

I have prepared and herewith submit for your consideration the Fifty-first Annual Report of the Banking Department of the State of Michigan, for the year ended December 31, 1939, as provided in Section 20 of the Michigan financial institutions act.

Our Banking Structure

The Michigan state banking system is now composed of 351 commercial banks, 7 industrial banks, and 12 trust companies. In addition, the State Banking Department has charge of 165 credit unions, and 231 small loan licensees. Of the commercial banks, 37% are members of the Federal Reserve system, as compared to 10% of all state banks throughout the nation. All but ten banks in Michigan, or 97.1%, are members of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, while throughout the several states 90% of the banks carry this insurance. There are about one-fourth as many national banks operating in Michigan as there are state banks.

The resources of the 351 commercial state banks now amount to \$767,131,348.43, which is a growth of 65 million dollars since December 31, 1938. Deposits in our state banks now total \$696,128,939.37, an increase of 61 million dollars.

Of the assets held by commercial state banks on December 31, 1939, 38.4% are government and corporate securities, 29.8% are loans and discounts, and 29.1% are made up of cash, reserves, and due from banks. Percentage-wise there has been a noticeable reduction in assets made up of bond investments with a corresponding increase in cash reserves. While loans and discounts show a healthy growth as to volume, with an increase of 30 million dollars, or 15.2%, as compared to 5.7% in 1938, this increase has not greatly exceeded the normal growth in the resources of state commercial banks as a whole.

Bond portfolios show an aggregate drop of 13 million dollars in government issues but these holdings still constitute nearly one-fourth of the total assets of our state banks. Holdings in municipal bonds are larger by 10 million dollars, and there is an aggregate drop of 12 million dollars in corporate issues. In terms of investment ratios, the proportion of government issues to total investments is now 63.6% as contrasted to 64.8% for last year, municipal bonds have jumped to 22.7% from 18.2%, while corporate issues have dropped to 13.7% from 17% in 1938. Analyses of our examiners' reports show a decided improvement as to quality in the investment portfolios of our banks, despite the swing away from government issues, and there is also a better record as to earnings. There seems to be a definite trend toward the purchasing of high grade municipal issues, often local in character. Fewer bond assets were criticised by examiners this past year.

The changing aspect of assets on the whole is best illustrated by making comparisons with the situation as it existed in 1929. At that time, loans and discounts were 61.7% of all assets, and bonds and other securities, 23.3%. Relatively, our state banks are making about one-half as many local loans as they did ten years ago, and their bond portfolios are nearly twice as large. In the past five years, loans and discounts have averaged about 28% of all assets, and bonds, 44%.

Real estate owned, other than banking premises, now amounts to only 0.3% of the total assets of commercial banks. In 1939, the carrying value was reduced by \$1,369,597.48, to a new low figure of \$2,904,545.32, which is a shrinkage of 32%.

It is interesting to note an improvement in our state banking structure as it pertains to the capital account of the 351 commercial banks. This shows an increase of \$3,482,020.49 for the current year.

A comparatively long term program of increasing the capitalization of various banks, necessitated by the statutory requirements of our new banking code, the Michigan financial institutions act, which became operative in 1937, is now well under way. In 1939, a number of the smaller banks increased their common stock from \$20,000.00 to \$25,000.00 as required by law, and many larger institutions made similar adjustments due to growth in deposits and in populations of the cities where they are located. The net aggregate increase in common stock of commercial state banks for 1939 amounted to \$2,632,790.00. Thus it is seen that

capital structure, which represents a cushion against the depreciation of assets and contributes materially to the security of depositors, is being continually strengthened.

Incidentally, it is of more than passing interest to observe that the preferred stock in our commercial banks, trust companies, and industrial banks, has been reduced from an original amount of 25 million dollars to 14 million dollars, as of December 31, 1939. As a matter of fact, in our industrial banks all preferred stock has been eliminated. During the year ended December 31, 1939, preferred stock of an aggregate par value of \$3,306,350.00 was retired by 51 state banks. New or additional preferred stock in the amount of \$210,000.00 was issued, so that the net decrease for the year in the aggregate par value of preferred stock was \$3,096,350.00, or 18%.

No new charters for state banks were granted during 1939, and the State Banking Department will continue to be very conservative in considering requests for new charters, having in mind that additional banking facilities will be permitted only where it is felt that they will be genuinely needed. Five banks went into voluntary liquidation during the year.

Liquidation Division

In the field of bank liquidation, dividends to depositors paid by receiverships and trusts for 1939 have aggregated \$13,087,846.62. A total of 59 bank liquidating projects paid final dividends during the year. There are 237 of such projects still functioning with unpaid deposit liabilities in the aggregate of \$50,100,420.27.

