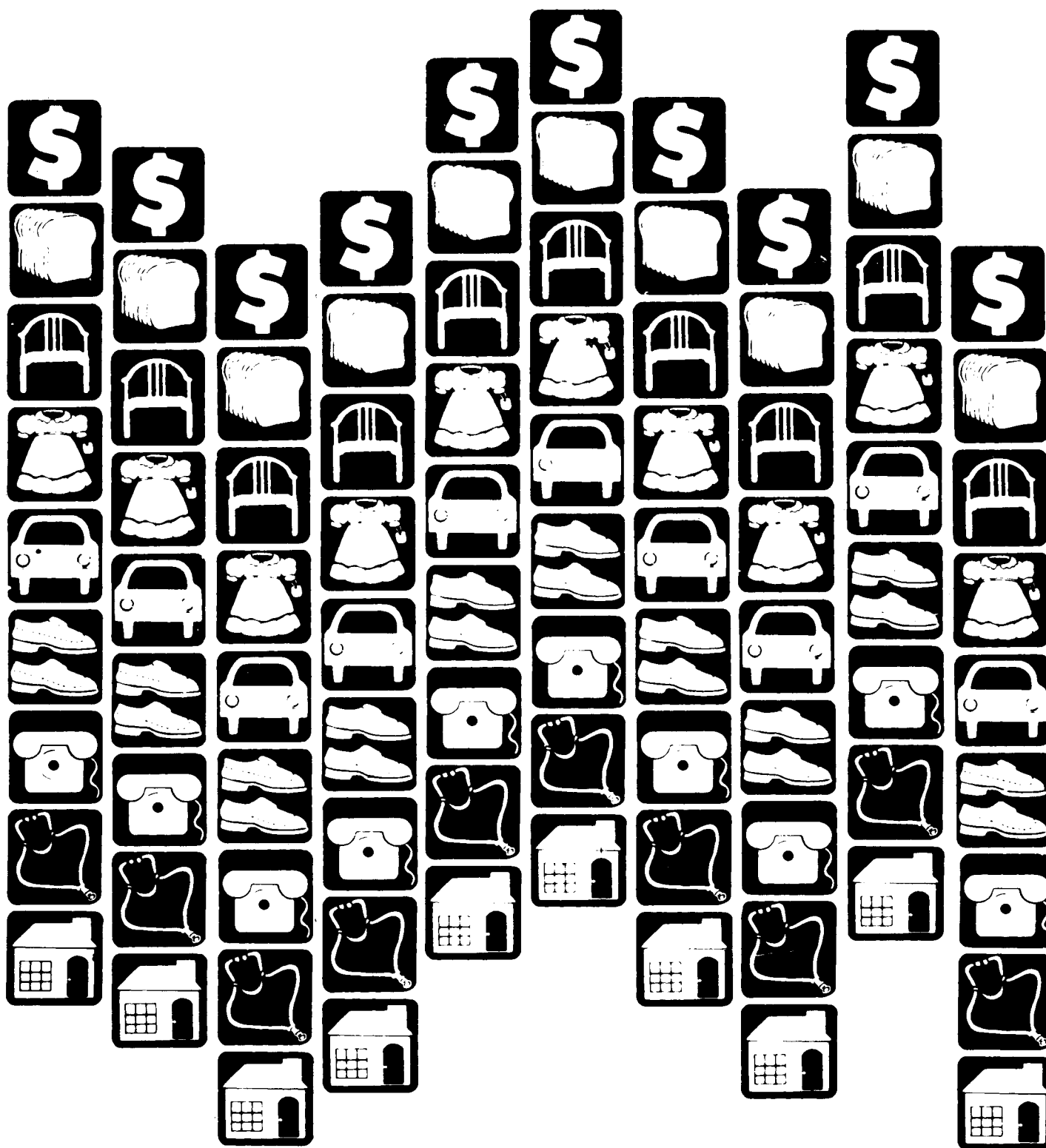

# Price Movements

## June 1988

The Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) rose 0.4 percent before seasonal adjustment in June to a level of 118.0 (1982-1984=100). For the 12-month period ended June, the CPI-U increased 4.0 percent.

The Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) also rose 0.4 percent in June prior to seasonal adjustment. The June 1988 CPI-W level of 116.7 was 3.8 percent higher than the index in June 1987. The June 1988 indexes for the CPI-U and CPI-W on a 1967=100 reference base were 353.5 and 347.6, respectively.

### CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U)

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI-U rose 0.3 percent in June, the same as in the preceding month. Increases in the indexes for food and shelter accounted for over three-fifths of the overall June CPI-U advance. The acceleration in these components, however, was offset by declines in energy and apparel prices.

During the first 6 months of 1988, the CPI-U rose at a seasonally adjusted annual rate (SAAR) of 4.4 percent, the same as that for the 12 months ended in December 1987. While overall rates for the two periods were identical, the composition was different. The energy component turned down slightly in the first half of 1988 after partially rebounding in 1987 from the effect of the 1986 oil glut. The second-quarter surge in food prices pushed their 1988 year-to-date annual rate above 4 percent. Shelter costs, on the other hand, advanced at virtually the same rate as in 1986 and 1987.

