To His Excellency, Homer M. Adkins,
Governor of Arkansas:

Complying with the provisions of Section 704 of Pope's Digest, I have the honor to submit herewith the Thirtieth Annual Report of the State Bank Commissioner of Arkansas for the year beginning July 1, 1943, and ending June 30, 1944. The report covers the condition of the state banks and trust companies, state building and loan associations, industrial banks, credit unions, a combined statement of the burial associations of Arkansas and a compiled list, together with other factual data.

The total assets of state banks aggregate \$242,132,901.26, representing an all time high in the history of the Department. This being an increase of \$37,640,320.31 over June 30, 1943, or 18 per cent. This compares with an increase of 44 per cent in total assets over the previous year. The total loans carried by state banks are \$42,121,016.07, or an increase of \$11,623,676.47 over June 30, 1943. The substantial contribution state banks are making to the war effort is evidenced by an over all investment in government bonds of \$97,906,064.13, constituting 40 per cent investment in its asset position, which reflects an increase in government bond holdings of \$27,000,000.00 over June 30, 1943. The state banks have cooperated to the fullest extent in the successful war bond drives and are giving much time and effort in the sale of war bonds and the handling of ration banking. They have also invested substantially in our own state of Arkansas bonds.

It has been the policy of this Department to urge upon the institutions it supervises that they take advantage of the present relatively good times to dispose of all unsuitable assets, absorb all known losses and prepare for the responsibilities and opportunities which lie ahead. The Department has recommended to the banks that they strengthen their capital structures so that they may be in better position to meet the demands of the post war world. Often in the past banking supervision has been too relaxed in good times and too stringent in bad times. The time to raise our standards is when prices are rising, income is expanding and dead assets are coming to life—in short, when the national economy is undergoing an inflationary trend. If that is done, bankers can then afford to adopt more liberal lending policies and to give more positive assistance to recovery in any subsequent time of stress. I am pleased to announce

that for the first time in the thirty-one years history of the Department there are no banks in the process of liquidation.

This Department is endeavoring to serve constructively and efficiently the state banks of Arkansas and its citizens. I want to take this opportunity of extending my very kind appreciation for your courtesy and cooperation. I also want to extend my thanks and appreciation to the State Banking Board and the Arkansas Bankers Association for their services, counsel and cooperation.
