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Preface

The Bureau of Labor Statistics conducts annual surveys of wage rates and scheduled hours of work for specified crafts or jobs as provided in labor-management agreements in four industries: Building construction, printing, local transit, and local trucking. These studies present the wage rates in effect on July 1, as reported to the Bureau by the appropriate local labor organizations in each of the cities included in the survey.

Preliminary listings of union wage rates and hours for local truckdrivers and helpers in 68 cities were issued within a few months of the reference date for the current survey (July 1, 1970). Copies of these are available from the Bureau of Labor Statistics, Washington, D.C. 20212, or any of its regional offices listed on the inside back cover of this report.

This study was conducted in the Bureau's Office of Wages and Industrial Relations. The bulletin, which provides a comprehensive account of the current study and includes indexes of wages and hours for the period 1936-70, was prepared by Thomas C. Mobley in the Division of Occupational Wage Structures.

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Union Wages and Hours:

Local Truckdrivers and Helpers, July 1, 1970

Summary

Union wage rates for local truckdrivers and helpers in cities of 100,000 inhabitants or more averaged \$4.36 an hour on July 1, 1970, up 10 percent, or 40 cents, over the previous year. Beginning with July 1970, the wage rate index for drivers and helpers was calculated on a 1967=100 base, the previously used base was 1957-59=100. On the new base (1967=100), the index for July 1970 is 122.5. The index was 177.5 on the 1957-59 base.¹

Nearly all workers covered by the survey were granted wage increases during the 1969-70 period. Increases varied considerably—an eighth of the workers received increases of less than 5 percent and about one-tenth were granted increases of 15 percent or more (table 4). In the array of increases, the most frequently reported were between 12 and 14 percent.

The advance of 40 cents in the average hourly wage rates for the year ending July 1, 1970, was the largest since the local trucking surveys began in 1936. The percentage gain in wage levels for the 1969-70 period (10 percent) exceeded the advance in 1968-69 (5.9 percent) and was the largest annual increase since 1946-47 (15.4 percent).

Since 1960, union wage rates for local truckdrivers and helpers advanced at an annual rate of 5 percent. It amounted to 3.9 percent for the first half of the decade contrasted to 6.1 percent during the 1966-70 period. The following tabulation shows the pattern of wage rate increases for drivers and helpers during the decade:

Hourly wage rates for truckdrivers averaged \$4.41 on July 1, 1970: an increase of 40 cents or 10.0 percent during the year. Truckdrivers' helpers averaged \$3.91 an hour, up 36 cents or 10.0 percent. Truckdrivers' helpers, who constituted about 10 percent of the workers covered by the survey, were mostly found in general freight, beer and newspaper deliveries, and in construction equipment hauling. Where comparisons were possible within the same area and truck operation (e.g., beer delivery), wage rates for drivers and their helpers usually varied by 20 cents an hour or less. (See table 10.)

Regional and city averages of the union rates for all types of truckdrivers and helpers covered by collective bargaining agreements within scope of the survey are presented in tables 7 and 8. These averages reflect not only differences in wage rates among individual cities, but differences in the occupational composition of the two groups. The occupational composition frequently influences area averages more than do the actual differences in rates for individual classifications. The average for truckdrivers, for example, in one city may include the rates for several different types of trucks with widely different wage rates; in another city, it may include only one or two types of trucks. In such instances, averages for the two cities may differ substantially even though the rates for comparable types of trucks are the same. Table 10 presents, by city, data for specific types of truckdrivers and helpers, and provides the best means of intercity comparisons at this level.

Weekly work schedules at straight-time rates averaged 40 hours for both truckdrivers and helpers (table 6). Ninety-seven percent of the employees in each classification had work schedules of 40 hours a week. Work schedules of fewer than 40 hours (usually 35

or 37½ hours a week) frequently were reported for beer and newspaper delivery, and longer schedules (mostly 45 or 48 hours) often were found for bakery and fuel oil delivery.

Contract provisions for employer-financed health and welfare and pension plans applied to most of the workers covered by the survey. When available, information on these plans is presented in table 10, which lists amount of employer contributions to these benefits by city and type of driver or helper.

Scope and Method of Study

Union wage rates and hours are those agreed on through collective bargaining between trade unions and employers, and are defined as (1) the basic (minimum) rates (excluding holiday, vacation, or other benefit payments regularly made or credited to the worker each pay period), and (2) the maximum schedules of hours at straight-time rates. Rates exceeding the negotiated minimum, which may be paid for special qualifications or other reasons, are not included.