The 4.9-percent annual rate in the index for all items excluding food, shelter, and energy in the first 6 months of 1988 was its largest advance since the first half of 1984. Within this group, prices for both commodities and services accelerated. The sharp increase in apparel prices accounted for over 40 percent of the 1988 increase, but most other commodity components also rose faster than in 1987. All service groups other than apparel services accelerated in the first half of 1988.

The food and beverage index rose 0.6 percent in June following a 0.4-percent increase in May. Grocery store prices advanced 0.7 percent in June, largely as a result of a 2.0-percent increase in the index for meats, poultry, fish, and eggs. Beef prices advanced 1.3 percent in June and have risen at a 10.8-percent annual rate in the first half of 1988. In June, prices for pork rose 1.2 percent; poultry, 5.4 percent; and eggs, 6.6 percent. Partially offsetting these sharp increases were small declines in the indexes for fruits and vegetables and dairy products. The other two components of the food and beverage index—restaurant meals and alcoholic beverages—both increased 0.4 percent in June.

The housing index rose 0.3 percent in June, the same as in each of the prior 4 months. The shelter component increased 0.4 percent in June. Within shelter, renters' costs rose 0.4 percent; homeowners' costs, 0.5 percent; and maintenance and repair costs, 0.3 percent. The index for fuel and other utilities increased slightly, reflecting a 0.7-percent increase in charges for electricity. Declines in the indexes for fuel oil (1.0 percent), natural gas (0.3 percent), and other

utilities and public services (0.2 percent), nearly offset the switch to higher summer rates for electricity. The index for household furnishings and operations rose 0.6 percent in June.

Transportation costs rose 0.2 percent in June following a 0.7-percent increase in May. The index for motor fuels, which increased 1.7 percent in May, declined 0.9 percent and was responsible for the moderation in the transportation component. Gasoline prices declined 1.1 percent during the first 6 months of 1988 and, as of June, were 28.7 percent below their peak level of March 1981. June increases in the costs associated with the purchase of a new car were about the same as in May, with new car prices up 0.2 percent and automobile financing costs up 1.0 percent. Used car prices turned up in June, advancing 0.4 percent after declining in each of the preceding 3 months. The index for public transportation rose 0.7 percent, reflecting increases in fares for intercity public transportation.

The index for apparel and upkeep declined 0.3 percent in June after advancing 3.8 percent in the first 5 months of 1988. Larger than usual end-of-season price reductions, particularly for women's clothing, were responsible for the June decline. Charges for apparel services rose 0.3 percent in June and have increased at a 2.1-percent annual rate in the first half of 1988.

The medical care component advanced 0.4 percent in June to a level 6.4 percent above its level a year ago. In June, the index for medical care commodities—prescription drugs, nonprescription drugs, and medical supplies—increased 0.1 percent. The index for medical care services rose 0.5 percent, with the cost of professional services and hospital and related services up 0.8 and 0.6 percent, respectively.

Entertainment costs continued to rise moderately, advancing 0.3 percent in June and at a 3.7-percent annual rate during the past 3 months.

The index for other goods and services rose 0.5 percent in June, the same as in May. The annual rate of increase of 8.0 percent during the first 6 months of 1988 was the largest of the seven major groups and reflects sharp increases in the indexes for tobacco and smoking products and personal and educational expenses.

#### **CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W)**

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers rose 0.3 percent in June.

# Reconciling Two Measures of Consumer Price Change: First Quarter 1988

This article continues the analysis of differences between two price measures—the Consumer Price Index (CPI-U) published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) and the Implicit Price Deflator for Personal Consumption Expenditures (PCE) published by the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) of the Department of Commerce. More information on the technique of reconciliation appears in the September 1981 *Monthly Labor Review*.<sup>1</sup>

Effective December 1985, BEA rebased the PCE data from a 1972 to a 1982 reference base.<sup>2</sup> With the use of a 1982 reference base, the residual housing effect,<sup>3</sup> which had contributed a substantial portion of the cumulative difference between the CPI and PCE through 1982, is no longer a contributing factor, because both the CPI and the PCE have used a rental equivalence measure of homeowners' costs since the beginning of 1983.

## Cumulative differences

The PCE remained higher than the CPI through the first quarter of 1988 (see table C). The current-weight PCE has risen 21.4 percent since 1982, while the CPI-U has increased 20.4 percent. The net difference of 1.0 percentage point results from two partially offsetting factors—weighting differences and an aggregate of "other" effects. Weighting differences reflect the cumulative effect of using 1982 fixed weights instead of current, or moving, weights. These differences accounted for a first quarter 1988 fixed-weight index which was 1.3 percentage points higher than the current-weight PCE. The weighting effect, however, has been more than offset by a 2.3-percentage-points difference in "other" effects as measured by a comparison of the fixed-weight PCE with the CPI-U. Historically, "other" effects have mainly resulted from differences in seasonal adjustment methods, different market baskets, and the use of the Consumer Expenditure Survey data for determining the weight distribution in the CPI as opposed to the GNP composition used by the PCE to determine its weighting structure. The PCE has used 1982 based weights since 1982, whereas the CPI did not introduce weights derived from the 1982-84 Consumer Expenditure Survey until January 1987. This gap in weighting between 1982 and 1987 further contributed to differences reflected in "other" effects during that time period.

