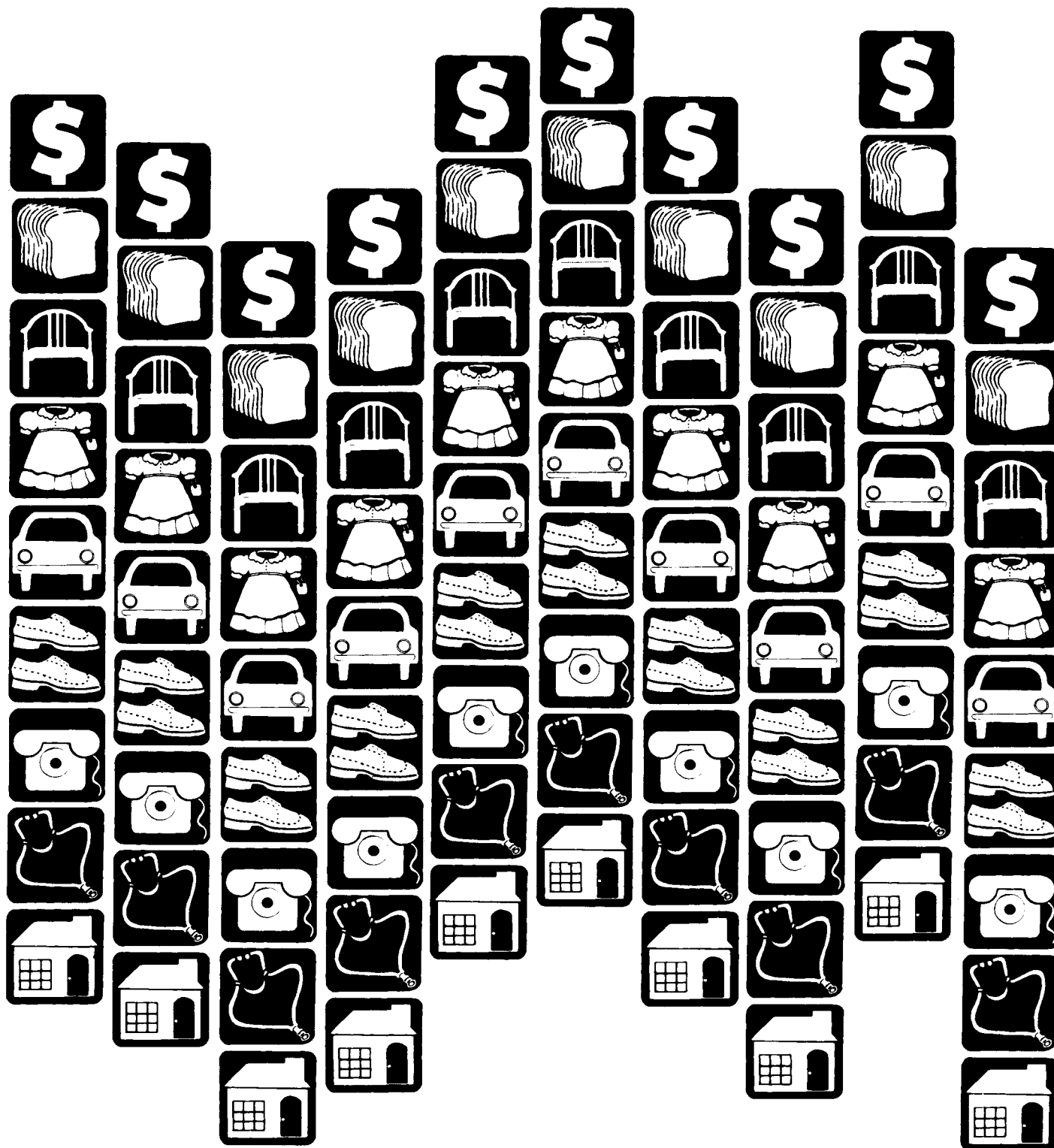

Price Movements

August 1985

The Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) increased 0.2 percent before seasonal adjustment in August to a level of 323.5 (1967=100). For the 12-month period ended in August, the CPI-U increased 3.4 percent.

The Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) also rose 0.2 percent in August, prior to seasonal adjustment. The August 1985 CPI-W level of 319.6 was 3.0 percent higher than the index in August 1984.

CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U)—seasonally adjusted changes

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI for All Urban Consumers rose 0.2 percent in August, the same as in each of the preceding 3 months. The August increase brought the seasonally adjusted annual rate of advance for the year to date to 3.3 percent; this compares with 4.0 percent for all of 1984. The slowdown in consumer prices this year occurred in the May-August period, during which the CPI-U increased at an annual rate of 2.5 percent. This deceleration was largely a result of declines in prices for used cars, energy, and grocery store foods—all of which had registered price increases in the first 4 months of 1985. The effect of these declines in the May-August period was partially offset by an acceleration in shelter costs, which advanced at an 8.1-percent annual rate, following a 4.6-percent increase during the first 4 months. Shelter costs accounted for 70 percent of the overall CPI-U increase in the May-August

period. Prices for items other than used cars, energy, grocery store foods, and shelter rose, on average, at virtually the same rates in both periods.

The transportation component—down 0.4 percent in August—declined for the fourth consecutive month, following large increases in March and April. Used car and gasoline prices continued to be largely responsible for the slowdown. Used car prices, which dropped 1.2 percent in August, have declined 5.3 percent since April. Gasoline prices—down 0.8 percent in August—were also below their level of April and 12.1 percent below their peak level of March 1981. The continued drop in automobile finance charges—down 2.5 percent in August, the ninth consecutive monthly decline—has also contributed to the drop in transportation costs. On the other hand, prices for new cars rose 0.4 percent, following seasonal adjustment. The index for automobile insurance increased 0.8 percent in August and is 11.3 percent above its level a year ago. The index for public transportation advanced 0.3 percent, largely due to increases in charges for intracity mass transit.

The food and beverage component rose 0.1 percent in August, the same as in each of the 2 preceding months. Increases in the indexes for food away from home and alcoholic beverages—up 0.3 and 0.6 percent, respectively—more than offset a 0.1-percent decline in grocery store foods. Within the food-at-home component, declines were recorded in the indexes for fruits and vegetables, meats, poultry, fish, and eggs and dairy products. Fresh vegetable prices, which increased in July,

declined 2.1 percent in August and more than offset the small increases in prices for fresh fruits and processed fruits and vegetables. Beef, pork, and poultry prices each declined in August. Beef prices declined in each of the first 8 months of 1985 and were 7.7 percent below their December 1984 level. As of August, pork prices were also lower than at the end of 1984, while poultry prices were at virtually the same level. The other two major grocery store food groups—cereal and bakery products and other foods at home—rose 0.4 and 0.2 percent, respectively, in August.

The housing component rose 0.5 percent in August, following increases of 0.3 percent in both June and July. A larger increase in the index for shelter—up 0.7 percent in August—and a turnaround in the index for household furnishings and operations more than offset a decline in the index for fuel and other utilities. Within the shelter component, renters' costs rose 0.6 percent; homeowners' costs, 0.7 percent; and maintenance and repair costs, 0.8 percent. The index for household furnishings and operations increased 0.6 percent in August, following declines in each of the 2 preceding months. The 0.1-percent decrease in the index for fuel and other utilities was largely due to declines in the indexes for natural gas and fuel oil. Prices for fuel oil declined 0.7 percent in August and were 17.1 percent lower than their peak level of April 1981. The index for natural gas declined 1.1 percent in August and was 1.4 percent lower than its level a year ago. Partly offsetting these declines were increases in the indexes for electricity and telephone services—up 0.3 and 0.6 percent, respectively.

The medical care component rose 0.5 percent in August, the same as in July. The index for medical care commodities—prescription drugs, nonprescription drugs, and medical supplies—increased 0.6 percent. The cost of medical care services rose 0.5 percent, with physicians' fees and hospital rooms up 0.7 and 0.3 percent, respectively.

The index for apparel and upkeep increased 0.3 percent in August after declining in July. August clothing

prices, reflecting the continued shift to fall and winter wear items, increased, on average, about the same as in recent years. The index for apparel services rose 0.7 percent.

The entertainment index declined 0.1 percent in August, following increases of 0.5 percent in both June and July. Prices for magazines, periodicals, and books, which had increased sharply in June and July, declined 1.4 percent in August and were largely responsible for the turnaround.

The other goods and services component advanced 0.5 percent in August, following an increase of 0.8 percent in July. Cigarette prices, which had risen sharply in July in response to a wholesale price hike in late June, rose 0.4 percent in August.

CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W)—seasonally adjusted changes

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers rose 0.2 percent in August, the same as the CPI-U. (The rental equivalence approach to homeownership has been used in the CPI-U since January 1985. The methodology and samples of areas, items, outlets, and prices are identical in both the CPI-W and the CPI-U, and differences in monthly changes result only from different expenditure patterns and seasonal adjustment factors.)