The information presented in this bulletin was based on union rates in effect on July 1, 1970, and covered approximately 320,000 drivers and 35,000 helpers in 68 cities. The study excluded local city drivers paid on a mileage or commission basis and over-the-road drivers operating between cities or various parts of the United States.

Data were obtained primarily from local union officials by mail questionnaire; in some instances, Bureau economists visited local union officials to obtain the desired information.

The current survey was designed to reflect union wage rates of local truckdrivers and helpers in all cities of 100,000 inhabitants or more excluding Honolulu, based on the 1960 Census of Population. All cities with 500,000 inhabitants or more were studied, as were most cities in the 250,000 to 500,000 group. The cities selected for study in the 100,000 to 250,000 group were distributed widely throughout the United States. Data for some cities were weighted to compensate for cities which were not surveyed. To provide appropriate representation in the combination of data, each region was considered separately when city weights were assigned.

Average hourly wage rates, designed to show current rate levels, were based on wage rates in effect on July 1, 1970. Individual rates were weighted by the number of union members at each rate. These averages are not designed for precise year-to-year comparisons because of fluctuations in membership and in classifications studied. Average cents-per-hour and percent changes from July 1, 1969, to July 1, 1970, however, were based on comparable quotations for the various occupational classifications in both periods, weighted by the membership reported for the current (1970) survey. The index series, designed for trend purposes, was similarly constructed.

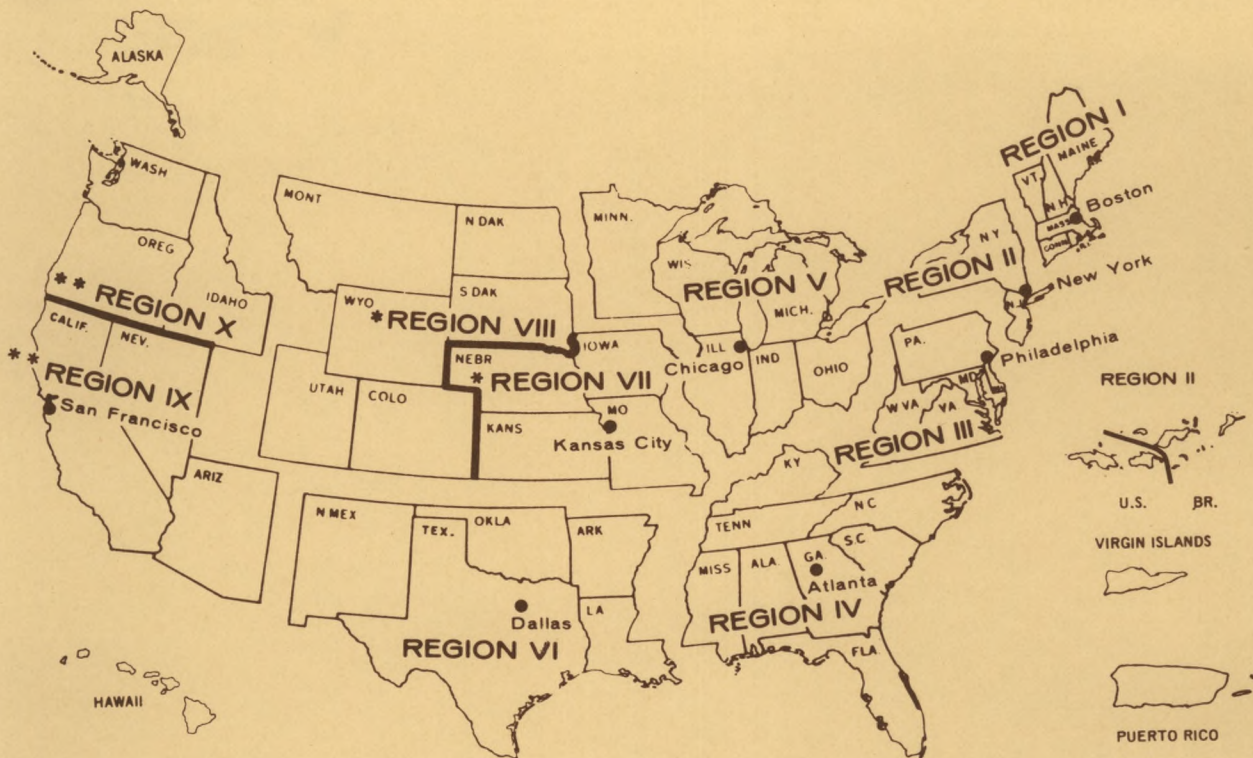
