

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Price Movements

February 1985

The Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) increased 0.4 percent before seasonal adjustment in February to a level of 317.4 (1967 = 100). For the 12-month period ended in February, the CPI-U has increased 3.5 percent.

The Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) rose 0.4 percent in February, prior to seasonal adjustment. The February 1985 CPI-W level of 313.9 was 3.5 percent higher than the index in February 1984. The CPI-W is used for indexing Social Security and some other Federal payments. It is also commonly used as an escalator in collective bargaining agreements.

CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U)—seasonally adjusted changes

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI for All Urban Consumers advanced 0.3 percent in February. This compares with a 0.2-percent rise in January and is the same as the average monthly increase since the slowdown in prices began in October 1981. Increases in the food and beverage and housing components were larger in February than in recent months, and apparel prices rose sharply. Partially offsetting these advances were declines in the indexes for transportation—reflecting a sharp drop in gasoline prices—and entertainment. The other goods and services component registered a large increase but less than in January, while the rise in medical care costs was about the same as in recent months.

The food and beverage component rose 0.5 percent in February. Grocery store food prices, which rose 0.3 percent in January, advanced 0.6 percent in February, largely due to increases in prices for fresh fruits and vegetables. These increases reflected the supply shortages for most fresh fruits and fresh vegetables, in many cases resulting from the adverse January weather. Other major grocery store food groups, however, generally showed behavior in February similar to that in the preceding month. The index for meats, poultry, fish, and eggs declined 0.2 percent, following a 0.3-percent drop in January. Declines in prices for beef and veal, lamb, and fish and seafood more than offset increases in pork, poultry, and egg prices. The cereal and bakery products, dairy products, and other foods at home groups all registered moderate increases for the second consecutive month. The other two components of the food and beverage index—restaurant meals and alcoholic beverages—both rose 0.4 percent in February, after recording no change in January.

The housing component rose 0.4 percent in February, following increases of 0.1 or 0.2 percent in each of the preceding 4 months. Larger increases in the indexes for shelter and household furnishings and operations—each up 0.6 percent in February—were responsible for the acceleration. Partially offsetting these advances was the continued decline in the index for fuel and other utilities. Within the shelter component, homeowners' costs rose 0.6 percent; renters' costs, 0.5 percent; and maintenance and repair costs, 0.2 percent. The increase in the index for

household furnishings and operations follows a 4-month period of nearly stable prices—up 0.2 percent from September through January. Earlier returns than usual from sale prices to regular prices for most textile housefurnishings and furniture products and the increase in postage rates, that went into effect on February 17, were largely responsible for the advance. The index for fuel and utilities declined for the third consecutive month, reflecting a 1.5-percent drop in fuel oil prices and declines of 0.5 percent in charges for natural gas and 0.9 percent in telephone services. Fuel oil prices are now 16.6 percent below their peak level of April 1981. Partially offsetting these declines was a 0.7-percent increase in charges for electricity.

The transportation component declined 0.1 percent in February, following a 0.3-percent increase in January. A sharp decline in prices for motor fuels—down 2.6 percent—more than offset large increases in motor vehicle prices. Gasoline prices are now 17.3 percent below their peak level of March 1981. New and used car prices rose 0.8 and 1.9 percent, respectively, in February. Automobile finance charges—down 0.9 percent—declined for the third consecutive month. The index for automobile insurance, which had risen sharply in each of the preceding 4 months, increased 0.3 percent in February. Tire prices, which had declined throughout most of the past 3 years, advanced 1.5 percent. The index for public transportation was essentially unchanged as a decline in intercity bus fares offset an increase in taxi fares.

The index for apparel and upkeep rose 0.9 percent in February. Clothing prices advanced 1.0 percent as seasonal sales ended earlier than in past years. Substantial price increases were recorded for all apparel commodities other than men's and boys' clothing. The index for apparel services also increased sharply—up 0.9 percent—in February.

The medical care component rose 0.4 percent in February, following an increase of 0.3 percent in January. The index for medical care commodities—prescription drugs, non-prescription drugs,

and medical supplies—increased 0.6 percent in February. The cost of medical care services continued its recent pattern, advancing 0.4 percent in February, the same as the average monthly increase since June of 1984. The index for physicians' services rose 0.5 percent, while the index for hospital rooms was virtually unchanged.

