

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The CPI Detailed Report is a monthly report on consumer price movements, including statistical tables and technical notes. The report covers two indexes, the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) and the Consumer Price Index for Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W). The indexes reflect data for the U.S. city average and selected areas.

Data for November 1984

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Price Movements November 1984

The Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) was unchanged prior to seasonal adjustment. The November level of 315.3 (1967=100) was 4.0 percent higher than the index in November 1983.

The Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) declined 0.1 percent in November, before seasonal adjustment, to a level of 311.9 (1967=100). For the 12-month period ended in November, the CPI-W increased 3.5 percent. The CPI-W is used for indexing Social Security and some other Federal payments. It is also commonly used as an escalator in collective bargaining agreements.

CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U)—seasonally adjusted changes

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI for All Urban Consumers rose 0.2 percent in November, somewhat less than in recent months. The transportation component rose markedly less than in October, reflecting a much smaller increase in gasoline prices and declines in new and used car prices. Somewhat smaller increases in the food and beverage and medical care components and a decline in apparel prices also contributed to the slowdown in November. On the other hand, increases in the indexes for housing, entertainment, and other goods and services were slightly larger than in October.

During the first 11 months of 1984, the CPI rose at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 4.1 percent. This

compares with a 3.8 percent rate for the 12 months ended in December 1983.

The transportation component, which advanced 0.7 percent in October, rose 0.1 percent in November. The slowdown was primarily due to gasoline and automobile prices. The index for gasoline rose 0.4 percent in November, following seasonal adjustment. The increase, however, was substantially less than those in September and October. Despite the advances in the past 3 months, gasoline prices are 1.8 percent lower than at the end of 1983 and 12.6 percent below their peak level of March 1981. Following seasonal adjustment, new car prices declined 0.3 percent. (Dealer prices for new cars typically rise substantially in November. This year's prices were up 0.9 percent before seasonal adjustment, but because that advance was less than the typical seasonal increase for November, the index declined on a seasonally adjusted basis.) Used car prices declined 0.7 percent, the fourth decrease in the past 5 months.

Among other automobile expenses, smaller increases in November were recorded for automobile maintenance and repairs and automobile finance charges. Although advancing less than in October, the cost of automobile insurance rose substantially for the second consecutive month. Tire prices also advanced sharply in November, following a decline in October, but remained well below their level of a year ago and 11.7 percent below their peak level in June 1982. The index for public transportation increased less than in the preceding

month—up 0.2 percent in November—reflecting smaller increases in fares for airlines and intercity buses and a decline in intracity mass transit fares.

The food and beverage component registered a 0.2 percent increase in November. Grocery store food prices, which advanced 0.4 percent in October, rose 0.1 percent in November as all major groups contributed to the slowdown. Of these groups, the index for fruits and vegetables recorded the largest increase—up 0.7 percent—which was only half the 1.4 percent rise in October. Fresh fruit prices registered a 5.2 percent increase after seasonal adjustment, more than offsetting declines in prices for fresh vegetables and for processed fruits and vegetables. The index for meats, poultry, fish, and eggs declined 0.2 percent, as decreases in prices for pork, poultry, other meats, fish, and eggs offset a moderate increase in beef prices. The index for dairy products continued its recent spurt, advancing 0.4 percent in November, following increases of 0.9 and 0.5 percent in the preceding 2 months. The 1.8 percent increase in the past 3 months compares with a 1.1 percent rise in the first 8 months of 1984. Prices for restaurant meals rose 0.4 percent while the index for alcoholic beverages was unchanged in November.

The housing component advanced 0.3 percent in November, after increasing 0.1 percent in October. The index for fuel and utilities, which declined 0.8 percent in October, rose 0.2 percent in November and was responsible for the acceleration. Charges for electricity, which had declined sharply in October, increased 0.4 percent in November. The index for gas continued to decline, but by much less than in October. On the other hand, fuel oil prices declined slightly—down 0.1 percent—after increasing in October. Among other utilities, the cost of telephone services, reflecting increases in local charges and intrastate toll calls, advanced 0.6 percent. The other two major housing groups registered the same increases as in October. Shelter costs rose 0.4 percent, with renters' costs advancing 0.4 percent, homeowners' costs 0.3 percent, and maintenance and

repair costs 0.4 percent. The index for household furnishings and operations rose 0.1 percent.