Local area CPI changes

The Bureau of Labor Statistics will improve the sample of urban areas in which it gathers prices for monthly preparation of the Consumer Price Index beginning in 1987. At the same time, the Bureau will publish a number of local area CPI's less frequently. See the last page of the Technical Notes for additional detail.

Homeownership changes

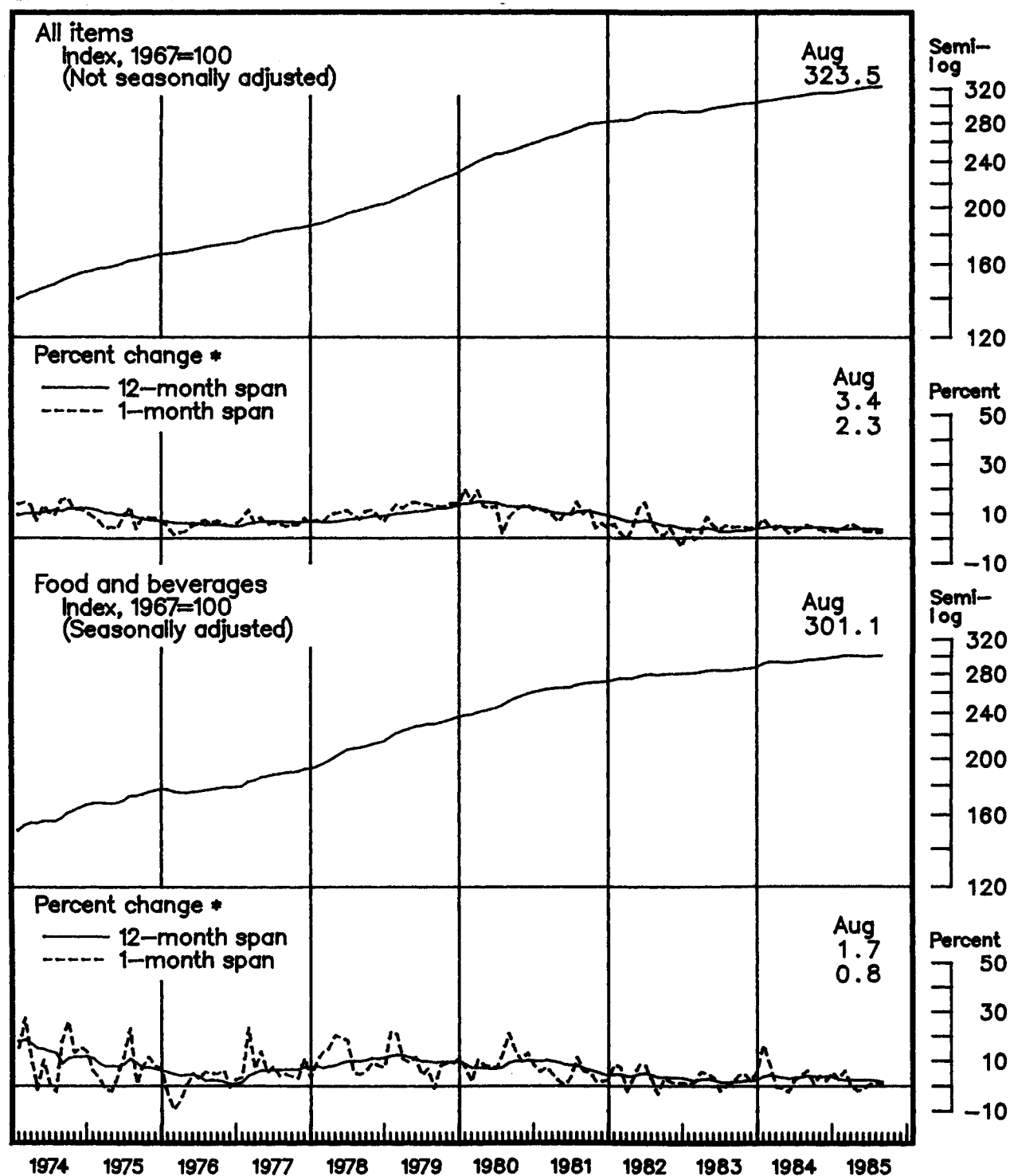
As announced in October 1981, the Bureau of Labor Statistics has changed the treatment of homeownership

January 1985. See the last page of the Technical Notes for additional detail.