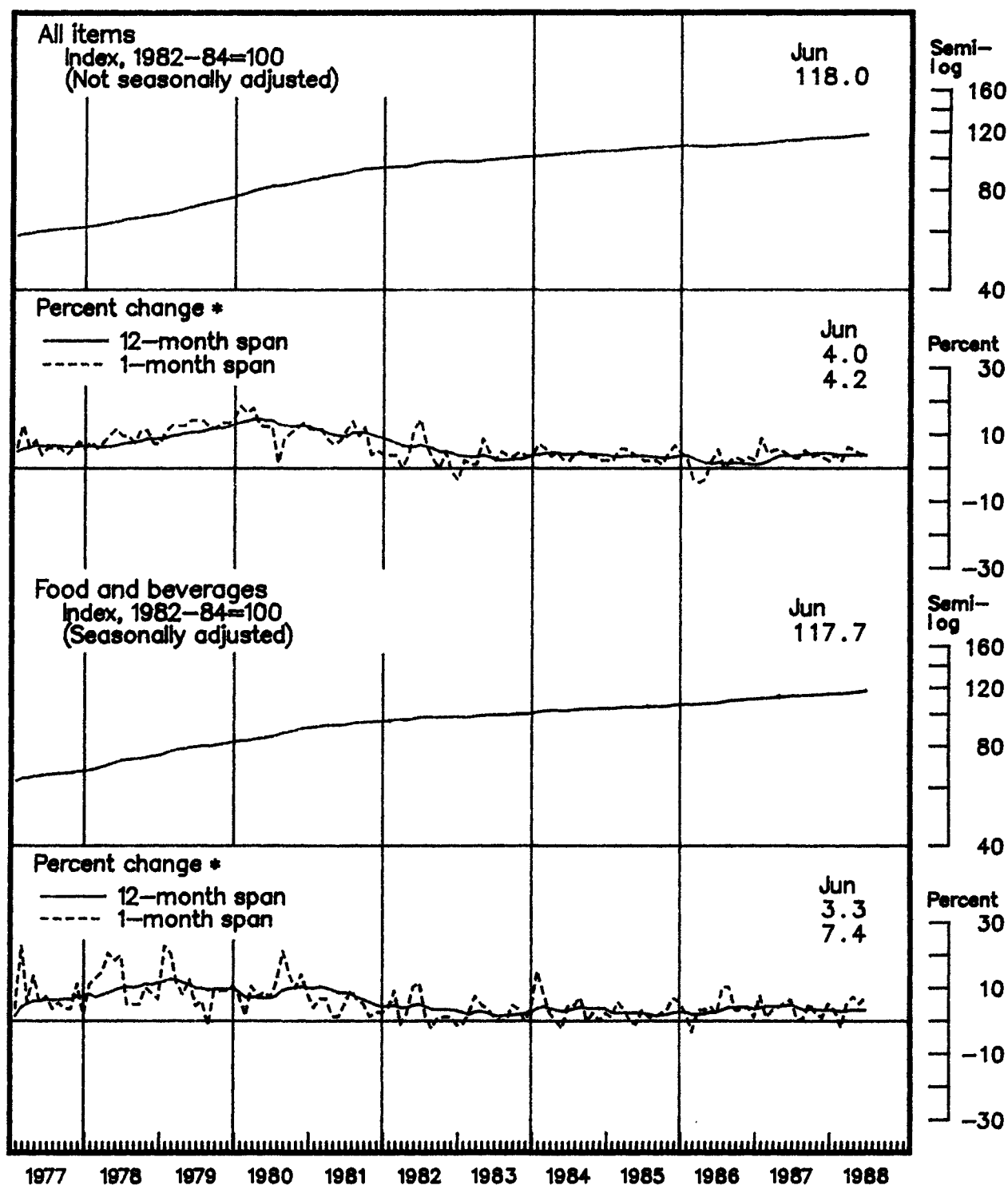
### Period-to-period differences

To analyze differences in the annual and quarterly rates of change in the CPI and PCE (see table D), the chain-weight PCE is used in place of the current-weight PCE.<sup>4</sup> The CPI-U rose at an annual rate of 3.2 percent from the fourth quarter of 1987 to the first quarter of 1988, 0.6 percent more than the 2.6-percent rise in the chain-weight PCE. During the

fourth quarter, the CPI-U and the chain-weight PCE had increased at rates of 3.9 percent and 4.0 percent, respectively. The 1982 fixed-weight PCE rose at an annual rate of 2.7 percent in the first quarter, 0.1 percent faster than the rise in the chain-weight PCE. A comparison of the rates for the CPI-U and the fixed-weight PCE, which determines the "other" effects factor, showed CPI-U to be increasing 0.5 percent faster during the first quarter.