The index for entertainment declined 0.2 percent in February. A 1.1-percent increase in prices for reading materials was more than offset by declines in prices for sporting goods and equipment and in charges for admissions to movies, theaters, concerts, and sporting events.

The other goods and services component advanced 0.6 percent in February, following a 0.9-percent increase in January. Tobacco prices, which rose 2.0 percent in January, increased 0.7 percent in February, reflecting the remainder of the impact of the late December price rise at the producer level. Prices for school books and supplies also rose substantially for the second consecutive month.

CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W)—seasonally adjusted changes

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers rose 0.4 percent in February, compared with 0.3 percent for the CPI-U. (Beginning with data for January, the rental equivalence approach to homeownership is being used in the CPI-W. The methodology and samples of areas, items, outlets, and prices are identical, in both the CPI-W and the CPI-U, and the differences in monthly changes result only from different expenditure patterns and seasonal adjustment factors.)

Changes in Frequency of Publication for Local Area CPI'S to Begin in 1987

The Bureau of Labor Statistics will improve the sample of urban areas in which it gathers prices for monthly preparation of the Consumer Price Index beginning in 1987. At the same time, the Bureau will publish a number of local area CPI's less frequently.

The changes in publication frequency arise from the requirement to allocate the sample to reflect population shifts in the 1980 Census so as to provide the most accurate national CPI possible with the funds available. As a result, some local areas will no longer have samples sufficient to permit more frequent publication.

In addition to the national index for all cities, the Bureau now publishes indexes for 28 urban areas. In 1987, it will continue to publish indexes for all but one of these areas—Northeast Pennsylvania (Scranton-Wilkes-Barre).

Of the remaining 27 published urban areas, 13 will have a reduction in frequency beginning in 1987. The index for Detroit, currently published monthly, will be published only in the even-numbered months. Twelve areas now published bimonthly will be compiled on a semiannual average basis. These areas are: Buffalo-Niagara Falls, NY; Cincinnati-Hamilton, OH-KY-IN; Kansas City, MO-Kansas City, KS; Milwaukee, WI; Minneapolis-St. Paul, MN-WI; Atlanta, GA; Anchorage, AK; Denver-Boulder, CO; Honolulu, HI;


Portland-Vancouver, OR-WA; San Diego, CA; and Seattle-Tacoma, WA. These semiannual average indexes, which refer to the arithmetic averages of the 6-month periods from January through June and July through December, will be published with release of the CPI for July and January, respectively, i.e., in the months of August and February. These series will be compiled and published on their present reference bases, 1967 = 100 for all areas other than Anchorage, which is on an October 1967 reference base. Also, the Cleveland-Akron-Lorain, OH, indexes will be published in odd-numbered rather than even-numbered months. Further details are available from BLS.

Homeownership changes

As announced in October 1981, the Bureau of Labor Statistics has changed the treatment of homeownership costs in the CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) effective with release of data for January 1985. See the last page of the Technical Notes for additional detail.



Chart 1. CPI-U: All items, food and beverages, 1974-85





Chart 2. CPI-U: Housing, apparel and upkeep, 1974-85





NOTE: Local area CPI indexes are by-products of the national CPI program. Because each local index is a small subset of the national index, it has a smaller sample size and is, therefore, subject to substantially more sampling and other measurement error than the national index. As a result, local area indexes show greater volatility than the national index, although their long-term trends are quite similar.

Therefore, the Bureau of Labor Statistics strongly urges users to consider adopting the national average CPI for use in escalator clauses.

Because each local index is a small subset of the national index, it has a smaller sample size and is, therefore, subject to substantially more sampling and other measurement error than the national index. As a result, local area indexes show greater volatility than the national index, although their long-term trends are quite similar.

Therefore, the Bureau of Labor Statistics strongly urges users to consider adopting the national average CPI for use in escalator clauses.

Technical Notes

Brief Explanation of the CPI

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change in prices over time in a fixed market basket of goods and services. Effective with the January 1978 index, the Bureau of Labor Statistics began publishing CPI's for two population groups: (1) a new CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) which covers approximately 80 percent of the total noninstitutional civilian population; and (2) a revised CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) which represents about half the population covered by the CPI-U. The CPI-U includes, in addition to wage earners and clerical workers, groups which historically have been excluded from CPI coverage, such as professional, managerial, and technical workers, the self-employed, short-term workers, the unemployed, and retirees and others not in the labor force.