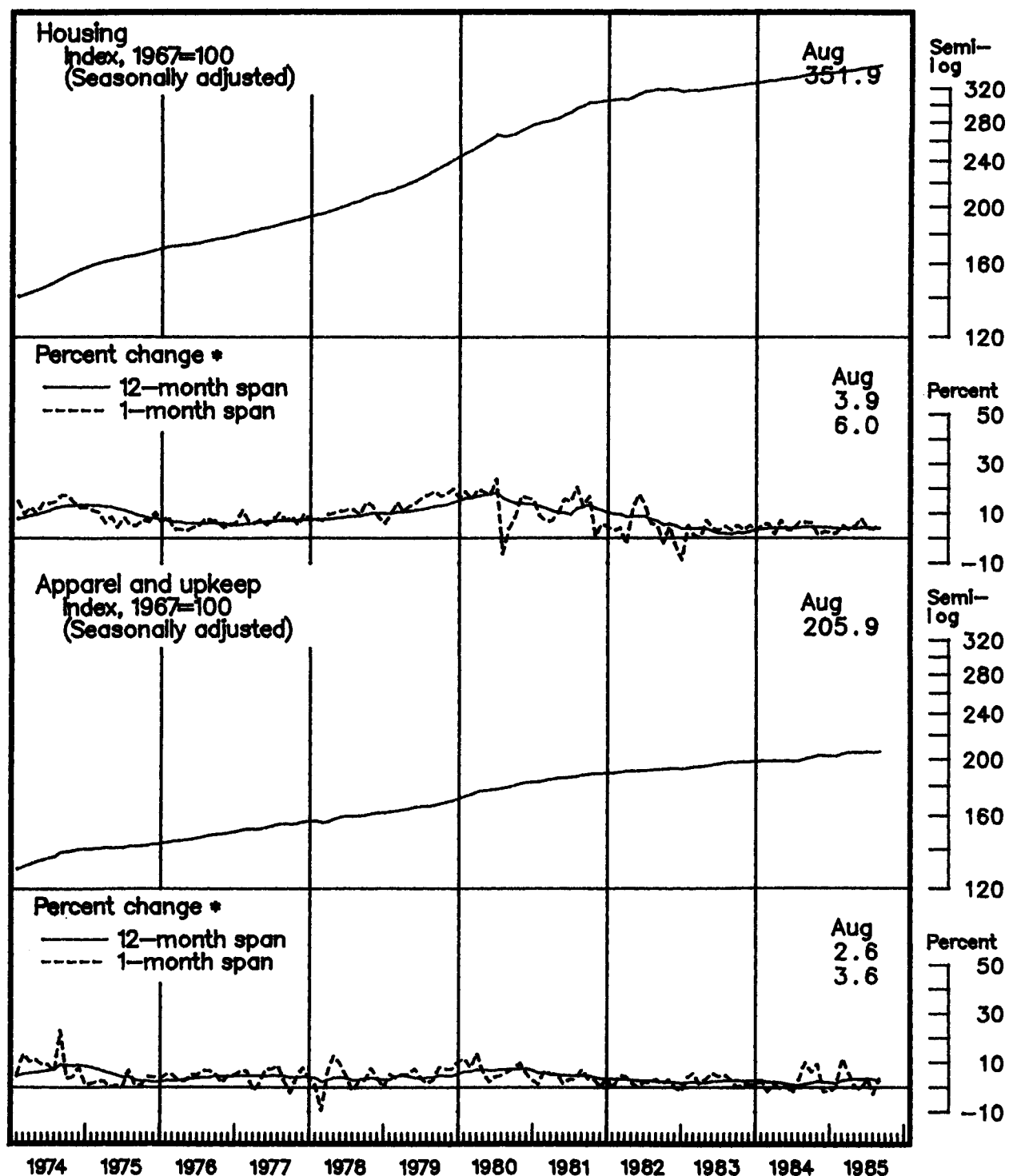

Chart 1: CPI-U: All items, food and beverages, 1974-85



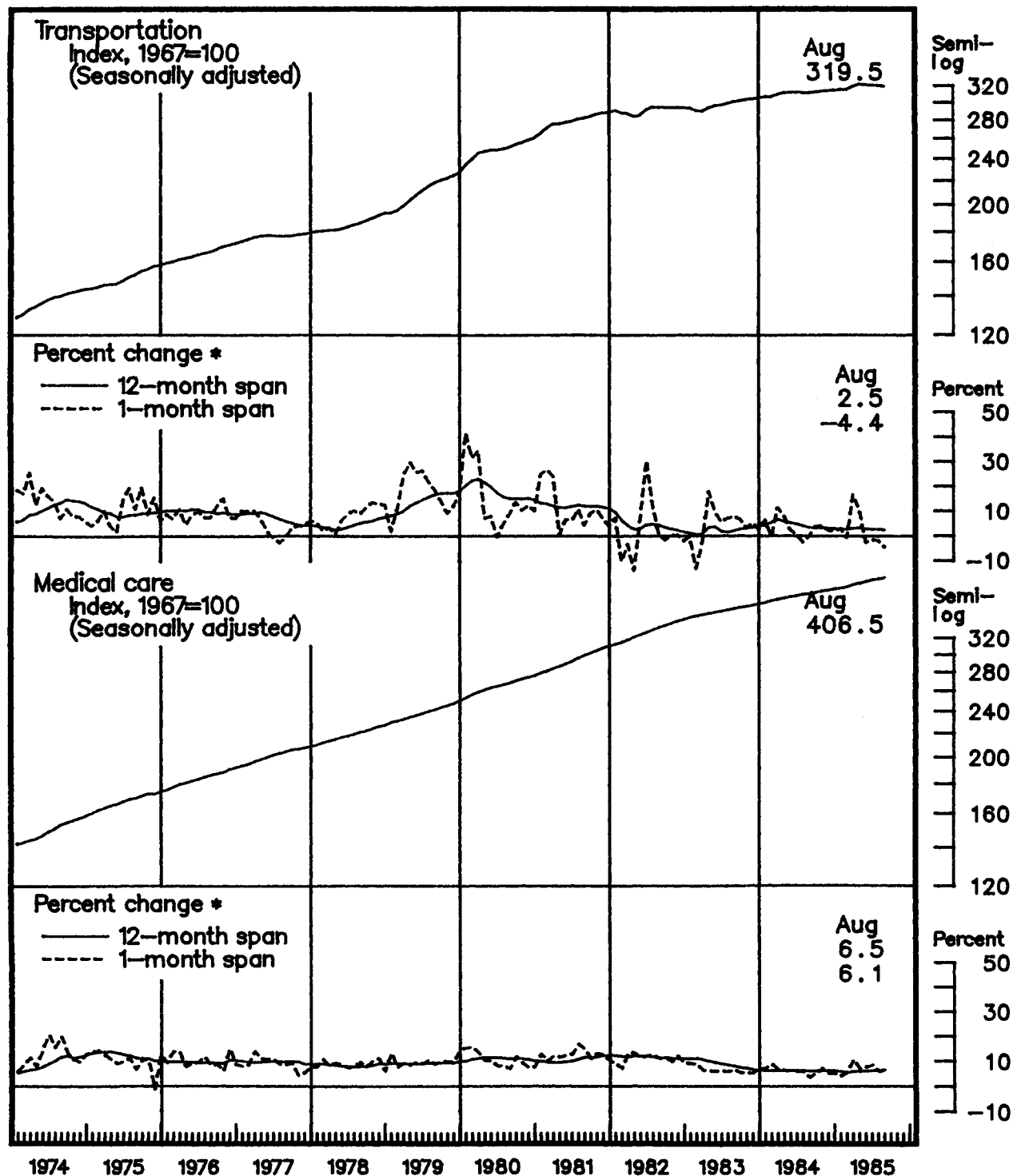

Chart 2: CPI-U: Housing, apparel and upkeep, 1974-85



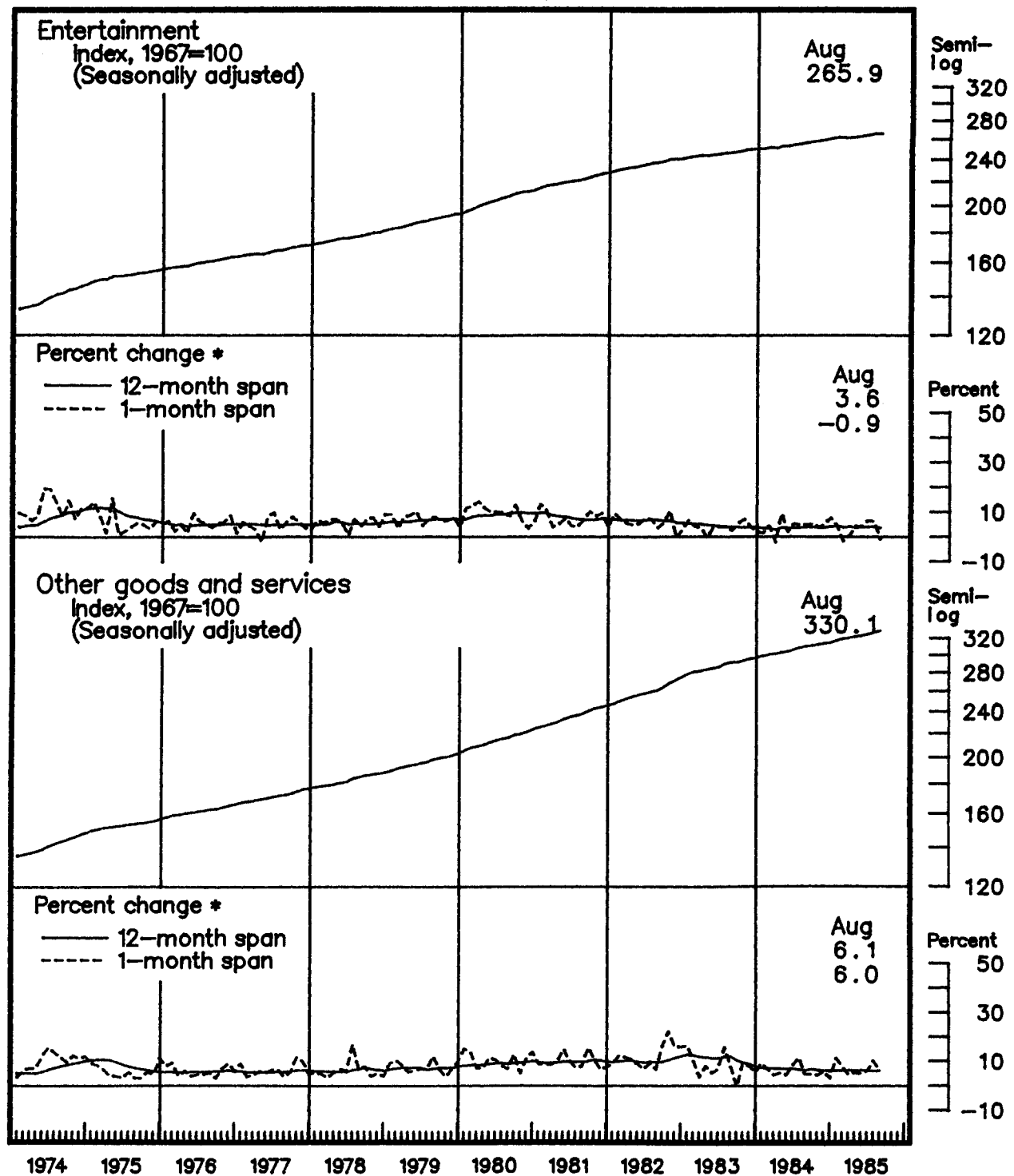

Because each local index is a small subset of the national index, it has a smaller sample size and is, therefore, subject to substantially more sampling and other measurement error than the national index. As a result, local area indexes show greater volatility than the national index, although their long-term trends are quite similar. Therefore, the Bureau of Labor Statistics strongly urges users to consider adopting the national average CPI for use in escalator clauses.

Therefore, the Bureau of Labor Statistics strongly urges users to consider adopting the national average CPI for use in escalator clauses.

Technical Notes

Brief Explanation of the CPI

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change in prices over time in a fixed market basket of goods and services. The Bureau of Labor Statistics publishes CPI's for two population groups: (1) a CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) which covers approximately 80 percent of the total noninstitutional civilian population; and (2) a CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) which represents about half the population covered by the CPI-U. The CPI-U includes, in addition to wage earners and clerical workers, groups such as professional, managerial, and technical workers, the self-employed, short-term workers, the unemployed, and retirees and others not in the labor force.

The CPI is based on prices of food, clothing, shelter, and fuels, transportation fares, charges for doctors' and dentists' services, drugs, and the other goods and services that people buy for day-to-day living. Prices are collected in 85 urban areas across the country from about 4,000 food stores, 24,000 rental units, and 28,000 establishments—department stores, hospitals, filling stations, and other types of stores and service establishments. All taxes directly associated with the purchase and use of items are included in the index. Prices of food, fuels, and a few other items are obtained every month in all 85 locations. Prices of most other commodities and services are collected every month in the five largest geographic areas and every other month in other areas. Prices of most goods and services are obtained by personal visits of the Bureau's trained representatives. Mail questionnaires are used to obtain public utility rates, some fuel prices, and certain other items.