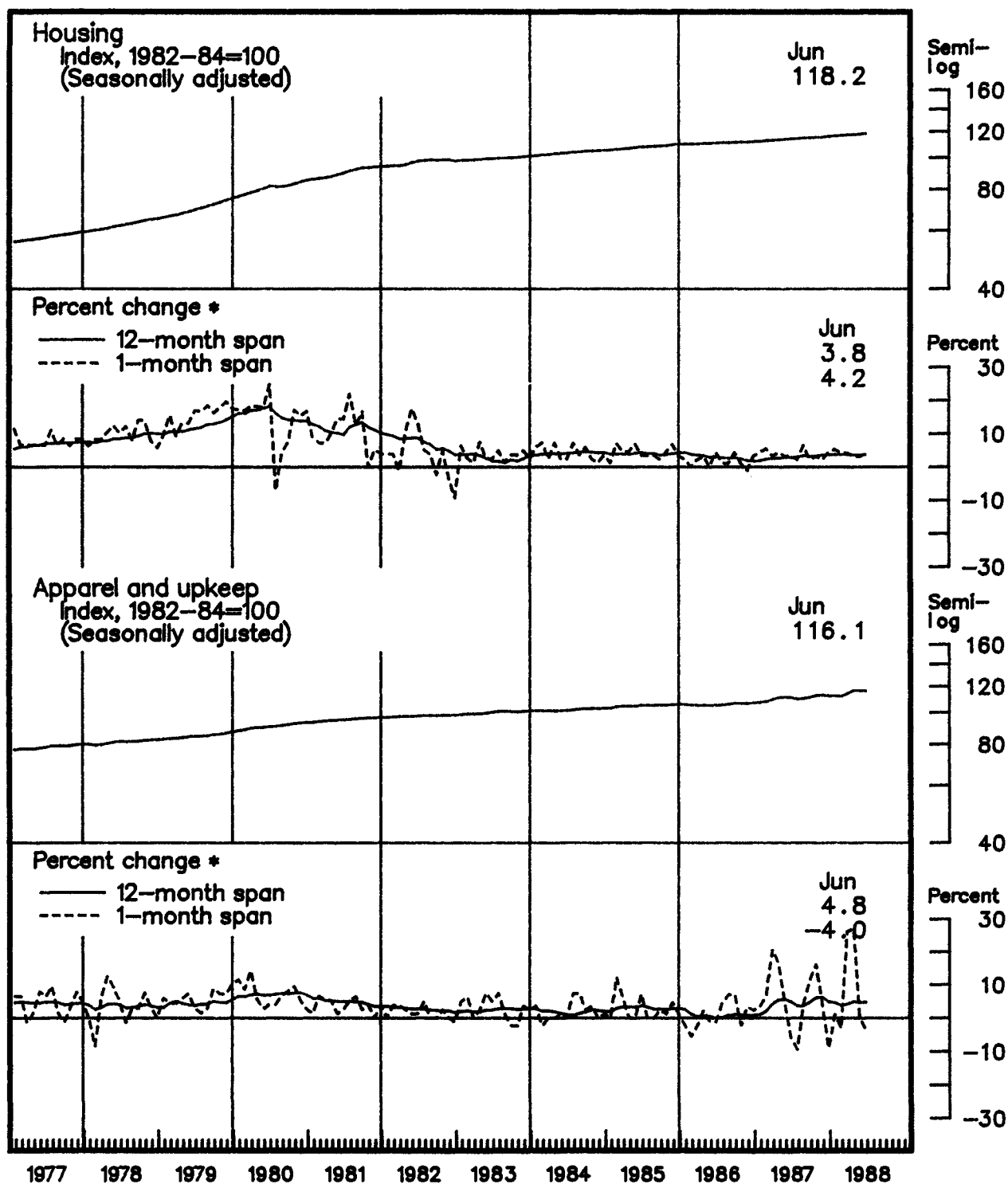


Chart 1: CPI-U: All items, food and beverages, 1977-88



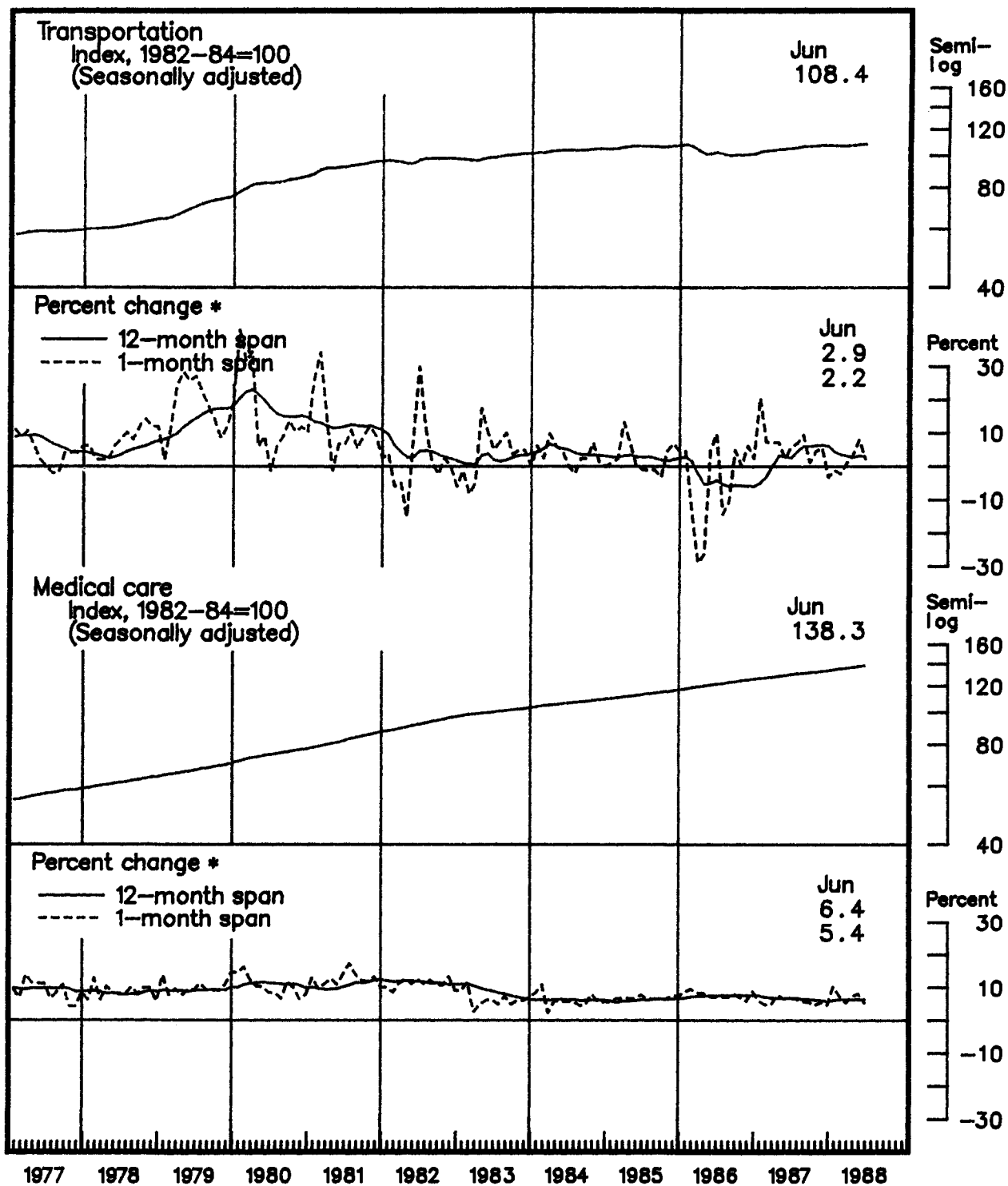
\* Percent changes over 12-month spans are calculated from unadjusted data. Percent changes over 1-month spans are annual rates calculated from seasonally adjusted data.

