

LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS June 30, 1943

To His Excellency, Homer M. Adkins, Governor of Arkansas:

Complying with the provisions of Section 704 of Pope's Digest, I have the honor to submit herewith the Twenty-Ninth Annual Report of the State Bank Commissioner of Arkansas for the year beginning July 1, 1942, and ending June 30, 1943. The report covers the condition of the State banks and trust companies, state building and loan associations, industrial banks, credit unions, a combined statement of the burial associations of Arkansas and a compiled list, together with other factual data.

The total assets of State banks aggregate \$204,492,580.95, representing an increase of \$61,781,924.00 since June 30, 1942, or 44 per cent. The total loans carried by State banks you will note are about the same level as a year ago. The banks appear to be adequately able and willing to care for the industrial and agricultural credit needs of the State. The substantial contribution State banks are making to the war effort is evidenced by an overall investment in government bonds and other securities of \$83,733,724.16, constituting 41 per cent investment in its asset position which reflects an increase in government bond holdings of nearly \$50,000,000.00 since June 30, 1942. The State banks have also invested substantially in our own Arkansas State bonds.

Conforming with your leadership, this Department is endeavoring to serve constructively and efficiently the State banks of Arkansas and its citizens. I want to take this opportunity of extending my very kind appreciation for your courtesy and cooperation.

I wish also to extend my kind thanks to the members of the Arkansas General Assembly for their cooperation and for the consideration accorded legislation and other matters pertaining to this Department at the 1943 session, and my thanks to the State Banking Board and the Arkansas Bankers Association for their counsel and cooperation.
