Price Movements

April 1983

The Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) increased 0.7 percent before seasonal adjustment in April. The April level of 295.5 (1967=100) was 3.9 percent higher than the index in April 1982.

The Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) rose 0.6 percent in April, prior to seasonal adjustment, to a level of 294.9 (1967=100). For the 12-month period ended in April, the CPI-W has also increased 3.9 percent. The CPI-W is used for indexing Social Security and some other Federal payments. It is also commonly used as an escalator in collective bargaining agreements.

CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U)—seasonally adjusted changes

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI for All Urban Consumers rose 0.6 percent in April, following an increase of 0.1 percent in March. The April rise, which compares with an average monthly increase of 0.3 percent from September 1981 through March 1983, was due largely to higher prices for energy and shelter. The transportation index, affected by the additional 5 cents a gallon Federal excise tax on motor fuel, recorded its first increase since last October. The housing component which had declined in March, advanced in April as homeowners' costs and fuel prices rose.

A 3.9 percent increase in the prices for motor fuels accounted for virtually all of the 1.1 percent rise in the transportation component. Despite this advance, gasoline prices were still 14.1 percent below their peak level

of March 1981. Moderating the impact of the jump in motor fuel prices was a decline in automobile prices; new car prices declined 0.6 percent, while used car prices registered a 0.2 percent increase. Automobile finance charges—down 2.8 percent—declined for the ninth consecutive month. Largely as a result of an increase in airline fares, the index for public transportation rose 1.9 percent in April, after registering declines in both February and March.

The housing component advanced 0.5 percent in April, following a small decline in March. Shelter costs, which were unchanged in March, rose 0.7 percent in April. Within the shelter component, homeowners' costs rose 0.8 percent, while renters' costs increased 0.4 percent. Both owners' and renters' costs have risen at an average monthly rate of 0.4 percent during the first 4 months of this year. The index for maintenance and repairs, which pertain to both renters and homeowners, increased 1.1 percent. The index for fuels and utilities rose 0.2 percent, following declines in each of the preceding 3 months. A 1.8 percent increase in charges for natural gas more than offset declines in fuel oil prices and charges for electricity. The index for household furnishings and operations increased 0.5 percent in April, following an increase of 0.2 percent in March.

The index for food and beverages advanced 0.5 percent in April. Grocery store food prices rose 0.4 percent, following a 0.9 percent increase in March. This month's smaller but still substantial increase—up 1.0 percent—in fruit and vegetable prices was largely re-

sponsible for the moderation. Fresh vegetable prices, which had declined 22.3 percent from January 1982 through February 1983, have increased 17.7 percent in the past 2 months. The index for meats, poultry, fish, and eggs rose 0.5 percent in April compared with 0.2 percent in March. The 2.1 percent rise in beef prices, following declines in each of the preceding 4 months, more than offset the second consecutive monthly decrease in prices for both pork and poultry. Egg prices increased, but by less than in March. All other major grocery store food groups continued to record relatively moderate increases or declines in April. The other two components of the food and beverage index—restaurant meals and alcoholic beverages—both increased 0.4 percent.

The April increase of 0.5 percent in the medical care component was the same as in March and significantly less than the average monthly increase of 0.9 percent for the period from December 1980 through February 1983. The index for medical care commodities, which includes prescription and non-prescription drugs and medical supplies, rose 1.1 percent. Within medical care services, charges for professional services and hospital rooms rose 0.4 and 0.7 percent, respectively.

The index for apparel and upkeep increased 0.2 percent in April, following a decline of 0.1 percent in March. The entertainment component declined 0.1 percent in April, following an increase of 0.3 percent in March. The April decline in entertainment commodities—reading materials, sporting goods and equipment, and toys, hobbies, and other entertainment goods—more than offset the increase in entertainment services. The index for other goods and services rose 0.7 percent in April. Although more than in March, it was less than any monthly increase in the preceding 6 months.

CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W)—seasonally adjusted changes

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers rose 0.6 percent

in April, following a 0.3 percent increase in March. A sharp increase in the transportation component (up 1.4 percent in April compared with a decline of 0.2 percent in March) was primarily responsible for the acceleration in the overall CPI from March to April. Larger increases in the medical care and other goods and services components in April—up 0.5 and 0.6 percent, respectively, also contributed to the acceleration. The food and beverage index registered a 0.5 percent increase for the second consecutive month. On the other hand, the housing component rose 0.3 percent in April, following a 0.4 percent increase in March. The index for entertainment was unchanged, while the apparel and upkeep component declined 0.1 percent in April, after both series had registered moderate increases in March.

The 0.6 percent rise in the CPI-W was the same as in the CPI-U. The CPI-U uses the new rental equivalence measure, which rose 0.8 in April, to measure shelter costs of homeowners. Homeownership in the CPI-W, which uses house prices, mortgage interest rates, property taxes, property insurance, and maintenance and repair costs, rose 0.3 percent in April. Increases in house prices, property insurance, property taxes, and maintenance and repair costs more than offset a decline in mortgage interest rates.

Announcement to Users: Homeownership Changes

Effective with release of the index for January 1983, the Bureau of Labor Statistics changed the way homeowner costs are measured in the CPI-U to rental equivalence. The rental equivalence approach calculates homeowner costs of the shelter based on the implicit rent owners would have to pay to rent the homes they own. The old method calculated homeowner costs as home purchase, mortgage interest costs, property taxes, property insurance and maintenance and repair.

As previously announced, the CPI-W will be changed to rental equivalence effective with data for January 1985. The CPI experimental measures, known as the

CPI-U, X-1 through CPI-U, X-5 are no longer being published.

The new homeowners' cost component has been introduced into the CPI-U in such a manner that the indexes using the old and new methodologies are equal in the so-called link month—December 1982. A similar technique will be employed for the CPI-W in December 1984. This technical procedure has been used in previous revisions of the CPI. In accordance with historical practice, BLS will make available to users, for a 6-month overlap period, calculations based on the old method of homeownership. In the case of the CPI-U, the overlap period will run from January to June 1983; for the CPI-W, the overlap period will run from January to June 1985.

The new homeowners' cost component is similar to the one used in the CPI-U, X-1, with 4 important refinements. First, BLS has calculated a set of owner weights for the individual units in the CPI rent sample. These new weights make the rent sample represent owner occupied housing and permit the calculation of a rent change estimate for homeowners.

Second, the Bureau has augmented the rent sample in order to enhance the rental equivalence measure. This new sampling is concentrated in areas where the housing is predominantly owner-occupied in order to

increase the proportion of rental units that have characteristics similar to owner-occupied units.

Third, the expenditure weight for rental equivalence, which for the experimental index, X-1, was calculated by means of a short-cut method, has been recalculated using the complex statistical estimating procedure used for weights in the official CPI. In addition, the weights associated with other homeowner expenditures for such things as insurance, appliances, and maintenance and repairs have been modified to be consistent with the rental equivalence concept. This enhancement has improved the quality of the national CPI's rental equivalence weight and provides weights for computation of local area CPI-U's using the rental equivalence approach.

Finally, the computer system which produces the CPI each month has been expanded to accommodate the calculation, with complete item and geographic detail, and with proper geographic weighting for the rental equivalence approach. BLS will continue to work on other refinements in the statistical estimating techniques used in the rental equivalence measure. See tables C and D for a description of changes in the index structure. For further detail, see the January or February 1983 issues of this report.





Chart 1. CPI-U: All items, food and beverages, 1972-83





Chart 2. CPI-U: Housing, apparel and upkeep, 1972-83





Because each local index is a small subset of the national index, it has a smaller sample size and is, therefore, subject to substantially more sampling and other measurement error than the national index. As a result, local area indexes show greater volatility than the national index, although their long-term trends are quite similar. Therefore, the Bureau of Labor Statistics strongly urges users to consider adopting the national average CPI for use in escalator clauses.

