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## Preface

The Bureau of Labor Statistics conducts annual surveys of union wage rates and weekly straight-time hours of work for specified crafts or jobs as provided in labor-management agreements in the building construction, printing, local transit, and local trucking industries. A biennial survey of grocery stores is also included in this program. These studies present the wage rates in effect on July 1, as reported to the Bureau by the appropriate local labor organization officials in each of the cities surveyed.

Preliminary listings of union wage rates and hours for local truckdrivers and helpers in 68 cities were issued earlier. Copies of these are available from the Bureau of Labor Statistics, Washington, D.C. 20212, or any of its regional offices listed on the inside back cover of this bulletin.

This study was conducted in the Bureau's Office of Wages and Industrial Relations. The bulletin, which provides a comprehensive account of the current study and includes indexes of wage rates and hours for the period 1936-71, was prepared by John F. Fitsock in the Division of Occupational Wage Structures.

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## Local Truckdrivers and Helpers

### Summary

Union wage rates for local truckdrivers and helpers in cities of 100,000 inhabitants or more averaged \$4.90 an hour on July 1, 1971, up 12.5 percent, or 54 cents, from the previous year. The 12.5 percent gain—the largest annual increase since the 15.4 percent rise in 1946-47—raised the Bureau's index of union wage rates for truckdrivers and helpers to 137.8 (1967=100). The index for truckdrivers rose to 137.9 and for helpers to 138.8. (See table 1.)

About 90 percent of the workers covered by the survey were granted wage increases during the 1970-71 period. Increases varied considerably—one-sixth of the workers received increases of less than 8 percent and about one-seventh were granted increases of 18 percent or more. (See table 5.) In the array of increases, those most frequently reported were between 16 and 18 percent.

Since 1961, union wage rates for local truckdrivers and helpers have advanced at an average annual rate of 5.8 percent. The advance amounted to 3.8 percent for 1961-66 contrasted with 7.9 percent during the 1966-71 period. Text table 1 shows the pattern of wage rate increases for drivers and helpers during the decade.

Hourly wage rates for truckdrivers averaged \$4.95 on July 1, 1971, an increase of 55 cents or 12.4 percent during the year.

Truckdrivers' helpers averaged \$4.41 an hour, up 52 cents or 13.4 percent. Truckdrivers' helpers, constituting about 10 percent of the workers covered by the survey, were found mostly in general freight, beer and newspaper delivery, and in construction equipment hauling. Where comparisons were possible within the same area and type of operation (e.g., beer delivery), wage rates for helpers usually differed from drivers' rates by 20 cents an hour or less. (See table 10.)

Regional and city averages of union rates for all types of truckdrivers and helpers covered by the survey are presented in tables 7 and 8. These averages reflect not only differences in wage rates among cities, but differences in occupational composition as well. Frequently, area averages are influenced more by occupational composition than by the actual differences in rates for individual classifications. For example, the average for truckdrivers in one city may include the rates for several different types of trucks with widely different wage rates; in another city, it may include only one or two types of trucks. In such instances, averages for the two cities may differ substantially even though the rates for comparable types of trucks are the same. Table 10 presents, by city, data for specific types of truckdrivers and helpers, and provides the best means of intercity comparison at this level.

Weekly work schedules at straight-time rates averaged about 40 hours for both truckdrivers and helpers. (See table 6.) Ninety-seven percent of the employees in each classification had work schedules of 40 hours a week. Work schedules of fewer than 40 hours (usually 35 or 37½ hours a week) frequently were reported for beer and newspaper delivery, and longer schedules (mostly 44 or 48 hours) most often were found for bakery and milk delivery.

Contract provisions for employer-financed health and welfare and pension plans applied to most of the workers covered by the survey. When available, information on these plans is presented in table 10, which lists the amount of employer contributions to these benefits by city and type of driver or helper.

## **Scope and method of study**

Union wage rates and hours are those agreed on through collective bargaining between trade unions and employers, and are defined as (1) the basic (minimum) rates (excluding holiday, vacation, or other benefit payments made regularly or credited to the worker each pay period), and (2) the maximum schedules of hours at straight-time rates. Rates exceeding the negotiated minimum, which may be paid for special qualifications or other reasons, are not included.

The information presented in this bulletin was based on union rates in effect on July 1, 1971, covering approximately 315,000 drivers and 34,000 helpers in 68 cities. The study excluded local city drivers paid on a mileage or commission basis and over-the-road drivers operating between cities or various parts of the United States. Data were obtained primarily from local union officials by mail questionnaire; in some instances, Bureau economists visited local union officials to obtain the desired information.

The current survey was designed to reflect union wage rates in local trucking in all cities of 100,000 inhabitants or more excluding

Honolulu, based on the 1960 Census of Population. All cities that have 500,000 inhabitants or more were included, as were most cities with 250,000 to 500,000 inhabitants. The cities selected for study from those having 100,000 to 250,000 inhabitants were distributed widely throughout the United States. Data for some cities were weighted to compensate for cities not surveyed. In order to provide appropriate regional representation, each region was considered separately when city weights were assigned.

Average wage rates, designed to show current rate levels, were based on wage rates in effect on July 1, 1971. The wage rates were weighted by the number of union members at each rate in the area. These averages were not designed for precise year-to-year comparisons because of fluctuations in membership and in job classifications studied. Average cents-per-hour and percent changes from July 1, 1970, to July 1, 1971, however, were based on comparable quotations for the various occupational classifications in both periods, weighted by the membership reported for the current (1971) survey. The index series, designed for trend purposes, was similarly constructed.