As to the 64 receiverships originally set up under direct Department supervision in 1933 and 1934, 43 have now been terminated, with 21 still being in existence. A total of 21 wound up their affairs in 1939. There were 20 court receiverships which were closed in 1939, with 57 now remaining in operation. Act 32 trusts still functioning total 108 and there now 46 depositors corporations in existence.

Of the 436 banks and trust companies, under state supervision, which were closed by the Governor's proclamation in 1933, with total deposits of \$481,229,914.76, there has now been returned to creditors in initial releases and dividends a total of \$429,405,781.00, or an average of 89.23%. The average depositor, therefore, has recovered thus far \$89.23 for every \$100.00 he had impounded.

In 1933 there were at the outset 207 state banks, with deposits of \$254,295,905.00, which reopened immediately, and no depositor lost a dollar. A total of 167 banks were permitted to reorganize. These had deposits of \$112,033,595.00. Initial releases from these particular banks together with dividend payments during the seven-year period have now reached \$93,390,418.00, or 83.36%. At the time of the banking holiday there were 58 other state banks, in a different category, which were not allowed to reopen or reorganize, and which were placed in receivership. Their deposits were \$56,808,615.00, and payments to their creditors up to date have totaled \$42,974,043.00, or 75.71%. Eliminating the 207 banks and trust companies which were found to be solvent in 1933, there were 229 institutions which went through some form of reorganization or were placed in outright receivership. These had total deposits of \$226,934,009.00, and up to date have paid \$175,109,876.00, or 77.1% to creditors.

Small Loan Licensees and Credit Unions

As of December 31, 1939, there were 231 active small loan companies licensed in this state under the supervision of the Banking Department. As of this date, loans of \$300 or less were outstanding on the books of small loan licensees in the sum of \$24,427,366.09. During the past year small loan licensees made 316,735 loans, aggregating \$45,069,708.24. The 1939 Session of the Legislature passed a new small loan act patterned after the sixth draft of the Uniform Small Loan Act in force in more or less modified form in approximately 30 of our states. This Department cooperated with the Legislature by furnishing factual information which enabled legislators to consider the merits of the bill.

Two small loan licenses were revoked in the latter part of 1939, that being in accord with our policy of requiring strict compliance with the small loan act. In our supervision of small loan companies the Department has been mindful of the fact that authorities seeking to regulate the small loan industry should be guided by two rules, i.e., the borrower must be protected against extortionate rates, and the lender must be allowed sufficient income to permit a fair return upon efficiently operated capital.

There are also under the supervision of the State Banking Department 165 credit unions. Of this number 23 credit unions were chartered during the year 1939. Four charters were dissolved. As of December 31, 1939, total assets of credit unions aggregated \$6,720,068.87, which is a substantial increase for the twelve months period.

General

The year 1939 has brought to a close an important ten-year cycle in the supervision and management of Michigan state banks. Basic changes in our internal economy, the present upheaval in Europe, and other influences, suggest that this turn of the decade may be the beginning of another distinct period in the financial field. A moderate but sustained improvement in business, if it comes, will present no great problems.

A survey of our state banking system for the past twelve months shows certain trends, whose duration and full significance cannot be foretold or measured as yet, but which are of interest—a small but somewhat surprising reduction in government bond holdings, both percentage-wise and as to dollar volume; a quite sharp increase in local loans; mounting cash reserves which were already huge and greatly in excess of requirements; as well as equally large increases in deposits.

Speaking generally, state banks continued to do relatively well, in 1939, as concerns gross earnings. However, our studies show that higher percentages of gross earnings should be realized as net earnings from current operations, and higher percentages of net earnings should find their way into undivided profits. Those in charge of bank management may well explore the possibilities of effecting reductions in expenses, taking fewer losses, and eliminating the necessity of large depreciation charges on securities.

Any considerations as to the future suggest caution. In the past, as we know, banking and industry in this country seem to have ben geared solely for expansion, not for contraction, and a shrinking economy, when it has come, has been quite unexpected and relatively painful. We should not feel that we shall never have a period of instability again. Such matters as our mounting deposits and excess cash reserves, which do not seem to have reached their peak, and banking developments which will come when the Second World War ends, for example, or when the national government ceases to borrow in excess of its income—these problems, which are merely illustrative in nature, show the necessity for careful preparedness in bank management and supervision. In all our deliberations and planning I think we should continually remind ourselves that we are the custodians of other people's money, and the nature of this trusteeship inspires great caution.

I do not wish to conclude this report without a reference to the very fine cooperation that exists between this Department and the Federal bank supervisory agencies. The cordial and mutually helpful relations existing between the State Banking Department, the Federal Reserve Banks of Chicago and Minneapolis, the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, and the office of the Comptroller of the Currency have assisted greatly in accomplishing results which have been of great benefit to this Department, and consequently to the banks under our supervision.






