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## 1978 PERSONAL INCOME DATA FOR COUNTIES AND SMSA'S AVAILABLE

All of the ten Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA's) with the largest increases in total personal income from 1977 to 1978 were located west of the Mississippi River and five were in the Far West Region. All except Phoenix, AZ were SMSA's with populations less than 350,000. Farm income was a major factor in the increases for four of the ten: Bismarck, ND; Greeley, CO; Salinas-Seaside-Monterey, CA; and Yakima, WA.

Total personal income continued to increase more rapidly for non-SMSA counties than for SMSA counties. Total personal income for non-SMSA counties, which accounted for 22 percent of total personal income in the U.S. in 1978, increased 13.3 percent from 1977 to 1978. Total personal income for SMSA counties increased 12.0 percent.

In all except two of the Nation's 273 SMSA's, personal income increases exceeded the 6.8 percent increase in consumer prices, as measured by the national implicit price deflator for personal consumption expenditures. The two SMSA's were: Anchorage, AK, 0.9 percent; and Pascagoula-Moss Point, MS, 6.6 percent.

Per capita personal income

Seven of the ten SMSA's with the highest per capita personal incomes in 1978 were west of the Mississippi River. Five were in the Far West Region: Reno, NV; San Francisco-Oakland, CA; San Jose, CA; Salinas-Seaside-Monterey, CA; and Seattle-Everett, WA. Only three of the ten were among the Nation's ten largest SMSA's in terms of population: Detroit, MI; San Francisco-Oakland, CA; and Washington, DC-MD-VA.

Although Anchorage, Alaska ranked last among SMSA's in percent change in total personal income from 1977 to 1978 (0.9 percent), it remained first in per capita personal income (\$11,839). Reflecting in part Alaska's higher-than-average cost of living, Anchorage's per capita personal income was 51 percent above the national average of \$7,840. (The national average includes both SMSA and non-SMSA counties.) McAllen-Pharr-Edinburg, Texas had the lowest per capita personal income with \$4,323, 45 percent below the national average.

Per capita personal income for all SMSA's was \$8,343, six percent above the national average; per capita personal income for non-SMSA counties was \$6,440, 18 percent below the national average.

Note: Total personal income consists of private and government wage and salary payments in cash and in kind, other labor income, farm and nonfarm proprietors' income, personal interest income, rental income of persons, dividends, and transfer payments, less personal contributions for social insurance. It is measured before the deduction of personal income or other personal taxes, and is reported in current dollars (no adjustment is made for price changes).

Per capita personal income equals total personal income divided by total population.