**Chart 2: CPI-U: Housing, apparel and upkeep, 1977-88**



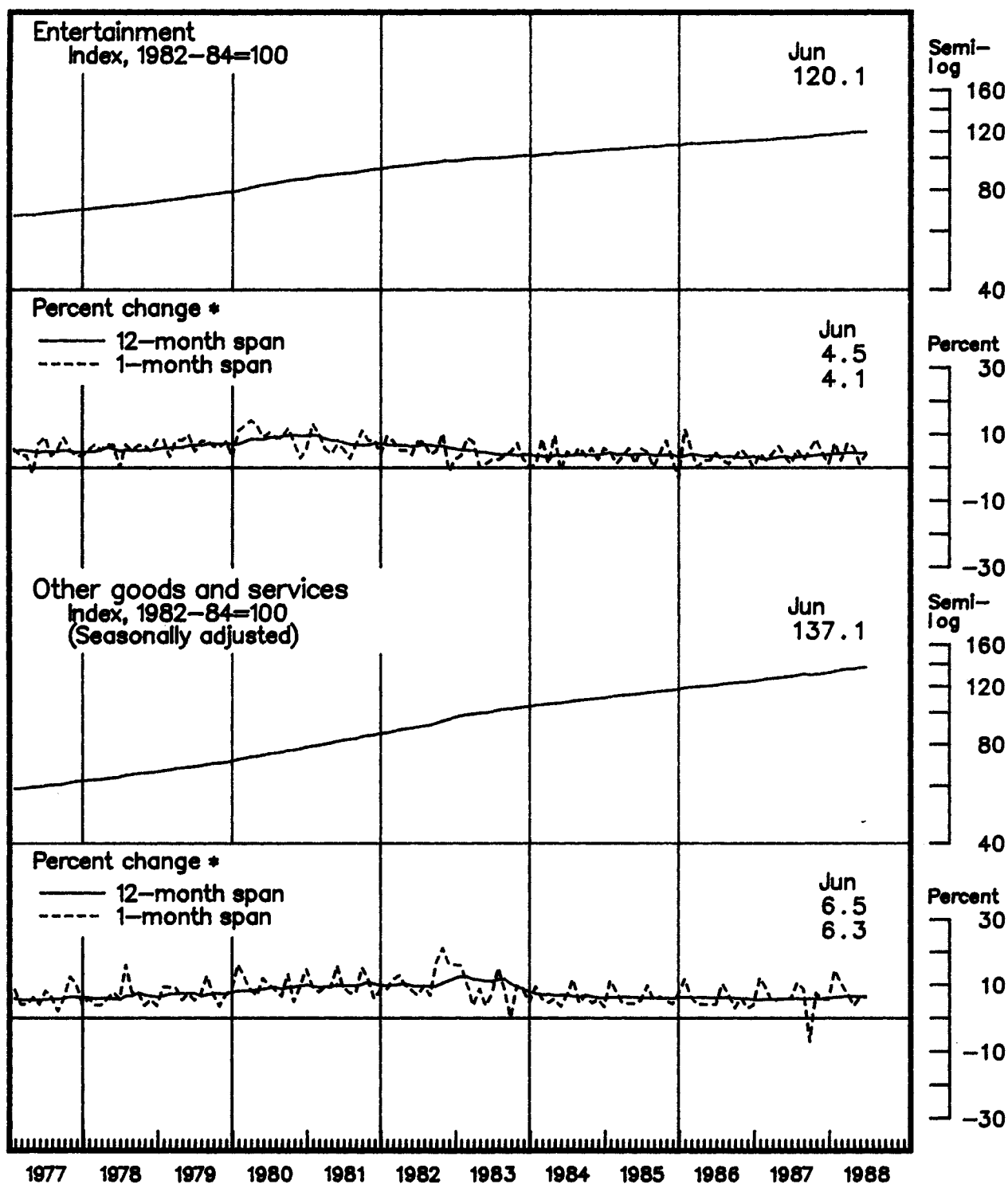

NOTE: Local area CPI indexes are byproducts of the national CPI program. Each local index has a smaller sample size than the national index and is, therefore, subject to substantially more sampling and other measurement error. As a result, local area indexes show greater volatility than the national index, although their long-term trends are similar. Therefore, the Bureau of Labor Statistics strongly urges users to consider adopting the national average CPI for use in their escalator clauses.

# Technical Notes

## Brief Explanation of the CPI

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change in prices over time in a fixed market basket of goods and services. The Bureau of Labor Statistics publishes CPI's for two population groups: (1) a CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) which covers approximately 80 percent of the total population and (2), a CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) which covers 32 percent of the total population. The CPI-U includes, in addition to wage earners and clerical workers, groups such as professional, managerial, and technical workers, the self-employed, short-term workers, the unemployed, and retirees and others not in the labor force.

The CPI is based on prices of food, clothing, shelter, and fuels, transportation fares, charges for doctors' and dentists' services, drugs, and the other goods and services that people buy for day-to-day living. Prices are collected in 85 urban areas across the country from about 57,000 housing units and approximately 19,000 retail establishments—department stores, supermarkets, hospitals, filling stations, and other types of stores and service establishments. All taxes directly associated with the purchase and use of items are included in the index. Prices of food, fuels, and a few other items are obtained every month in all 85 locations. Prices of most other commodities and services are collected every month in the five largest geographic areas and every other month in other areas. Prices of most goods and services are obtained by personal visits of the Bureau's trained representatives. Some data, such as used car prices, are obtained from secondary sources.

In calculating the index, price changes for the various items in each location are averaged together with weights which represent their importance in the spending of the appropriate population group. Local data are then combined to obtain a U.S. city average. Separate indexes are also published by size of city, by region of the country, for cross calculations of regions and population-size classes, and for 27 local areas. Area indexes do not measure differences in the level of prices among cities, they only measure the average change in prices for each area since the base period.

The indexes measure price change from a designated reference date, 1982-84, which equals 100.0. An increase of 7 percent, for example, is shown as 107.0. This change can also be expressed in dollars as follows: The price of a base period "market basket" of goods and services in the CPI has risen from \$100 in 1982-84 to \$107.

## Calculating Index Changes

Movements of the indexes from one month to another are usually expressed as percent changes rather than changes in index points, because index point changes are affected by the level of the index in relation to its base period while percent changes are not. The example in the accompanying box illustrates the computation of index point and percent changes.

Percent changes for 3-month and 6-month periods are expressed as annual rates and are computed according to the standard formula for compound growth rates. These data indicate what the percent change would be if the current rate were maintained for a 12-month period.

## Energy Prices

Prices are usually available for the U.S. city average, 28 large urban areas, and 16 areas reflecting the four Census regions cross-classified by four population sizes. However, not all energy commodities and services are used in every area of the country. Fuel oil, for example, is not a common heating fuel in some urban areas, particularly in the South and West. Where no average prices are available, the designation NA will appear. NA will also appear if the data sufficiency criteria have not been met in any given month. For example, if there are fewer than five usable fuel oil prices for a published city or region size class, no fuel oil prices for the area will be published.

All prices are collected monthly by BLS representatives in the urban areas priced for the CPI. Prices for natural gas and electricity include fuel and purchased gas adjustments and all applicable taxes. Fuel oil and gasoline prices include applicable Federal, State, and local taxes.