As a result, local area indexes show greater volatility than the national index, although their long-term trends are quite similar. Therefore, the Bureau of Labor Statistics strongly urges users to consider adopting the national average CPI for use in escalator clauses.

Therefore, the Bureau of Labor Statistics strongly urges users to consider adopting the national average CPI for use in escalator clauses.

Technical Notes

Brief Explanation of the CPI

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change in prices over time in a fixed market basket of goods and services. Effective with the January 1978 index, the Bureau of Labor Statistics began publishing CPI's for two population groups: (1) a new CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) which covers approximately 80 percent of the total noninstitutional civilian population; and (2) a revised CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) which represents about half the population covered by the CPI-U. The CPI-U includes, in addition to wage earners and clerical workers, groups which historically have been excluded from CPI coverage, such as professional, managerial, and technical workers, the self-employed, short-term workers, the unemployed, and retirees and others not in the labor force.

The CPI is based on prices of food, clothing, shelter, and fuels, transportation fares, charges for doctors' and dentists' services, drugs, and the other goods and services that people buy for day-to-day living. Prices are collected in 85 urban areas across the country from about 18,000 tenants, 18,000 housing units for property taxes, and about 24,000 establishments—grocery and department stores, hospitals, filling stations, and other types of stores and service establishments. All taxes directly associated with the purchase and use of items are included in the index. Prices of food, fuels, and a few other items are obtained every month in all 85 locations. Prices of most other commodities and services are collected every month in the five largest geographic areas and every other month in other areas. Prices of most goods and services are obtained by personal visits of the Bureau's trained representatives. Mail questionnaires are used to obtain public utility rates, some fuel prices, and certain other items.

In calculating the index, price changes for the various items in each location are averaged together with weights which represent their importance in the spending of the appropriate population group. Local data are then combined to obtain a U.S. city average. Separate indexes are also published by size of city, by region of the country, for cross-classifications of regions and population-size classes, and for 28 local areas. Area indexes do not measure differences in the level of prices among cities; they only measure the average change in prices for each area since the base period.

The index measures price changes from a designated reference date—1967—which equals 100.0. An increase of 122 percent, for example, is shown as 222.0. This change can also be expressed in dollars as follows: The price of a base period "market basket" of goods and services in the CPI has risen from \$10 in 1967 to \$22.20.

A Note About Calculating Index Changes

Movements of the indexes from one month to another are usually expressed as percent changes rather than changes in index points because index point changes are affected by the level of the index in relation to its base period while percent changes are not. The example in the accompanying box illustrates the computation of index point and percent changes.

Percent changes for 3-month and 6-month periods are expressed as annual rates and are computed according to the standard formula for compound growth rates. These data indicate what the percent change would be if the current rate were maintained for a 12-month period.

Seasonally Adjusted and Unadjusted Data

Because price data are used for different purposes by different groups, the Bureau of Labor Statistics publishes seasonally adjusted as well as unadjusted changes each month.

For analyzing general price trends in the economy, seasonally adjusted changes are usually preferred since they eliminate the effect of changes that normally occur at the same time and in about the same magnitude every year—such as price movements resulting from changing climatic conditions, production cycles, model changeovers, holidays, and sales.

The unadjusted data are of primary interest to consumers concerned about the prices they actually pay. Unadjusted data are also used extensively for escalation

purposes. Many collective bargaining contract agreements and pension plans, for example, tie compensation changes to the Consumer Price Index unadjusted for seasonal variation.

Seasonal factors used to compute the seasonally adjusted indexes are derived by the X-11 Variant of the Census Method II Seasonal Adjustment Program. Annual updates replace 5 years of seasonal data, e.g., data from 1977 through 1981 were replaced at the end of 1981. The seasonal movement of all items and 35 other aggregations is derived by combining the seasonal movement of 45 selected components. Each year the seasonal status of every series is reevaluated based upon certain statistical criteria. If any of the 45 selected components changes its seasonal status, seasonal data from 1967 forward for the all-items and for any of the 35 other aggregations that have that series as a component, are replaced.
