Personal Income and Outlays - May 1984

Personal income increased \$17.8 billion in May to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of \$2,978.8 billion, according to the Commerce Department's Bureau of Economic Analysis. Personal outlays increased \$24.9 billion to \$2,415.3 billion. In April, personal income increased \$17.2 billion and personal outlays increased \$36.6 billion, based on revised estimates.

Wages and salaries

Wages and salaries increased \$8.7 billion in May, compared with \$21.5 billion in April. Commodity-producing industries' payrolls increased \$2.6 billion, compared with \$8.0 billion. Distributive industries' payrolls increased \$3.6 billion, compared with \$5.1 billion. Service industries' payrolls increased \$0.9 billion, compared with \$7.0 billion. Government wages and salaries increased \$1.5 billion, compared with \$1.4 billion.

Manufacturing payrolls increased \$0.6 billion in May, compared with \$5.7 billion in April. Employment and hourly earnings increased and weekly hours decreased.

Nonwage income

Farm proprietors' income declined \$0.4 billion in May, compared with a decline of \$15.3 billion in April. The decline in both months reflected the return to a normal level following several months of unusually large government subsidy payments to farmers under the Payment-in-Kind Program. Nonfarm proprietors' income increased \$0.6 billion, compared with \$1.7 billion. Personal interest income increased \$5.3 billion, compared with \$5.5 billion. Transfer payments increased \$1.7 billion, compared with \$1.8 billion. All other nonwage income increased \$2.5 billion, compared with \$3.2 billion.

Personal taxes and disposable personal income

Personal tax and nontax payments increased \$4.5 billion in May, compared with \$2.8 billion in April. Disposable personal income -- personal income less personal tax and nontax payments -- increased \$13.3 billion, compared with \$14.4 billion.

Personal outlays and personal saving

Personal outlays -- personal consumption expenditures, interest paid by consumers to business, and personal transfer payments to foreigners (net) -- increased \$24.9 billion in May, compared with \$36.6 billion in April.

Personal consumption expenditures (PCE) increased \$24.4 billion in May, compared with \$36.1 billion in April. Purchases of durable goods increased \$13.6 billion, compared with \$7.1 billion; the larger increase in May was due to a large increase in automobile purchases, which had decreased slightly in April. Purchases of nondurable goods increased \$4.0 billion, compared with \$20.2 billion; the larger increase in April was due to a large increase in food purchases, which had no change in May. Purchases of services increased \$6.9 billion, compared with \$8.8 billion.

Personal saving -- disposable personal income less outlays -- was \$133.4 billion in May, compared with \$145.1 billion in April.

Constant-dollar estimates and the PCE implicit price deflator for April

Constant-dollar disposable personal income -- disposable personal income adjusted to remove price changes -- increased \$5.0 billion in April, compared with \$2.3 billion in March.

Constant-dollar personal consumption expenditures -- PCE adjusted to remove price changes -- increased \$15.0 billion in April, compared with a decline of \$1.7 billion in March. The implicit price deflator for PCE increased 0.1 percent, compared with 0.4 percent.

May estimates of constant-dollar disposable income and PCE, and of the implicit price deflator, will be available in next month's release.

Revisions

Estimates have been revised for January through April. Changes in personal income, personal outlays, and personal saving -- revised and as published in last month's release -- are shown below.