The medical care component rose 0.4 percent in November, following an increase of 0.5 percent in October. The index for medical care commodities—prescription drugs, non-prescription drugs, and medical supplies—advanced 0.7 percent. The cost of medical care services rose 0.4 percent, with professional services and hospital rooms up 0.4 and 0.2 percent, respectively.

The index for apparel and upkeep declined slightly—down 0.1 percent in November—following an average monthly increase of 0.6 percent during the preceding 4 months. A decline in the index for apparel commodities, reflecting widespread sales prices for women's clothing, was only partially offset by a 0.4 percent increase in prices for apparel services. The entertainment and other goods and services components both rose 0.5 percent in November after increasing 0.4 percent in each of the preceding 2 months.

CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W)—seasonally adjusted changes

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers rose 0.1 percent in November. This compares with an increase of 0.2 percent in the CPI-U. In the CPI-U, the homeowners' cost index, which uses a rental equivalence approach, rose 0.3 percent in November. Homeownership in the CPI-W, which is based on house prices, mortgage interest rates, property taxes, property insurance, and maintenance and repair costs, declined 0.2 percent in November, primarily due to a 0.5 percent drop in house prices.

Changes in frequency of publication for local area CPI's to begin in 1987

The Bureau of Labor Statistics will improve the sample of urban areas in which it gathers prices for monthly preparation of the Consumer Price Index beginning in

1987. At the same time, the Bureau will publish a number of local area CPI's less frequently.

The changes in publication frequency arise from the requirement to allocate the sample to reflect population shifts in the 1980 Census so as to provide the most accurate national CPI possible with the funds available. As a result, some local areas will no longer have samples sufficient to permit more frequent publication.

In addition to the national index for all cities, the Bureau now publishes indexes for 28 urban areas. In 1987, it will continue to publish indexes for all but one of these areas—Northeast Pennsylvania (Scranton-Wilkes-Barre).

Of the remaining 27 published urban areas, 13 will have a reduction in frequency beginning in 1987. The index for Detroit, currently published monthly, will be published every other month. Twelve areas now published bimonthly will be compiled on a semiannual av-

erage basis. These areas are: Buffalo-Niagara Falls, NY; Cincinnati-Hamilton, OH-KY-IN; Kansas City, MO-Kansas City, KS; Milwaukee, WI; Minneapolis-St. Paul, MN-WI; Atlanta, GA; Anchorage, AK; Denver-Boulder, CO; Honolulu, HI; Portland-Vancouver, OR-WA; San Diego, CA; and Seattle-Tacoma, WA. Also, the Cleveland-Akron-Lorain, OH, indexes will be published in even-numbered rather than odd-numbered months.





Chart 1. CPI-U: All items, food and beverages, 1973-84





Chart 2. CPI-U: Housing, apparel and upkeep, 1973-84





Because each local index is a small subset of the national index, it has a smaller sample size and is, therefore, subject to substantially more sampling and other measurement error than the national index. As a result, local area indexes show greater volatility than the national index, although their long-term trends are quite similar. Therefore, the Bureau of Labor Statistics strongly urges users to consider adopting the national average CPI for use in escalator clauses.

NOTE: Local area CPI indexes are by-products of the national CPI program. Because each local index is a small subset of the national index, it has a smaller sample size and is, therefore, subject to substantially more sampling and other measurement error than the national index. As a result, local area indexes show greater volatility than the national index, although their long-term trends are quite similar. Therefore, the Bureau of Labor Statistics strongly urges users to consider adopting the national average CPI for use in escalator clauses.

Technical Notes

Brief Explanation of the CPI

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change in prices over time in a fixed market basket of goods and services. Effective with the January 1978 index, the Bureau of Labor Statistics began publishing CPI's for two population groups: (1) a new CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) which covers approximately 80 percent of the total noninstitutional civilian population; and (2) a revised CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) which represents about half the population covered by the CPI-U. The CPI-U includes, in addition to wage earners and clerical workers, groups which historically have been excluded from CPI coverage, such as professional, managerial, and technical workers, the self-employed, short-term workers, the unemployed, and retirees and others not in the labor force.