In calculating the index, price changes for the various items in each location are averaged together with weights which represent their importance in the spending of the appropriate population group. Local data are then combined to obtain a U.S. city average. Separate indexes are also published by size of city, by region of the country, for cross-classifications of regions and population-size classes, and for 28 local areas. Area indexes do not measure differences in the level of prices

among cities, they only measure the average change in prices for each area since the base period.

The index measures price changes from a designated reference date—1967—which equals 100.0. An increase of 203 percent, for example, is shown as 303.0. This change can also be expressed in dollars as follows: The price of a base period "market basket" of goods and services in the CPI has risen from \$10 in 1967 to \$30.30.

Calculating Index Changes

Movements of the indexes from one month to another are usually expressed as percent changes rather than changes in index points, because index point changes are affected by the level of the index in relation to its base period while percent changes are not. The example in the accompanying box illustrates the computation of index point and percent changes.

Percent changes for 3-month and 6-month periods are expressed as annual rates and are computed according to the standard formula for compound growth rates. These data indicate what the percent change would be if the current rate were maintained for a 12-month period.

Homeownership Changes

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) has been changed to incorporate a rental equivalence measure of homeowners' costs in accordance with plans announced by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) on October 27, 1981. For the CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U), this change was effective with release of the index for January 1983 and for the CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W), it was effective with the release of the January 1985 index. The rental equivalence approach calculates shelter costs of homeowners based on the implicit rent owners would have to pay to rent homes that they own. The old method calculated homeownership as home purchase, mortgage interest costs, property taxes, property insurance, and maintenance and repairs. The new homeownership component was introduced into both the CPI-U and the CPI-W in such a manner that in each case the indexes using the old and new methodologies were equal in the so-called "link month"—December 1982 for the CPI-U and December 1984 for the CPI-W. For more information, see the *CPI Detailed Report* for January 1983, pp. 7-13.

Changes in frequency of publication for local area CPI's to begin in 1987

The Bureau of Labor Statistics will improve the sample of urban areas in which it gathers prices for monthly preparation of the Consumer Price Index beginning in 1987. At the same time, the Bureau will publish a number of local area CPI's less frequently.

The changes in publication frequency arise from the requirement to allocate the sample to reflect population shifts in the 1980 census so as to provide the most accurate national CPI possible with the funds available. As a result, some local areas will no longer have samples sufficient to permit more frequent publication.

In addition to the national index for all cities, the Bureau now publishes indexes for 28 urban areas. In 1987, it will continue to publish indexes for all but one of these areas—Northeast Pennsylvania (Scranton—Wilkes-Barre).

Of the remaining 27 published urban areas, 13 will have a reduction in frequency beginning in 1987. The index for Detroit, currently published monthly, will be published only in the even numbered months. Twelve areas now published bimonthly will be compiled on a semiannual average basis. These areas are: Buffalo-Niagara Falls, NY; Cincinnati-Hamilton, OH-KY-IN; Kansas City, MO-Kansas City, KS; Milwaukee, WI; Minneapolis-St. Paul, MN-WI; Atlanta, GA; Anchorage, AK; Denver-Boulder, CO; Honolulu, HI; Portland-Vancouver, OR-WA; San Diego, CA; and Seattle-Tacoma, WA. These semi-annual average in-

dexes, which refer to the arithmetic averages of the 6-month periods from January through June and July through December, will be published with release of the CPI for July and January, respectively, i.e., in the months of August and February. These series will be compiled and published on their present reference bases, 1967 = 100 for all areas other than Anchorage, which is on an October 1967 reference base. Also, the Cleveland-Akron-Lorain, OH, indexes will be published in odd-numbered rather than even-numbered months.

Seasonally Adjusted and Unadjusted Data

Because price data are used for different purposes by different groups, the Bureau of Labor Statistics publishes seasonally adjusted as well as unadjusted changes each month.

