

To His Excellency Honorable Sid McMath Governor of Arkansas

Sir:

I have the honor of submitting to you the Thirty-Fifth Annual Report of the State Bank Department for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1949, in compliance with the terms and provisions of Act 113 of 1913 (now found in Section 67-111, Arkansas Statutes of 1947). The report reflects the condition of state banks and trust companies, state building and loan associations, industrial loan companies, credit unions, a combined statement of the burial associations and other factual data pertaining to the operation of the department.

During the period covered by this report the banks and trust companies increased their resources \$6,990,000. The compiled report as of June 30, 1949, shows that these resources were composed of the following:

Since June 30, 1948, the total capital funds in all our state banks and trust companies have increased \$2,611,779.71. This increase was occasioned by the retention of a large percentage of earnings in the capital accounts. The present total capital account affords a ratio to total liabilities of 7.1%. For the calendar year 1948, more than 75% of the net profits were retained in the capital accounts.

The department is ever mindful and deeply appreciative of the fine cooperation it has received from the office of the Governor and the members of the State Banking Board. It is the desire of this department to assist in any possible way in keeping our banking and other financial institutions sound, active and aggressive in order that they may properly serve their communities.
