and branches will be closed in observance of the anniversary of the birth of Abraham Lincoln, and accordingly there will be neither transit nor Federal Reserve note clearing through the Interdistrict Settlement Fund on that day. For your information, the Board is advised that the following Federal Reserve Banks and branches will be open for business on February 12:

On Monday, February 23, in observance of Washington's Birthday, which falls on Sunday, the offices of the Board and all Federal Reserve Banks and branches except the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta will be closed.

The Board is also advised that the Birmingham and New Orleans Branches of the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta will be closed on Tuesday, February 17, 1942, in observance of Mardi Gras Day. Please include transit clearing credits of February 17 for the New Orleans Branch with your credits for the following day.
