Introduction

The references given on the following pages have been selected with the view of listing only the publications of the Bureau of Labor Statistics which seem to be of most general present-day interest. Also, only the most recent publications are noted in those cases where, over the period of its existence, the Bureau has issued several reports on the same subject. The entries are grouped by topics, and where a particular publication deals with more than one topic the entry has been repeated. References to articles in the *Monthly Labor Review* (indicated by the letters M. L. R.) cover the issues down to and including October 1936.

The Bureau has a limited number of its bulletins for distribution, and as long as the supply lasts they are furnished free upon request. This also applies to the *Labor Information Bulletin* and to single copies of the *Monthly Labor Review*. Regular distribution of the *Review*, however, is on a subscription basis, the subscriptions being handled by the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. Many of the articles in the *Monthly Labor Review* have been reprinted as separate pamphlets in order to avoid the necessity of sending out copies of the complete *Review* in response to requests for information on particular subjects only, and also to make the material available in more convenient form. For the same reasons, individual chapters of some of the bulletins have likewise been reprinted, as, for example, in the case of the 1936 edition of the *Handbook of Labor Statistics* (Bul. 616). These reprints are furnished free by the Bureau, upon request.

Although the free-distribution supply of some of the publications noted in this list is exhausted (indicated by an asterisk), most if

not all of them, except the pamphlet reprints, can be purchased at a nominal charge from the Superintendent of Documents, or consulted in local libraries, many of which are depositories for publications of the Federal Government.

A complete list of all bulletins and special reports of the Bureau of Labor Statistics, and of the other Bureaus and Divisions of the Department of Labor, is given in a pamphlet issued at frequent intervals by the Department. A detailed index to the articles in the *Monthly Labor Review* is published for each volume (6 numbers).

The 1929, 1931, and 1936 editions (Buls. 491, *541, 616) present similar summarizations for the intervening intervals. The material contained in these volumes represents in large part the original work of the Bureau of Labor Statistics, but this is not entirely the case, as the Bureau does not attempt to cover certain fields of labor interest which are already adequately covered by other official agencies. Digests of some of the published reports of these other agencies, therefore, as well as of certain responsible private bodies, have been included to give a well-rounded picture of labor and related conditions.

Index numbers for groups of these commodities are issued weekly in a press release; indexes for groups and subgroups of commodities are published monthly in a printed pamphlet, which also includes data on purchasing power of the dollar at wholesale; actual prices of the 784 items are issued monthly in mimeographed form and printed semiannually, in the June and December pamphlets on wholesale prices.
