Union Wages and Hours in the Baking Industry, July 1, 1947

Summary

Wage rates of union bakery workers averaged \$1.13 an hour on July 1, 1947, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics' annual survey of union scales in the baking industry. In the same month, average hourly earnings of both union and nonunion labor amounted to \$1.07.1

The pay scales for practically all union workers were advanced between July 1, 1946 and July 1, 1947, usually from 10 to 20 percent an hour. In both years, at least half of the workers had hourly rates of \$1 or more but the proportion with the dollar or higher minimum was somewhat greater in 1947 than in 1946. The average increase over the year of 14 percent—14 cents an hour—brought the index of hourly wage rates to 160.6 (June 1, 1939=100).

Scope and Method

The present study of the baking industry is one of several union wage studies conducted annually by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Seventy-five cities ranging in population from 40,000 to over a million and located in 40 States and the District of Columbia are included in the current studies.

Bread baking was the only branch of the industry studied prior to 1939. In that year, however, a complete coverage of all occupations (except delivery drivers and plant maintenance workers) was made in all branches of the industry. A further modification of the study since 1941 has been the presentation of data by type of baking, e. g., hand shop, machine shop, pie and pastry shop, cracker and cooky shop, Hebrew baking, and other specialized (national) baking such as French, Polish, Bohemian, Scandinavian, Spanish, and Italian.

The information presented in this report is based on union wage scales in effect on July 1, 1947 covering 68,567 union bakery workers in 69 of the 75 cities surveyed by the Bureau. In 60 of these cities data were obtained by field representatives; in the other 9 cities, through mail questionnaires.

Union scales are defined as the minimum wage rates or maximum schedule of hours agreed upon through collective bargaining between employers and trade unions. Rates in excess of the agreed minimum which may be paid to union members because of long service, for special qualifications, or for other reasons, are excluded.

Bread and cake hand shops constitute 11 percent of the total membership tabulated, bread and cake machine shops 58 percent, pie and pastry shops 3 percent, Hebrew baking 7 percent, other specialized bake shops 3 percent and cracker and cooky shops 18 percent.

Average rates per hour shown in this report are based on all rates reported in effect on July 1, 1947; the individual rates were weighted by the number of union members working at such rates. In contrast, the increases in cents per hour and in percentage terms from July 1, 1946, to July 1, 1947, are based on the specific rates for 1946 and 1947

only where comparable data were available for both years. Data for 1946 and 1947 were weighted by membership reported in 1947.

Variation in Pay Scales, by Type of Baking

This study includes all bakery workers who process or assist in the preparation and processing of the bakery products. The occupational composition of the work force differs from shop-toshop, depending upon type of product, size of the shop, and extent of mechanization. All of these factors affect the level of union scales. Unionization among specialized bake shops occurs in less than a third of the 69 cities surveyed while bread and cake machine shops were organized in most cities. It is important, therefore, to consider separately wage scales in the various branches of the industry-Hebrew, and other national baking; bread and cake, hand and machine: pie and pastry; and cracker and cooky. To some extent, rate levels are affected by the geographic location and size of city in which the

shops are located. For example, regardless of type of baking, rates of union workers in New York and San Francisco were generally among the highest.

Hourly rates of 97 percent of the union bakery workers were advanced between July 1, 1946, and July 1, 1947. However, about a sixth of the pie and pastry workers, primarily those employed in shops in Detroit, did not receive an increase during the 1-year period. In the other branches of

the industry, only a small proportion of workers, usually less than 5 percent, did not receive pay boosts. The typical increases varied from 5 to 25 percent (see table 3).

While there is a wide range in hourly rates—from less than 60 cents to over \$2—pay scales for more than half of the bakery workers fell between 80 cents and \$1.20. Only 15 percent of the workers, predominantly those in national bake shops, received as much as \$1.50 an hour.

National Baking

As in previous years, union workers engaged in Hebrew bake shops had the highest average pay scale, \$1.77 an hour, among the various branches of the industry. Although hourly rates ranged from less than 60 cents an hour to over \$2, better than 8 out of every 10 workers had a rate of \$1.60 and above, and 17 percent at least \$2 an hour.

Among the 18 cities in which workers in Hebrew shops were organized, rates varied from \$1.14 in St. Louis to \$2.13 in Detroit; in 9 other cities average rates exceeded \$1.50 an hour. No increase was negotiated during the 1-year period, July 1, 1946, to July 1, 1947, in St. Louis and four New England cities—New Haven, Springfield, Providence, and Worcester. In other cities, advances in pay scales ranged from 5 percent in Pittsburgh to 15 percent in Rochester, hourly rate increases of 6 and 24 cents, respectively.

