
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

AMENDMENTS ALTERING CAPITAL STRUCTURE July 1, 1950 to June 30, 1951

- 1. The Bank of Augusta, Augusta, increased capital from \$50,000.00 to \$75,000.00 by the declaration of a 50% stock dividend.
 - 2. Benton State Bank, Benton, increased capital from \$100,000.00 to \$150,-
- 000.00 by the declaration of a 50% stock dividend.
- 3. Bank of Cave City, Cave City, increased capital from \$20,000.00 to \$25,000.00 by the declaration of a 25% stock dividend.
- 4. Merchants and Farmers Bank, Dumas, increased capital from \$50,-000.00 to \$100,000.00 by the declaration of a 100% stock dividend.
- 5. The Citizens Bank, England, increased capital from \$30,000.00 to \$60,000.00 by the declaration of a 100% stock dividend.
- 6. Earle State Bank, Earle, increased capital from \$70,000.00 to \$80,-000.00 by the sale of \$10,000.00 par value of new common stock.

- 7. Clark County Bank, Gurdon, increased capital from \$25,000.00 to \$50,000.00 by the declaration of a 100% stock dividend.

 8. Farmers & Merchants Bank, Judsonia, increased capital from \$17,500.00 to \$35,000.00 by the declaration of a 100% stock dividend.
