Twenty-one years ago a small but determined group organized the Security Traders Association of New York, Inc., now affectionately known all over the country as STANY.

The purposes for which the corporation was formed were:

(1) To promote the general welfare of its members to establish and maintain high standards of conduct and ethical practices in the trading division of the investment security and banking business.

(2) To provide the benefits which are derived from personal acquaintance b e t w e e n those Na who are engaged in such business.

(3) To afford the means of discussing matters relating thereto and to become a Member and promote the objects and purposes of the National Security Traders Association, Inc.

From the outset, due to the tremendous drive and plenty of sweat by the founders, STANY grew by leaps and bounds.

After a few years a Gratuity Fund was established whereby in event of death of a Member, his next of kin immediately receives a benefit of \$1,000. Today the assets of this fund are in the six figures and growing rapidly. The formation of the STANY Bowling League

In 1951, Ray Kenny started the first STANY magazine. In addition, this masterful magazine covers such other timely articles as a description of the new "Standard 500" written by an executive of the company originating the most modern of averages; a complete roster of STANY members together with their affiliations, phone and teletype members, which, in itself, will make the magazine a "must" on some 5,000 desks throughout the nation; a complete list of the predictions of the D-J Averages a year hence, as some 1,500 Traders see them, or hope to see them; a very interesting burlesque on how to read a financial report and what the various phrases really mean; a glossary of definitions of the various jobs which make up the industry, as well as a brand new treatment of the present and future markets by Sidney B. Lurie, one of the street's most competent analytical minds, and which is certain to evoke a great deal of comment for its breeziness.

Today STANY has a membership of 600 Regular Members, 100 Associate Members and a waiting list for both. Our Officers and Board of Directors totaling 15 in number meet once a month. Any member is welcome to come before the Board at any time with suggestions or criticisms.

We are proud that STANY is constantly working to elevate the standards of our business and the individual trader. We are continuously and most seriously studying the aspects of our industry which need improvement and striving for more equitable treatment by revision of existing laws. 

Thomas A. Larkin Wins **STANY'S Forecast Award**