Pay scales of workers in other national bake shops (Polish, Bohemian, French, etc.)² averaged \$1.45, ranking second to Hebrew shops. The highest city average, \$1.57 an hour, was in Detroit; the lowest, 79 cents, in Tampa, Fla. Wage rates of those employed in shops in Tampa have always been considerably lower than workers in other cities included in this branch of the industry. In five other cities, the average rate was at least \$1.36 an hour. The amount of hourly rate increase from July 1,1946, varied from 6 cents in Tampa to 15 cents in Buffalo, San Francisco, Detroit, and Chicago.

Bread and Cake

From the viewpoint of volume of employment, bread and cake baking by machine methods is by far the most important. Nearly three-fifths of the union labor force were employed in these shops. Most rates in such shops fell within a 50-cent interval, 80 cents to \$1.30; the average for the entire group was \$1.08.

Among the 66 cities in which union bread and cake machine shops are located, average rates ranged from 79 cents in Norfolk to \$1.40 in San Francisco. Wage levels in other Pacific Coast cities closely approximated the San Francisco average. In 23 cities, principally those located in southern States, where unionization is less advanced, average rates were less than \$1.

In all but eight cities, the increase in hourly rates between July 1, 1946, and July 1, 1947, was at least 10 cents an hour, and in Houston and Newark averaged 26 cents. Generally, the pay boosts exceeded 10 and frequently 15 percent.

The average rate for workers in hand shops was considerably higher than the level of pay in machine shops (table 2). This same relationship was fairly consistent within individual cities. In part, this can be attributed to the fact that proportionately more workers in the hand shops have higher skills or are more versatile than in machine shops. Over half of the workers in hand shops had an hourly scale ranging from \$1.30 to \$1.60.

Comparisons in hand shops are limited to 35 cities. New York with an average rate of \$1.63 ranked highest; San Francisco with \$1.54 was second; while Baltimore and Boston with average rates of 88 and 84 cents, respectively, were the lowest ranking.

Increases in pay scales since July 1, 1946 were generally between 10 and 15 percent; unusually large rate changes in Houston (47 percent) and in South Bend (28 percent) meant an average hourly pay boost to the organized workers of 38 and 31 cents, respectively. Des Moines and Toledo with average rates of 93 cents and \$1.09 were the only cities in which the pay scales were not raised during the year.

Other Baking

Average rates for the cracker and cooky shop workers are lower than those in any other branch. This is partially explained by the fact that a large proportion of the work force are women who perform routine jobs such as wrapping and packing. Scales for most of the workers were concentrated between 70 cents and \$1.

Contract negotiations occurring between July 1, 1946 and July 1, 1947 raised the levels in individual cities from 5 to 24 cents. There was less variation between cities in this branch than in the other segments of the industry. Average rates ranged from 70 cents in Scranton to \$1.09 in New York.

Union workers in pie and pastry shops also had comparatively low wage scales. One-quarter of the workers had rates between 70 and 80 cents. While rates for a third of them were \$1.00 or more, only 1 out of every 30 workers had a pay scale of \$1.50 or more.

Among 22 cities, average rates ranged from 75 cents in Duluth up to \$1.66 in San Francisco. The Rock Island, Illinois District,³ the next highest in rank, showed an average rate of \$1.26. Hourly rates were advanced 11 percent or more in all cities except Detroit, South Bend, and Chicago. In Detroit, the increase was only a fractional percent; in the other 2 cities, about 7 percent.

Straight-Time Weekly Hours

On July 1, 1947, a straight-time workweek of 40 hours was typical of bread and cake machine shops, pie and pastry shops, and cracker and cooky shops which together account for seven-tenths of the union workers studied.

In Hebrew bake shops, the workweek for about half of the workers was 48 hours, although a third worked from 44 to 48 hours before receiving premium overtime pay. In other national bake shops the 48-hour workweek was most prevalent; approximately half of the workers were on a 48-hour schedule while two-fifths were on 40 hours. Wider variations in straight-time weekly hours were more apparent in the bread and cake hand shops than in any other branch. Approximately 40 percent of the workers in hand shops averaged 48 hours; 25 percent, 40 hours; while another 25 percent had a workweek ranging between 40 and 44 hours.

No changes in hours were negotiated between July 1, 1946 and July 1, 1947, for workers in the cracker and cooky branch or in other national bake shops. In Hebrew bake shops, hour decreases affected less than 4 percent of the membership, and, in hand and machine bread and cake

Union Scales of Wages and Hours by City and Occupation

Table 12 presents effective union scales of wages per hour and hours per week as of July 1, 1947, and July 1, 1946, for each classification of bakery workers, by type of baking, in each of the 69 cities included in the survey. In some cases, two or more rates for the same classification in the same city are shown. This occurs when two different local unions have different scales for the same classification, or a particular union may have several agreements with different employers, or both situations exist. All effective scales were listed and the letters A, B, C, etc., were used to designate the different quotations. quence of the letters does not indicate the relative importance of the quotations or unions so designated.
