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## WAGES AND HOURS OF LABOR IN COTTON-GOODS MANUFACTURING: 1924

### INTRODUCTION AND SUMMARY

During the early months of 1924 a survey of the hours of labor and earnings in the cotton-goods manufacturing industry was made and figures compiled by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics. Data for 77,995 wage earners employed in 114 representative cotton mills are shown in this bulletin. These mills are located in 12 different States. Pay periods were covered for 96 mills in January, 17 mills in February, and 1 mill in March.

Wages have been generally increased since January 1, 1923. Of the 114 mills canvassed only 22 reported no change in rates during that period. An increase of 10 per cent was made by 44 mills, 12½ per cent by 41 mills, and the other 7 mills reported increases from 5 to 15 per cent. The increases averaged approximately 13 per cent. Average hourly earnings in the industry as a whole were 151 per cent higher in 1924 than in 1913. At the same time they were approximately 23 per cent lower than in 1920. Table 1 shows the index numbers of average full-time hours per week, earnings per hour, and full-time weekly earnings in the industry in specified years from 1910 to 1924.

Previous reports of this bureau <sup>1</sup> have presented wages and hours of labor in the industry from 1890 to 1918 for both manufacturing and finishing. Since 1918 data for finishing have not been collected.

Summaries are shown for each year from 1910 to 1924, except 1915, 1917, 1919, 1921, and 1923, for which years no data were obtained.

Table 2 shows a summary of available data for the principal occupations in the years 1910 to 1924, inclusive, covering average earnings per hour, average full-time earnings per week, and average and classified full-time hours per week. The classification is shown by percentages.

Referring to the occupation of mule spinners as illustrative of the figures shown in the table, hourly earnings in 1910 were 21.9 cents and gradually increased from year to year until 1920 when the high point, 82.6 cents, was reached. In 1922 the rate dropped to 63.8 cents and in 1924 increased to 74.6 cents per hour.

Average full-time hours per week of mule spinners in 1910 were 57 and decreased from year to year until in 1920 they reached the low point of 48.9. In 1922 the average was 50 and in 1924 they had dropped again to 49.1.

The classified hours for the same occupation shows that 53 per cent of the employees in 1910 worked over 54 and under 57 hours per week and the remaining 47 per cent worked longer hours. In 1920, 85 per cent worked only 48 hours per week and 15 per cent worked 54 hours.

The other occupations may be studied in a similar manner.

In Table 3 the average earnings per hour and a classification of employees, in percentage form, by hourly rates, are shown for male mule spinners, female frame spinners, and both male and female weavers for all available years from 1910 to 1924. These occupations are probably the most typical in the industry and have been selected as examples to show the spread of individual hourly earnings.





Index numbers have been computed for full-time hours per week, full-time weekly earnings, and earnings per hour for all occupations for which data are available 1910 to 1924, inclusive, and are shown in Table 4. These index numbers are based on the averages shown in Table 1 and are percentages in which the figures for 1913 are used as the base, or 100 per cent; that is, the index number for each year is the per cent that the average for that year is of the average for 1913.

The figures for 1913 are used as the base in order to bring into direct comparison the earlier and later years with the year immediately preceding the beginning of the World War.

The figures for the industry as a whole have been shown in Table 1.

In Table 5 are shown the average and classified days the mills canvassed were in operation and the number of days idle by specified causes for the year ending December 31, 1923. Of the 114 establishments reported, 67 operated 300 or more days, and 104 operated 270 or more days.

The most important cause of idleness was slack business and the next important cause was holidays and vacations. The mills averaged 294.8 days in operation and 18.2 week days idle. South Carolina led, with an average of 310 days operated, and New Hampshire showed the lowest average, 250.2 days.

Table 6 presents the number of calendar days on which the mills operated and the employees worked and shows the opportunity afforded for work and the regularity on the part of the employees. Data are shown for four selected occupational groups only, but these groups may be accepted as representative of all employees in this respect.

There are two sections of the table. The first section relates to a one-week pay period, the second to a two-week pay period. A two-week pay period was taken for all weavers because of more or less unfinished work carried over from week to week.

Of the 114 establishments canvassed, 8 had pay periods of 2 weeks and 106 paid each week. In the one-week section of the table the mills employing mule spinners operated an average of 5.7 days in that occupation and for female frame spinners, the average of the mills was 5.2. The employees in these occupations averaged 5.6 and 4.3 days, respectively.

In the two-week section the average of the mills for both male and female weavers was 11.5 days. The male weavers worked on an average of 9.8 days and the female weavers 9.6 days.

Table 7 shows the number of establishments, number of employees, average earnings per hour, average full-time hours, average hours worked, per cent of full-time worked, average actual earnings, and average full-time earnings for all employees, by States, in separate sections for the one-week and the two-week pay periods.

These figures are for the industry. It will be noted that the average hourly earnings are higher in that section of the table containing the two-week pay periods. This is accounted for by the fact that data for all weavers were taken for two weeks. This being a high-paid occupation, the higher earnings have been reflected in the averages for all occupations. The object of this table is not to show a comparison between one-week and two-week pay periods, but to show actual time worked and earnings as compared with the hours and earnings that would have been shown had all employees worked full-time.

### EXPLANATION OF SCOPE AND METHOD

This report includes data from establishments which make woven cotton goods having a wide range of weight and quality but not including narrow goods and novelties. All data were obtained from the pay rolls and records of the various establishments by agents of the bureau.

The number of establishments included in the reports has varied since 1910 as follows:

The number of establishments covered has varied from year to year, but even the lowest number is believed to be fairly representative.

In the selection of establishments from which to obtain data, all States in which cotton manufacturing is of material importance have been represented, the measure of importance being the number of wage earners as reported by the United States Census of Manufactures.

Table 8 shows by States the number of wage earners in the industry as reported by the United States Census of Manufactures for 1921, the number of establishments from which the bureau obtained data for 1924, and the number of employees in such establishments.

According to the census figures, about 93 per cent of the total number of wage earners in the industry are found in the States in which the establishments furnishing information to the Bureau of Labor Statistics are located. The number of employees for which the bureau obtained 1924 data and for which detailed information for 1924 is here presented is about 19 per cent of the total as shown by the 1921 census.

Full-time hours per week are the regular hours during which, under normal conditions, employees are on duty. Such hours do not in any way indicate the extent of employment. Employees may work overtime or broken time, or be laid off, or a temporary reduction may be made in working hours without affecting the full-time hours as here presented.

The rates of wages or earnings per hour as shown include the wages of time workers and the earnings of piece workers and are obtained by dividing the total earnings by the total number of hours worked.

In cases where no record of the actual time worked was regularly kept, the establishments, at the request of the bureau, kept a record for the pay period selected. The full-time earnings per week are the earnings of employees working full time, or the earnings on broken time reduced to equivalent earnings for a full week. Figures relating to wages and hours are shown separately for 19 of the more important occupations, and all employees not included under any of the selected occupations are combined and shown under "Other employees." The occupations are arranged in the tables approximately in the order of manufacture, as follows:

Although an employee may have worked on as many different days as the mill was in operation, he or she may not have worked the full mill-hours each day, or even on any day. Such employees as did not work on as many days as mill in which they worked operated are omitted from the table.
