Personal Income and Outlays - December and Year 1979

Personal income increased \$22.5 billion in December to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of \$2,022.5 billion, according to the Bureau of Economic Analysis, U.S. Department of Commerce. Personal outlays increased \$32.6 billion to \$1,650.1 billion.

In November, personal income increased \$20.8 billion and personal outlays increased \$16.3 billion, based on revised estimates.

# Wages and salaries

Wages and salaries increased \$12.2 billion in December, compared with \$12.9 billion in November. Commodity-producing industries' payrolls increased \$6.2 billion, compared with \$3.0 billion. Distributive industries' payrolls increased \$1.8 billion, compared with \$4.3 billion. Service industries' payrolls increased \$3.6 billion, compared with \$4.3 billion. Government wages and salaries increased \$0.6 billion, compared with \$1.2 billion.

Manufacturing payrolls increased \$4.2 billion in December, compared with \$1.7 billion in November. Higher average hourly earnings accounted for about two-thirds of the December increase. Most of the payroll gain was in the durable goods industries with most industries showing an increase.

### Nonwage income

Dividends increased \$1.0 billion in December, compared with \$0.6 billion in November. Transfer payments increased \$3.5 billion, compared with \$1.0 billion. Other nonwage income increased \$6.5 billion, compared with \$7.0 billion.

### Personal taxes and disposable personal income

Personal tax and nontax payments increased \$5.9 billion in December, compared with \$5.5 billion in November. Disposable personal income (personal income less personal tax and nontax payments) increased \$16.6 billion, compared with \$15.3 billion.

### Personal outlays and personal saving

Personal outlays -- personal consumption expenditures, interest paid by consumers to business, and personal transfer payments to foreigners (net) -- increased \$32.6 billion in December, compared with \$16.3 billion in November.

Personal consumption expenditures (PCE) increased \$32.1 billion in December, compared with \$15.9 billion in November. The acceleration in December was mainly due to goods. Purchases of durable goods increased \$6.1 billion in December, compared with no change in November. The December increase was mainly due to motor vehicles and parts. Purchases of nondurable goods increased \$17.2 billion, compared with \$10.7 billion, primarily reflecting a larger increase in food purchases. Purchases of services increased \$8.9 billion, compared with \$5.3 billion.

Personal saving (disposable personal income less personal outlays) was \$44.9 billion in December. In November, personal saving was \$60.9 billion.

# Constant-dollar estimates and the PCE implicit price deflator for November

Constant-dollar personal consumption expenditures (PCE adjusted for price changes) increased \$3.7 billion in November, following a decline of \$4.7 billion in October. The implicit price deflator for PCE increased 0.6 percent in November, compared with 0.8 percent in October. December estimates of constant dollar PCE and of the PCE deflator will be available in next month's release.

## Personal income and outlays in 1979

Personal income totaled \$1,923.1 billion in 1979, an increase of \$205.7 billion or 12.0 percent over 1978. Disposable personal income increased \$164.8 billion or 11.3 percent, and personal outlays increased \$164.0 billion or 11.8 percent.

The percent changes from the preceding year for 1978 and 1979 for the principal components of personal income and outlays are shown below.


