Price Movements

August 1983

The Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) increased 0.3 percent before seasonal adjustment in August. The August level of 300.3 (1967 = 100) was 2.6 percent higher than the index in August 1982.

The Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) rose 0.4 percent in August, prior to seasonal adjustment, to a level of 299.5 (1967 = 100). For the 12-month period ended in August, the CPI-W has increased 2.4 percent. The CPI-W is used for indexing Social Security and some other Federal payments. It is also commonly used as an escalator in collective bargaining agreements.

CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U)—seasonally adjusted changes

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI for All Urban Consumers rose 0.4 percent in August, the same as in July. During the first 8 months of 1983, the CPI-U rose at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 3.4 percent. A substantial rise in the transportation component—primarily due to price increases for motor vehicles and gasoline—accounted for about half of the advance in the August CPI. The food and beverage index registered a small increase, following declines in each of the preceding 2 months. All of the remaining major expenditure categories rose less than in July.

The transportation component advanced 1.0 percent in August, following a 0.5 percent rise in July. Gasoline prices advanced 1.1 percent, after seasonal adjustment, and were 8.4 percent below their peak level of March 1981. New and used car prices rose 0.8 and 1.8 percent,

respectively. The rise in new car prices followed a 4-month period in which prices declined, while August was the fourth month in which used car prices have risen sharply. Automobile finance charges—which had declined in each of the preceding 12 months—advanced 2.4 percent in August. The index for public transportation rose 0.5 percent.

The 0.2 percent rise in the food and beverage component was the first increase since May. Grocery store food prices, which also had declined in June and July, were unchanged in August. The index for meats, poultry, fish, and eggs declined, but by less than in the preceding 2 months. Beef and pork prices continued to decline and remained well below their levels of a year ago. Poultry prices, however, rose sharply for the second month and are now higher than last year. The fruit and vegetable index rose 0.8 percent in August compared with 0.3 percent in July. The 5.8 percent increase in fresh vegetables prices, following large declines in June and July, was partially offset by a 2.1 percent decrease in prices for fresh fruits. Processed fruit and vegetable prices increased 0.5 percent in both July and August. All other grocery store food groups continued to record either very small increases or declines in August. Prices for restaurant meals rose 0.6 percent, while prices for alcoholic beverages were unchanged.

The housing component rose 0.2 percent in August, following an increase of 0.4 percent in July. Shelter costs increased 0.4 percent, with renters' costs up 0.5 percent and homeowners' costs 0.3 percent higher. The 0.3 percent rise in the index for fuel and utilities was the

same as in July. Moderate increases in fuel oil prices and water and sewerage costs were partially offset by declines in charges for electricity and natural gas. The decline in natural gas was the second in the past 3 months. Between August 1981 and May 1982, natural gas prices had risen at an annual rate of 22.5 percent. The index for household furnishings and operations declined 0.1 percent.

Medical care costs rose 0.5 percent in August, about the same as in each of the preceding 5 months. Prices for medical care commodities and medical care services both increased 0.5 percent in August. During the past 12 months, medical care commodities have risen 8.3 percent, less than the double digit rates of the preceding 2 years. Within medical care services, charges for professional services and hospital rooms rose 0.6 and 0.9 percent, respectively, in August. The 12-month changes in these components, 7.1 and 11.0 percent, respectively, were lower than the rates that had prevailed during the prior 3 years.

The index for apparel and upkeep advanced 0.4 percent in August, about the same as the 0.5 percent average monthly increase since April.

The index for other goods and services registered an increase of 0.6 percent in August, compared with 1.3 percent in July. A smaller but still substantial increase in


cigarette prices—up 1.1 percent—accounted for about half the increase. The entertainment index rose 0.3 percent as a sharp increase in prices for reading materials was partially offset by declines in movie admission fees and other entertainment services.

CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W)—seasonally adjusted changes

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers rose 0.5 percent in August, following a 0.3 percent increase in July. Larger increases in the transportation and housing components and a turnaround in the food and beverage index contributed to the acceleration.


The 0.5 percent rise in the CPI-W compares with an increase of 0.4 percent in the CPI-U. In the CPI-U, the homeowners' cost index—which uses a rental equivalence approach—rose 0.3 percent in August. Homeownership in the CPI-W, which is based on house prices, mortgage interest rates, property taxes, property insurance, and maintenance and repair costs, rose 0.8 percent in August. Mortgage interest rates, property taxes, and maintenance and repair costs all registered large increases, while house prices rose moderately and property insurance costs were unchanged.

Chart 1. CPI-U: All Items, food and beverages, 1972-83





Chart 2. CPI-U: Housing, apparel and upkeep, 1972-83





Therefore, the Bureau of Labor Statistics strongly urges users to consider adopting the national average CPI for use in escalator clauses.

NOTE: Local area CPI indexes are by-products of the national CPI program. Because each local index is a small subset of the national index, it has a smaller sample size and is, therefore, subject to substantially more sampling and other measurement error than the national index. As a result, local area indexes show greater volatility than the national index, although their long-term trends are quite similar.

Therefore, the Bureau of Labor Statistics strongly urges users to consider adopting the national average CPI for use in escalator clauses.

Technical Notes

Brief Explanation of the CPI

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change in prices over time in a fixed market basket of goods and services. Effective with the January 1978 index, the Bureau of Labor Statistics began publishing CPI's for two population groups: (1) a new CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) which covers approximately 80 percent of the total noninstitutional civilian population; and (2) a revised CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) which represents about half the population covered by the CPI-U. The CPI-U includes, in addition to wage earners and clerical workers, groups which historically have been excluded from CPI coverage, such as professional, managerial, and technical workers, the self-employed, short-term workers, the unemployed, and retirees and others not in the labor force.