The CPI is based on prices of food, clothing, shelter, and fuels, transportation fares, charges for doctors' and dentists' services, drugs, and the other goods and services that people buy for day-to-day living. Prices are collected in 85 urban areas across the country from about 18,000 tenants, 18,000 housing units for property taxes, and about 24,000 establishments—grocery and department stores, hospitals, filling stations, and other types of stores and service establishments. All taxes directly associated with the purchase and use of items are included in the index. Prices of food, fuels, and a few other items are obtained every month in all 85 locations. Prices of most other commodities and services are collected every month in the five largest geographic areas and every other month in other areas. Prices of most goods and services are obtained by personal visits of the Bureau's trained representatives. Mail questionnaires are used to obtain public utility rates, some fuel prices, and certain other items.

In calculating the index, price changes for the various items in each location are averaged together with weights which represent their importance in the spending of the appropriate population group. Local data are then combined to obtain a U.S. city average. Separate indexes are also published by size of city, by region of the country, for cross-classifications of regions and population-size classes, and for 28 local areas. Area indexes do not measure differences in the level of prices among cities, they only measure the

average change in prices for each area since the base period.

The index measures price changes from a designated reference date—1967—which equals 100.0. An increase of 122 percent, for example, is shown as 222.0. This change can also be expressed in dollars as follows: The price of a base period "market basket" of goods and services in the CPI has risen from \$10 in 1967 to \$22.20.

Calculating Index Changes

Movements of the indexes from one month to another are usually expressed as percent changes rather than changes in index points, because index point changes are affected by the level of the index in relation to its base period while percent changes are not. The example in the accompanying box illustrates the computation of index point and percent changes.

Percent changes for 3-month and 6-month periods are expressed as annual rates and are computed according to the standard formula for compound growth rates. These data indicate what the percent change would be if the current rate were maintained for a 12-month period.

Homeownership Changes

Effective with data for January 1985, the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) will be changed to incorporate a rental equivalence measure of homeownership costs. The Bureau of Labor Statistics announced plans to change the treatment of homeownership costs on October 27, 1981. Effective with release of the index for January 1983, the BLS changed the way homeowner costs are measured in the CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) to rental equivalence.

The rental equivalence approach calculates homeowner costs of the shelter based on the implicit rent owners would have to pay to rent the homes they own. The old method calculated homeowner costs as home purchase, mortgage interest costs, property taxes, property insurance, and maintenance and repair. As with the CPI-U, the new homeownership component will be introduced into the CPI-W in such a manner that the indexes using the old and new methodologies will be equal in the so-called link month—December 1984 for the CPI-W. This technical procedure has also been used in previous revisions of the CPI. In accordance with historical practice, BLS will make available to users, for a 6-month overlap period after the change in the official indexes, calculations based on the current treatment of homeownership. In the case of the CPI-W, the overlap period will run from January to June 1985.

Seasonally Adjusted and Unadjusted Data

Because price data are used for different purposes by different groups, the Bureau of Labor Statistics

publishes seasonally adjusted as well as unadjusted changes each month.

For analyzing general price trends in the economy, seasonally adjusted changes are usually preferred since they eliminate the effect of changes that normally occur at the same time and in about the same magnitude every year—such as price movements resulting from changing climatic conditions, production cycles, model changeovers, holidays, and sales.

The unadjusted data are of primary interest to consumers concerned about the prices they actually pay. Unadjusted data also are used extensively for escalation purposes. Many collective bargaining contract agreements and pension plans, for example, tie compensation changes to the Consumer Price Index unadjusted for seasonal variation.

Seasonal factors used in computing the seasonally adjusted indexes are derived by the X-11-ARIMA Seasonal Adjustment Method. The updated seasonal data at the end of 1977 replaced data from 1967 through 1977. Subsequent annual updates have replaced 5 years of seasonal data, e.g., data from 1979 through 1983 were replaced at the end of 1983. The seasonal movement of all items and 44 other aggregations is derived by combining the seasonal movement of 51 selected components. Each year the seasonal status of every series is reevaluated based upon certain statistical criteria. If any of the 51 components change their seasonal adjustment status from seasonally adjusted to not seasonally adjusted, not seasonally adjusted data will be used for the last five years, but the seasonally adjusted indexes will be used before that period. If any of the 51 components change their status from not seasonally adjusted to seasonally adjusted, seasonally adjusted data will be used for the last five years, but not seasonally adjusted indexes will be used before that period.