**Natural gas and electricity.** Natural gas prices are reported in therms, which are a measure of heating value. Electricity prices are given in kilowatt hours (kwh). For both utility services, the consumption ranges specified in table P-2 are the upper and lower limits of the bill sizes priced for the Consumer Price Index. The average prices per therm and per kilowatt hour are calculated from bills priced within these ranges. It should be noted that bills priced for the CPI are not only for different consumption amounts, but may also be calculated from different types of residential rate schedules. *The average prices per therm and per kilowatt hour are not, therefore, generally suitable for use in place-to-place price comparisons.*

The average prices for 40 and 100 therms of natural gas and for 500 kilowatt hours of electricity (table P-1) are calculated from a special price collection program. They are not used in the calculation of the CPI. Since heating and air-conditioning requirements vary by geographic location, climate, and weather conditions, it cannot be inferred that these consumption amounts represent those used by a typical residential consumer. These bills are used merely to track price changes over time for constant amounts of consumption, to provide data for place-to-place price comparisons, and to provide continuity with prices of natural gas and electricity formerly published in conjunction with the unrevised Consumer Price Index.

**Fuel oil.** Only #2 fuel oil (home heating oil) is priced. Prices are collected, in most cases, for quantities greater than one gallon. These prices are converted to a per gallon price for this program. Fuel oil prices reflect discounts for quantity and/or quick payment.

**Gasoline.** Gasoline prices are collected at the pump from a sample of full service, mini-service, and self-serve gas stations.

Approximate British Thermal Unit (BTU) values for some energy items are as follows, according to the source indicated:

1 therm = 100,000 BTU'S (U.S. Department of Energy).

1 kwh = 3,412 BTU'S (Edison Electric Institute)

1 gallon #2 fuel oil = 140,000 BTU'S (U.S. Department of Energy).

## Food Prices

In the revised CPI, actual weighted average prices are calculated each month at the national level and for the four Census geographic regions. As a result of changes in price collection methodology and sample sizes, average prices for individual cities cannot in general be produced. It is hoped, however, that regional average prices will help satisfy the need for local area data. It should be noted, however, that the average food prices in this report reflect variations in brand, quality, and size among geographic areas. Users of average food prices should be aware that these differences exist.

Because a number of food commodities are not available in all areas on a year-round basis, prices will not appear in some months for some regions or for the U.S. city average. In other instances, sufficient prices may not be available due to temporary disruptions in supplies. Where no average prices are available, the designation NA will appear. When a price is not available from an individual store in any month, an estimated price will be calculated for the missing item and used in computing the average price. In cases where the proportion of estimated prices used to calculate the average is considered too high, the average price will not be published and NA will appear for that item in the table.

Because of space limitations in the table, the description for each item is abbreviated. More detailed specifications are available from BLS Regional Offices or from the Washington Office upon request.

## Reference Base Change

Beginning with the release of data for January 1988 in February 1988, most Consumer Price Indexes have shifted to a new reference base year. All indexes previously expressed on a base of 1967=100, or any other base through December 1981, have been rebased to 1982-84=100. Only indexes with a base later than December 1981 have maintained their bases. This base change was reviewed by the Office of Federal Statistical Policy and Standards, Office of Management and Budget, and is in keeping with the Government's longstand-

ing policy to update index bases periodically. Selection of the 1982-84 period was made to coincide with the updated expenditure weights, which are based upon data tabulated from the Consumer Expenditure Surveys for 1982, 1983, and 1984. The last previous rebasing of CPI data occurred in February 1971, when the 1967 base was substituted for the former 1957-59 base.

Historical data for each CPI series on the new base are available from the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). For the convenience of users, the BLS will continue to publish all-items indexes for the U.S. city average, and for the individual local areas for which CPI's are published, on their former official reference base (1967=100 in most cases).

Conversion factors and an accompanying fact sheet on rebasing are available from BLS. Dividing by one of these factors will rebase the related index series from its current 1982-84 base to its previous reference base. (*Users should note:* Because of rounding effects, there may be occasional minor differences between the final rebased index and the result obtained using the conversion factor.)

### Adjustment of Shelter Indexes for Aging Effects

Beginning with the January 1988 CPI, the Bureau of Labor Statistics adjusted the monthly CPI shelter indexes for the change in quality resulting from the effect of aging on rental housing. In January 1987, the Bureau announced its intention to begin making such adjustments, assuming that further research substantiated the need to do so. The decision to implement the adjustment was based on extensive BLS research, in which alternative adjustment methods were explored and tested. Evaluation of the research indicates that an aging effect exists, and that the chosen method is operationally feasible.<sup>1</sup> The adjustment affects CPI shelter indexes, which would have been raised by 0.2 percent for the year 1987 had an aging adjustment been applied.

The quality of a housing unit decreases as the unit ages. Existing BLS methods are used to correct for relatively easily measured quality changes such as the addition of an extra bedroom, but such methods are inadequate to correct for deterioration in the condition of housing units.<sup>2</sup> The aging ad-

justment method was specifically designed to correct for quality changes associated with this deterioration. The BLS used hedonic regression methods to estimate the aging effect. The estimates were then used to correct the CPI rent and rental equivalence indexes. Hedonic regressions are statistical functions that relate the price of a good to its attributes or characteristics. For example, a hedonic regression relates a housing unit's rent to its size, age, location, etc. By using BLS housing survey data from 1987 and Census data from 1980, hedonic regression methods provided estimates of the relationship between a housing unit's rent and age while other housing unit characteristics were held constant. The estimated relationship was then used to construct the aging adjustment. Estimates will be recomputed annually by using the previous year's BLS housing survey data and the most recently available Census data.