The CPI is based on prices of food, clothing, shelter, and fuels, transportation fares, charges for doctors' and dentists' services, drugs, and the other goods and services that people buy for day-to-day living. Prices are collected in 85 urban areas across the country from about 18,000 tenants, 18,000 housing units for property taxes, and about 24,000 establishments—grocery and department stores, hospitals, filling stations, and other types of stores and service establishments. All taxes directly associated with the purchase and use of items are included in the index. Prices of food, fuels, and few other items are obtained every month in all 85 locations. Prices of most other commodities and services are collected every month in the five largest geographic areas and every other month in other areas. Prices of most goods and services are obtained by personal visits of the Bureau's trained representatives. Mail questionnaires are used to obtain public utility rates, some fuel prices, and certain other items.

In calculating the index, price changes for the various items in each location are averaged together with weights which represent their importance in the spending of the appropriate population group. Local data are then combined to obtain a U.S. city average. Separate indexes are also published by size of city, by region of the country, for cross-classifications of regions and population-size classes, and for 28 local areas. Area indexes do not measure differences in the level of prices among cities; they only measure the average change in prices for each area since the base period.

The index measures price changes from a designated reference date—1967—which equals 100.0. An increase of 122 percent, for example, is shown as 222.0. This change can also be expressed in dollars as follows: The price of a base period "market basket" of goods and services in the CPI has risen from \$10 in 1967 to \$22.20.

A Note About Calculating Index Changes

Movements of the indexes from one month to another are usually expressed as percent changes rather than changes in index points because index point changes are affected by the level of the index in relation to its base period while percent changes are not. The example in the accompanying box illustrates the computation of index point and percent changes.

Percent changes for 3-months and 6-month periods are expressed as annual rates and are computed according to the standard formula for compound growth rates. These data indicate what the percent change would be if the current rate were maintained for a 12-month period.

Seasonally Adjusted and Unadjusted Data

Because price data are used for different purposes by different groups, the Bureau of Labor Statistics publishes seasonally adjusted as well as unadjusted changes each month.

For analyzing general price trends in the economy, seasonally adjusted changes are usually preferred since they eliminate the effect of changes that normally occur at the same time and in about the same magnitude every year—such as price movements resulting from changing climatic conditions, production cycles, model changeovers, holidays, and sales.

The unadjusted data are also used extensively for escalation purposes. Many collective bargaining contract agreements and pension plans, for example, tie compensation changes to the Consumer Price Index unadjusted for seasonal variation.

Seasonal factors used to compute the seasonally adjusted indexes are derived by the X-11 Variant of the Census Method II Seasonal Adjustment Program. Annual updates replace 5 years of seasonal data, e.g., data from 1977 through 1981 were replaced at the end of 1981. The seasonal movement of all items and 35 other aggregations is derived by combining the seasonal movement of 45 selected components. Each year the seasonal status of every series is reevaluated based upon certain statistical criteria. If any of the 45 selected components changes its seasonal status, seasonal data from 1967 forward for the all-items and for any of the 35 other aggregations that have that series as a component, are replaced.

Homeownership Changes

Effective with release of the index for January 1983, the Bureau of Labor Statistics changed the way homeowner costs are measured in the CPI-U to rental equivalence. The rental equivalence approach calculates homeowner costs of the shelter based on the implicit rent owners would have to pay to rent the homes they own. The old method calculated homeowner costs as home purchase, mortgage interest costs, property taxes, property insurance and maintenance and repair.

As previously announced, the CPI-W will be changed to rental equivalence effective with data for January 1985. The CPI experimental measures, known as the

CPI-U, X-1 through CPI-U, X-5 are no longer being published.

The new homeowners' cost component was introduced into the CPI-U in such a manner that the indexes using the old and new methodologies were equal in the so-called link month—December 1982. A similar technique will be employed for the CPI-W in December 1984. This technical procedure has been used in previous revisions of the CPI. In accordance with historical practice, the BLS made available calculations for the CPI-U from January to June 1983 based on the old method of homeownership. A 6-month overlap period for the CPI-W will also be made available to users; it will run from January to June 1985.

The new homeowners' cost component is similar to the one used in the CPI-U, X-1, with 4 important refinements. First, BLS has calculated a set of owner weights for the individual units in the CPI rent sample. These new weights make the rent sample represent owner occupied housing and permit the calculation of a rent change estimate for homeowners.


Second, the Bureau has augmented the rent sample in order to enhance the rental equivalence measure. This new sampling is concentrated in areas where the housing is predominantly owner-occupied in order to increase the proportion of rental units that have characteristics similar to owner-occupied units.

Third, the expenditure weight for rental equivalence, which for the experimental index, X-1, was calculated by means of a short-cut method, has been recalculated using the complex statistical estimating procedure used for weights in the official CPI. In addition, the weights associated with other homeowner expenditures for such things as insurance, appliances, and maintenance and repairs have been modified to be consistent with the rental equivalence concept. This enhancement has improved the quality of the national CPI's rental equivalence weight and provides weights for computation of local area CPI-U's using the rental equivalence approach.

Finally, the computer system which produces the CPI each month has been expanded to accommodate the calculation, with complete item and geographic detail, and with proper geographic weighting for the rental equivalence approach. BLS will continue to work on other refinements in the statistical estimating techniques used in the rental equivalence measure.