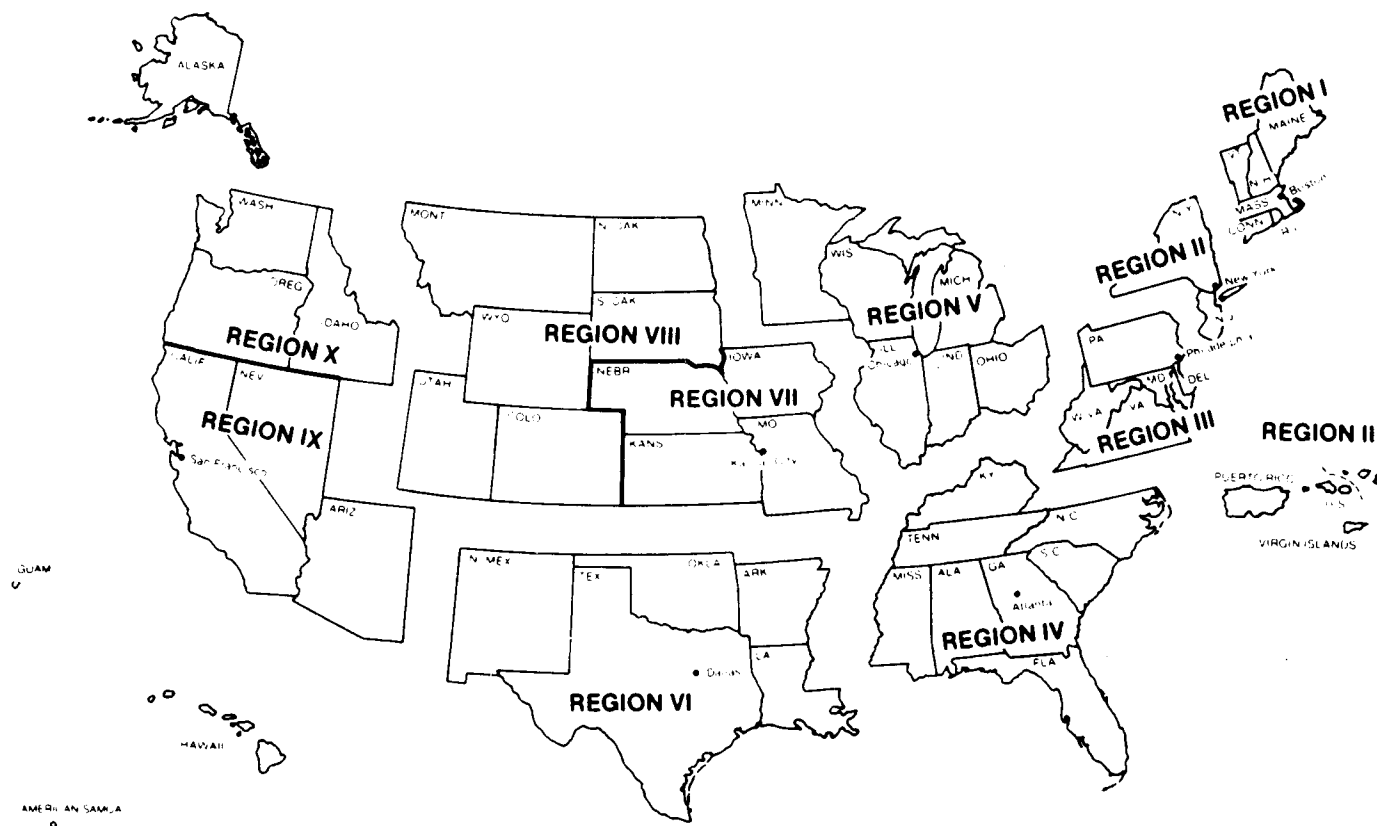
For analyzing general price trends in the economy, seasonally adjusted changes are usually preferred since they eliminate the effect of changes that normally occur at the same time and in about the same magnitude every year—such as price movements resulting from changing climatic conditions, production cycles, model changes, holidays, and sales.

The unadjusted data are of primary interest to consumers concerned about the prices they actually pay. Unadjusted data also are used extensively for escalation purposes. Many collective bargaining contract agreements and pension plans, for example, tie compensation changes to the Consumer Price Index unadjusted for seasonal variation.

Seasonal factors used in computing the seasonally adjusted indexes are derived by the X-11 Seasonal Adjustment Method. The updated seasonal data at the end of 1977 replaced data from 1967 through 1977. Subsequent annual updates have replaced 5 years of seasonal data, e.g., data from 1980 through 1984 were replaced at the end of 1984. The seasonal movement of all items and 44 other aggregations is derived by combining the seasonal movement of 51 selected components. Each year the seasonal status of every series is reevaluated based upon certain statistical criteria. If any of the 51 components change their seasonal adjustment status from seasonally adjusted to not seasonally adjusted, not seasonally adjusted data will be used for the last 5 years, but the seasonally adjusted indexes will be used before that period. If any of the 51 components change their status from not seasonally adjusted to seasonally adjusted, seasonally adjusted data will be used for the last 5 years, but not seasonally adjusted indexes will be used before that period.

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