### Seasonally Adjusted and Unadjusted Data

Because price data are used for different purposes by different groups, the Bureau of Labor Statistics publishes seasonally adjusted as well as unadjusted changes each month.

For analyzing general price trends in the economy, seasonally adjusted changes are usually preferred since they eliminate the effect of changes that normally occur at the same time and in about the same magnitude every year—such as price movements resulting from changing climatic conditions, production cycles, model changeovers, holidays, and sales.

The unadjusted data are of primary interest to consumers concerned about the prices they actually pay. Unadjusted data are also used extensively for escalation purposes. Many collective bargaining contract agreements and pension plans, for example, tie compensation changes to the Consumer Price Index unadjusted for seasonal variation.

Seasonal factors used in computing the seasonally adjusted indexes are derived by the X-11 ARIMA Seasonal Adjustment Method. The updated seasonal data at the end of 1977 replaced data from 1967 through 1977. Subsequent annual updates have replaced 5 years of seasonal data, e.g., data from 1983 through 1987 were replaced at the end of 1987. The seasonal movement of all items and 43 other aggregations is derived by combining the seasonal movement of 50 selected components. Each year the seasonal status of every series is reevaluated based upon certain statistical criteria. If any of the 50 components change their status from not seasonally adjusted to seasonally adjusted, seasonally adjusted indexes will be used before the period.

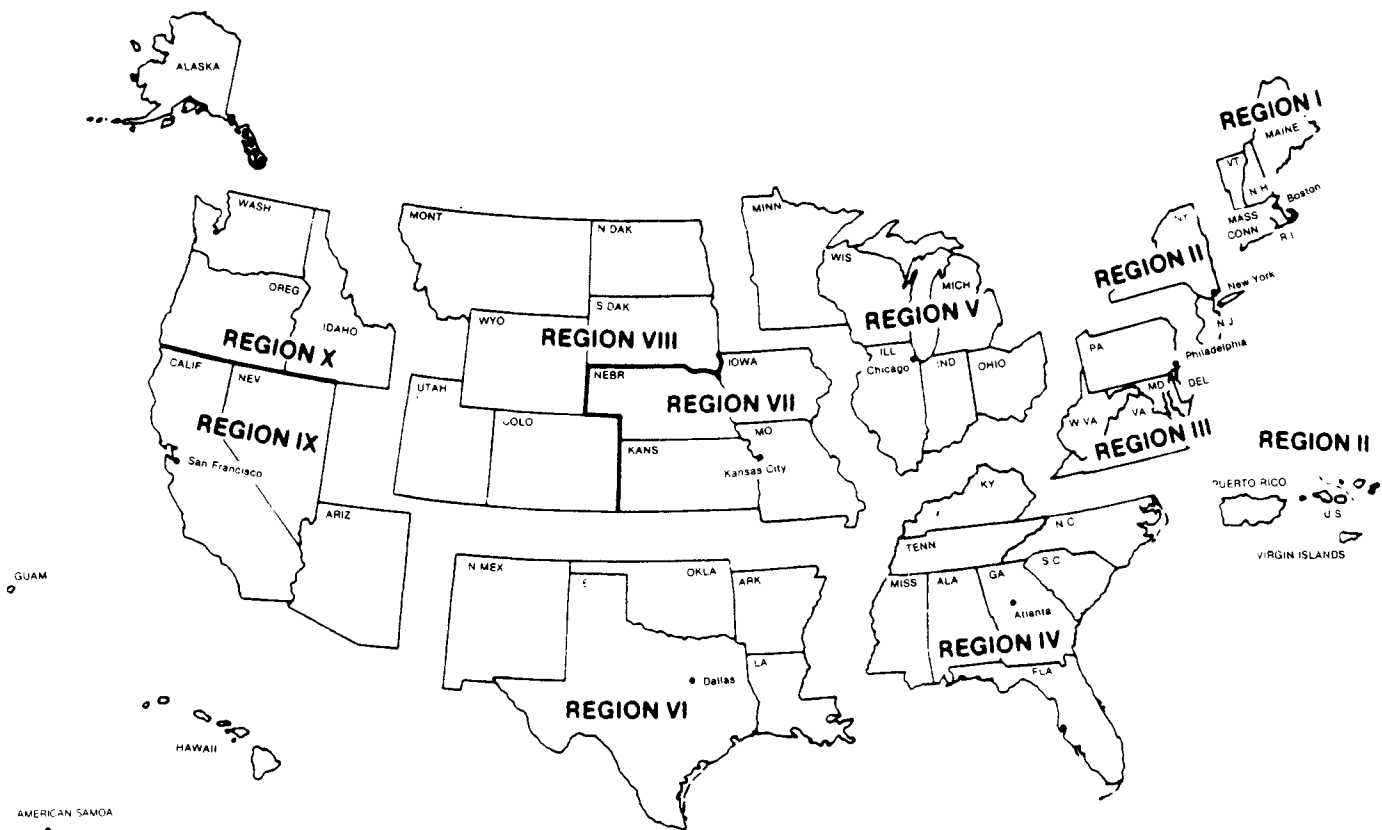