The CPI is based on prices of food, clothing, shelter, and fuels, transportation fares, charges for doctors' and dentists' services, drugs, and the other goods and services that people buy for day-to-day living. Prices are collected in 85 urban areas across the country from about 18,000 tenants, 18,000 housing units for property taxes, and about 24,000 establishments—grocery and department stores, hospitals, filling stations, and other types of stores and service establishments. All taxes directly associated with the purchase and use of items are included in the index. Prices of food, fuels, and a few other items are obtained every month in all 85 locations. Prices of most other commodities and services are collected every month in the five largest geographic areas and every other month in other areas. Prices of most goods and services are obtained by personal visits of the Bureau's trained representatives. Mail questionnaires are used to obtain public utility rates, some fuel prices, and certain other items.

In calculating the index, price changes for the various items in each location are averaged together with weights which represent their importance in the spending of the appropriate population group. Local data are then combined to obtain a U.S. city average. Separate indexes are also published by size of city, by region of the country, for cross-classifications of regions and population-size classes, and for 28 local areas. Area indexes do not measure differences in the level of prices among cities, they only measure the

average change in prices for each area since the base period.

The index measures price changes from a designated reference date—1967—which equals 100.0. An increase of 122 percent, for example, is shown as 222.0. This change can also be expressed in dollars as follows: The price of a base period "market basket" of goods and services in the CPI has risen from \$10 in 1967 to \$22.20.

Calculating Index Changes

Movements of the indexes from one month to another are usually expressed as percent changes rather than changes in index points, because index point changes are affected by the level of the index in relation to its base period while percent changes are not. The example in the accompanying box illustrates the computation of index point and percent changes.

Percent changes for 3-month and 6-month periods are expressed as annual rates and are computed according to the standard formula for compound growth rates. These data indicate what the percent change would be if the current rate were maintained for a 12-month period.

Homeownership Changes

Effective with data for January 1985, the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) has been changed to incorporate a rental equivalence measure of homeownership costs. The Bureau of Labor Statistics announced plans to change the treatment of homeownership costs on October 27, 1981. Effective with release of the index for January 1983, the BLS had made the same changes in the way in which homeownership costs were measured in the CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U).

The rental equivalence approach calculates shelter cost of homeownership based on the implicit rent owners would have to pay to rent the homes they own. The old method calculated homeownership costs as home purchase, mortgage interest costs, property taxes, property insurance, and maintenance and repair. As with the CPI-U, the new homeownership component has been introduced into the CPI-W in such a manner that the indexes using the old and new methods were equal in the so-called link month—December 1984 for the CPI-W. BLS will continue to calculate and make available the CPI-W using the old homeownership approach for the 6-month period from January to June 1985. Seasonally Adjusted and Unadjusted Data

Because price data are used for different purposes by different groups, the Bureau of Labor Statistics


publishes seasonally adjusted as well as unadjusted changes each month.

For analyzing general price trends in the economy, seasonally adjusted changes are usually preferred since they eliminate the effect of changes that normally occur at the same time and in about the same magnitude every year—such as price movements resulting from changing climatic conditions, production cycles, model changeovers, holidays, and sales.

The unadjusted data are of primary interest to consumers concerned about the prices they actually pay. Unadjusted data also are used extensively for escalation purposes. Many collective bargaining contract agreements and pension plans, for example, tie compensation changes to the Consumer Price Index unadjusted for seasonal variation.

Seasonal factors used in computing the seasonally adjusted indexes are derived by the X-11-ARIMA Seasonal Adjustment Method. The updated seasonal data at the end of 1977 replaced data from 1967 through 1977. Subsequent annual updates have replaced 5 years of seasonal data, e.g., data from 1980 through 1984 were replaced at the end of 1984. The seasonal movement of all items and 44 other aggregations is derived by combining the seasonal movement of 51 selected components. Each year the seasonal status of every series is reevaluated based upon certain statistical criteria. If any of the 51 components change their seasonal adjustment status from seasonally adjusted to not seasonally adjusted 5 years, but the seasonally adjusted indexes will be used before that period. If any of the 51 components change their status from not seasonally adjusted to seasonally adjusted, seasonally adjusted data will be used for the last 5 years, but not seasonally adjusted indexes will be used before that period.

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
